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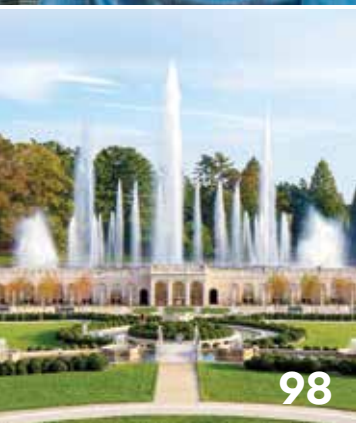

San Francisco - Arrival

wonders of the world. Stop at the rim to fully experience this mile-deep colorful canyon's plunging gorges, and rising spires formed by the mighty Colorado River.

Grand Canyon - Monument Valley - Page/Lake Powell

Discover world-class attractions like Butchart Gardens, a one-of-a-kind whale watching experience and fresh farm-to-table dining.

Seattle - Portland

Day 3: Depart this morning for Portland, Oregon's largest city and one of the world's best walking cities. On route, visit Mount Rainier National Park and Mount St. Helens, both active volcanoes and part of the Northwest "ring of fire". Ascending to 14,410 feet above sea level,

Mount Rainier is the most glaciated peak in the contiguous U.S. and just south of Mount Rainier is Mount St Helens, the youngest and most active volcano in the contiguous U.S. Portland's downtown is ideal for strolling, flanked by leafy parks along the Willamette River and evergreen-shrouded forests laced with hiking trails in the foothills to the west.

Portland

Day 4: Experience what Portlanders love about this artsy city - may we suggest taking a culinary walking tour through eclectic neighborhoods, sampling beer at one of the city's breweries, taking a wood working class, learning the tradition of glass blowing, visiting a Farmers Market, visiting a locally owned bookstore or pairing your board game night with a crafty cocktail at a Portland Board Game Bar.

Portland - Coos Bay

Day 5: Just 90 minutes from Portland is Cannon Beach where you can enjoy stunning coastline views and remarkable natural areas that blend with a charming city by the sea which is also known as one of the Top Art towns. Take a selfie in front of the famous Haystack Rock which is Oregon's most recognizable landmark. Arrive in Coos Bay and reconnect with nature on Oregon's South Coast. Engage in enlightening explorations and gain an

intimate understanding of this scenic and diverse region. There are plenty of hidden gems and off the beaten path wonders to discover.

Coos Bay - Eureka

Day 6: Leave Coos Bay in the morning and start your journey via Gold Beach, Brookings and through iconic Redwood National Park (the world's tallest trees). When you arrive in Eureka which is known to be 'real, authentic and different', you will enjoy its historic waterfront, visit the diverse local shops and restaurants, take in abundant local art and architecture and relax on ruggedly beautiful beaches.

Eureka - Santa Rosa

Denver - Arrival

Denver - Cheyenne

Known appropriately as the "Highway to the Sky", and offering incomparable views in every direction, Trail Ridge Road winds past countless peaks, through tundra high above the treeline and crosses the Continental Divide at 12,183 feet. Continue to Cheyenne, Wyoming's capital city that embodies the spirit of the Old West. Considered the nation's railroad capital, Cheyenne is home to a collection of steam engines, including Old Number 4004, the world's largest steam locomotive and one of the eight

Cheyenne - Rapid City

Cape Cod - Plymouth - Boston

THE AMERICAN SOUTH

Atlanta - Arrival

Day 1: Welcome to Atlanta, Georgia. During the Civil War, Atlanta was one of the most important Southern Cities as it provided war materials to the South. In 1864, General Sherman marched into Atlanta and burned the entire city. The city recovered from its losses and today is one of the most dynamic in the South, boasting a successful cultural and business hub. Transfer independently to your hotel where you will meet your ATI Tour Director.

Atlanta

Day 2: This morning, enjoy a comprehensive city tour of Atlanta, including a visit to the boyhood home of Martin Luther King. You will also learn about another of Atlanta's most famous residents, Margaret Mitchell, who wrote the historical novel that became a masterpiece of American cinema, "Gone with the Wind." Visit the Road to Tara Museum and Stately Oaks Plantation, which was the inspiration for plantation in the film. Atlanta - Augusta - Charleston

Charleston - Savannah

Savannah

Founder James Oglethorpe laid out the famed city squares. The Civil War destroyed a large portion of Georgia, but Savannah was spared. Numerous buildings around the tree-shaded squares are hundreds of years old; providing the setting for the popular novel "Midnight in the Garden of Good and Evil."

Savannah - Montgomery

Day 6: Set course west across the state of Georgia and into the heart of the Deep South, Alabama. Upon arrival in Montgomery, Alabama's capital city and a central backdrop of the American Civil Rights Movement, visit the Rosa



Parks Library and Museum. Learn about the Montgomery Bus Boycott inspired by Parks, which ignited the Civil Rights movement and changed American history. You may also wish to visit the Dexter Avenue King Memorial Baptist Church, where Martin Luther King Jr. led the Boycott with his powerful sermons.

Montgomery - Selma - New Orleans

Day 7: Depart Montgomery this morning to discover Selma, Alabama, another centerpiece of the Civil Rights Movement. Visit the Edmund Pettis Bridge where the historic March from Selma to Montgomery began and where the brutal events of Bloody Sunday took place. Experience another historic site of the Civil Rights Trail, the Brown Chapel AME Church before heading south through Mississippi to New Orleans, a city immersed in Creole culture. The city today is a unique blend of Spanish, French, Caribbean, African and Anglo-Saxon influences. This is obvious in the food, architecture and of course, the music. Experience this melting pot aboard a Riverboat Dinner Cruise (optional) and enjoy the rhythms of a Dixieland jazz band.

New Orleans

Day 8: The day is yours to explore the charm and excitement of one of America's most unique cities and for you to take in the French flavor & grandeur of New Orleans. May we suggest starting the day with a visit to a working plantation (optional). Explore the French Quarter with its trademark wrought iron balconies overlooking the narrow cobblestone streets.

New Orleans - Baton Rouge - Natchez

Day 9: This morning, we will travel to the capitol of Louisiana, Baton Rouge, and conduct a brief city tour. From there, we will travel via the historic

Natchez Trace Parkway to Natchez. The parkway is a 444-mile drive through exceptional scenery and years of Native American and European history. Natchez is the oldest European settlement on the Mississippi River. Before the Civil War, wealthy plantation owners from Louisiana built magnificent Antebellum homes here because the area was considered safer from flooding. This afternoon, we will visit one of the homes and learn about the wealth of these 19th century millionaires.

Natchez - Mississippi River Valley - Memphis

Day 10: Leave Natchez and drive on to Memphis, home of 'Sun Records'. As a large river port, it was one of the most important links in the cotton trade before the Civil War. Memphis is also known as the "home of the blues." A brief city tour will take you to the city's liveliest street, Beale Street, where the blues and other types of music are played nightly in almost a dozen clubs. Travel along historic Front Street, known as Cotton Row in the days when cotton traders and merchants conducted business here. Of course, no visit to Memphis would be complete without a visit to Graceland, the home of Elvis Presley (optional).

Memphis - Nashville

Day 11: Continue on to Nashville, known as the capital of country music. The city earned its title with the very first airing of the WSM Barn Dance radio program, the forerunner of the Grand Ole Opry. The newly renovated Ryman Auditorium in downtown Nashville, once home of the Grand Ole Opry, the studios near Music Row, and Opryland itself attest to Nashville's reputation as the most important city in country music.

Nashville

Day 12: Begin your day in this dynamic and thriving cultural and state capital of

Tennessee with a morning city tour. While exploring the city's landmarks, perhaps you'll discover a new country music classic before they even hit the charts while visiting one of the many recording studios around town. Perhaps enjoy dinner and a show in the evening as a optional excursion.

Nashville - Chattanooga - Atlanta

Day 13: Leaving Music City, we head to Chattanooga, home to the famous Choo Choo and which has received national recognition for the renaissance of its beautiful downtown and redevelopment of its riverfront. In the afternoon, our trails lead us back to Atlanta where you may want to check out one of the sites you were not able to experience at the start of the tour like the Georgia Aquarium, World of Coca Cola, CNN Center.

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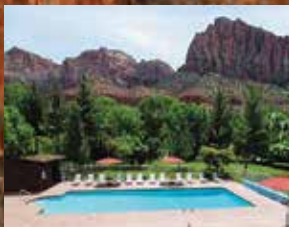


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GEMS OF NORTHERN CALIFORNIA

San Francisco - Arrival

Day 1: Consider discovering the city of San Francisco without a car and pick up your rental car on day 4. Upon arrival, proceed to your hotel located in the heart of the city where you will be able to explore most of San Francisco on foot. A short walk from downtown icons like The Ferry Building and the cable cars, not to mention the luxury retail and fine dining all throughout the neighborhood of Union Square.

San Francisco

Day 2: Explore the beautiful, bike-friendly streets and waterfront paths of San Francisco all the way to the Golden Gate Bridge with an all-day bike rental and ferry ticket. It's a popular activity to ride your bike across the Golden Gate Bridge down to Sausalito and take the ferry back to San Francisco. The charming town of Sausalito is just four miles (6.4 km) from San Francisco, offering gorgeous views of

San Francisco Bay. The waterfront town, nestled in the steep Marin Headlands, is home to fabulous restaurants. Back in the city visit one of San Francisco's largest outdoor spaces, Golden Gate Park, which is home to multiple museums, a towering Ferris wheel, and the San Francisco Botanical Garden. Covering 55 acres of land, the Botanical Garden contains more than 8,000 different kinds of plants from around the world. Golden Gate Park is a perfect spot for a picnic.

San Francisco

Day 3: After all the biking enjoy a day shopping or hop aboard on one of the famous historic cable cars at Union Square and ride to the top of Nob Hill. From there, it's a short walk to neighboring Russian Hill, and enjoy incredible views of the Financial District from Coolbrith Park. Also close by is Lombard Street known as the "Crookedest Street in the World,"

one of San Francisco's most popular landmarks. Take a spectacular photo at the bottom looking up or enjoy the breathtaking view from the top looking out onto the San Francisco Bay, the Bay Bridge and Coit Tower. From there, enjoy the downhill walk to Fisherman's Wharf, where fresh seafood, the cutest locals (the sea lions), and popular attractions like PIER 39, the Aquarium of the Bay, and ferries to Alcatraz, the world-famous prison and national park, await. You can also head west along the waterfront and arrive at Ghirardelli Square, where the famous chocolate is still being served. Walking further west will take you past Fort Mason and into San Francisco's scenic Marina neighborhood. From locations like Marina Green and Crissy Field, you can see clear across the bay to Sausalito and get breathtaking views of the Golden Gate Bridge.

San Francisco - Monterey

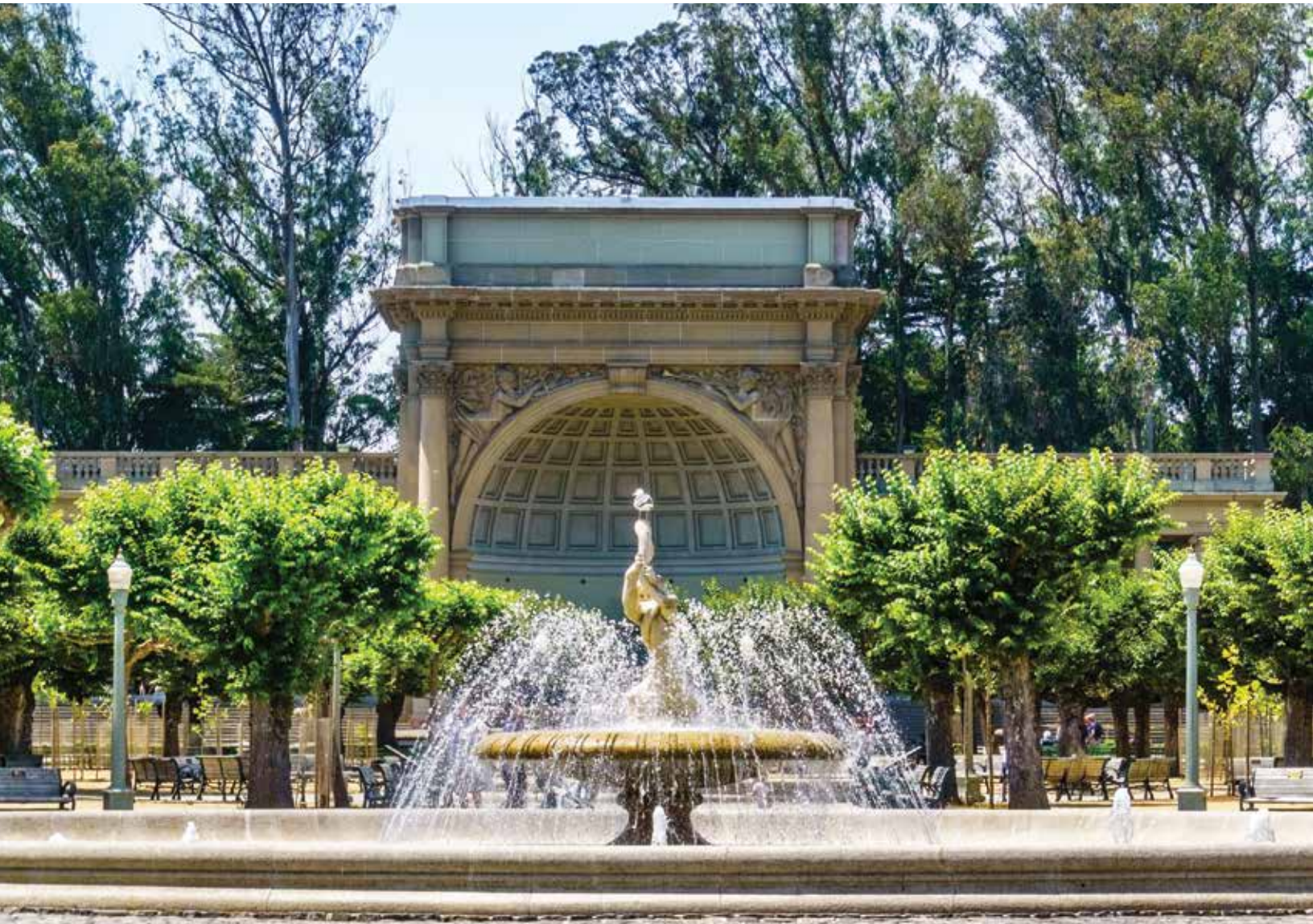
Day 4: Today, pick up your rental car and head South on a breathtaking coastal journey from San Francisco to Monterey. Heading south on Highway 1, you'll encounter the charming coastal town of Pacifica. Continuing along the coast, you'll soon reach Half Moon Bay, known for its picturesque beaches, art galleries, and seafood restaurants. As you continue southward, you'll enter the region of Santa Cruz, home to the famous Santa Cruz Beach Boardwalk. The drive then takes you through picturesque landscapes as you pass through the Santa Cruz Mountains and the lush redwood forests of Big Basin Redwoods State Park. The final stretch of your journey leads to Monterey. Once you've checked into your hotel, stretch your legs with a stroll down the Monterey Bay Coastal Recreation Trail to Cannery Row. As you walk along the coast, you'll

see colossal sand dunes standing across the bay along the coastline of Marina, Seaside and Sand City. You'll also catch glimpses of marine life such as seals and sea otters. As you come toward the Coast Guard Pier, the Rec Trail will pull away from the coast, taking you through the heart of Cannery Row. Once upon a time, this neighborhood was filled with sardine canneries. Now it features restaurants, hotels, specialty shops, galleries and wine tasting rooms. You've got enough time for some browsing before dinner at the Cannery Row landmark.

Monterey

Day 5: Exploring the area of Carmel-by-the-Sea is one of the top shopping destinations in the United States, but one with deep bohemian roots. Spend your morning exploring chic boutiques along Ocean Avenue, anchored by the shopping

center Carmel Plaza. Visit the close by Point Lobos State Natural Reserve. This is a must-visit for nature lovers, with its rugged coastline, hiking trails, and the opportunity to spot sea lions and other wildlife. It has been called "the greatest meeting of land and sea in the world." Hikers regularly spend entire days here. Catch a glimpse of what has captivated so many photographers, artists, and writers by taking the short, easy Sea Lion Point trail down around Sea Lion Cove. If you have time and the inclination, continue your tour with a walk on the Cypress Grove trail. This afternoon embark on a whale watching tour from Monterey Fisherman's Wharf. During the summer/fall season (Mid-March through early December) the tour focuses on feeding whales that come to the bay to feast on small fish and krill. During the winter season (December-Mid March) the tour's focus is on migrating whales.





One of the largest movements of mammals on earth happens just off the coast of Pacific Grove, CA – the south end of Monterey Bay.

Monterey

Day 6: This morning discover the famous Aquarium which has enough extraordinary exhibits to fill an entire day. For a quick tour, start with the million-gallon Open Sea Exhibit and other special exhibitions. Then cross over the bridge to the Ocean's Edge Galleries and swing by the Kelp Forest exhibit and (if little ones are in tow) the Splash Zone. Head downstairs for the Monterey Bay Habitats exhibit and interactive Touch Pool. Another idea for your day is a drive to Big Sur, consider taking a detour along the famous 17-Mile Drive, which offers stunning coastal views, iconic landmarks like the Lone Cypress, and picturesque golf courses. As you leave 17-Mile Drive, you'll pass through the charming town of Pacific Grove, known for its Victorian architecture and scenic coastline. A quick detour to Point Pinos Lighthouse is worthwhile. It's the oldest continually operating lighthouse on the West Coast and offers lovely views of the coast. As you proceed, you'll enter Garrapata State Park. It's known for its

dramatic cliffs and beautiful coastal scenery. One of the most iconic stops on the route is Bixby Creek Bridge, which spans a deep canyon and offers breathtaking vistas of the coastline. Further south, McWay Falls is another highlight. It's a stunning waterfall that drops onto a pristine beach, and you can view it from an overlook just off the highway. At Ragged Point, you'll find a dramatic viewpoint with steep cliffs and panoramic ocean views. Finally, you'll reach Big Sur proper. Pfeiffer Big Sur State Park is a great place to explore the redwoods, go for a hike, or have a picnic.

Monterey - Sonoma

Day 7: Today leave beautiful Monterey northbound and you'll enter the Salinas Valley, passing by farms and vineyards. As you approach the area around Soledad and Greenfield, you'll enter Monterey County's wine country. Consider stopping at wineries in the region to taste some local wines. Santa Lucia Highlands is known for its Pinot Noir and Chardonnay vineyards. It's an excellent place for wine enthusiasts to explore. Continue north through Salinas and Gilroy, famous for its garlic production. As you approach the Santa Clara Valley, you'll notice a shift from agricultural areas

to suburban communities. Visit Petaluma on your way, it has recently become the epitome of country chic, with a boutique-laden downtown district and a cluster of hip restaurants, but this town is still in touch with the agricultural roots. The seamless marriage of farms and frills means that today, Petaluma's the perfect place for a unique food adventure. Finally, you'll arrive in Sonoma, a town known for its historic plaza, wineries, and vibrant food scene. Explore the Sonoma Plaza, visit local wineries, and enjoy the relaxed atmosphere of this wine country destination.

Sonoma

Day 8: Drive the scenic Highway 12 between Sonoma and Santa Rosa to experience the gorgeous vineyards throughout Sonoma Valley. All that's delightful about the Sonoma Valley — fine wine, farm-to-table cuisine, beautiful vineyards and hills, California history, and intriguing shops — comes together in its central section, home to the town of Sonoma. Here you can taste some of the best Chardonnays (and, of course, Merlots, Pinot Noirs, & Zinfandels) from California. After a wine tasting or two, find yourself at the center of the town of Sonoma, at the park-like Sonoma Plaza — covering eight acres and is one of

California's largest town squares. (It was here in June 1846 that American settlers rebelled against Mexican rule and raised the bear flag, declaring an independent republic.) Festivals, farmers markets, fun runs, and other community activities are frequently held in Sonoma Plaza. Take your time strolling around town, visiting the cafés, boutiques, cheese shops, and tasting rooms. Grab dinner at one of the many farm-to-table restaurants in Sonoma before heading back to your hotel.

Sonoma

Day 9: While known for its premium wines, Sonoma County also boasts a thriving artisan beverage community, with more than two dozen craft breweries, close to a dozen cider works, and more than a dozen distilleries. Visit a brewery, cider works, or distillery to learn about the traditions and techniques of these emerging boutique

industries. The California Coast is one of the most iconic and scenic coasts in the country. The coastal stretch north of San Francisco in Sonoma County is home to the picturesque sea villages Bodega, Bodega Bay, Jenner, Timber Cove, The Sea Ranch, and Gualala. So, grab breakfast at one of the quaint, waterfront cafés before heading out for your coastal adventure. The ocean overlook at Bodega Head is prime for watching gray and blue whales traveling south from the Chukchi Sea near Alaska and down to Baja California for winter, then back north for the summer feeding season.

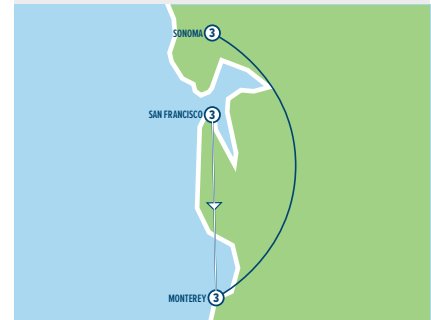

Los Angeles - Arrival

Catch a colorful sunset over the Pacific before dining at a sustainable farm fresh waterfront restaurant.

Los Angeles

Day 2: Today immerse yourself in Hollywood glamour! Begin with a visit to Warner Bros. Studios Tour for a behind-the-scenes look at your favorite movies/TV shows or Universal Studios Hollywood for its well-known studio tours and experience the new Super Nintendo World. San Diego - Palm Springs

Park for a desert hike. Take a tour through Galleta Meadows, home to over 130 steel welded sculptures prowling the desert landscape. Arriving in Greater Palm Springs, plan a stop in the City of Palm Desert to visit El Paseo, the desert's "Rodeo Drive. This area overflows with unique boutiques selling everything from high-end fashion to savory cooking spices.

Palm Springs

Day 8: Rise early for a sunrise hike at Indian Canyons for wildlife spotting and immersing yourself in the desert's tranquility. Afterward, enjoy a healthy breakfast at a local café. Prescott - Sedona

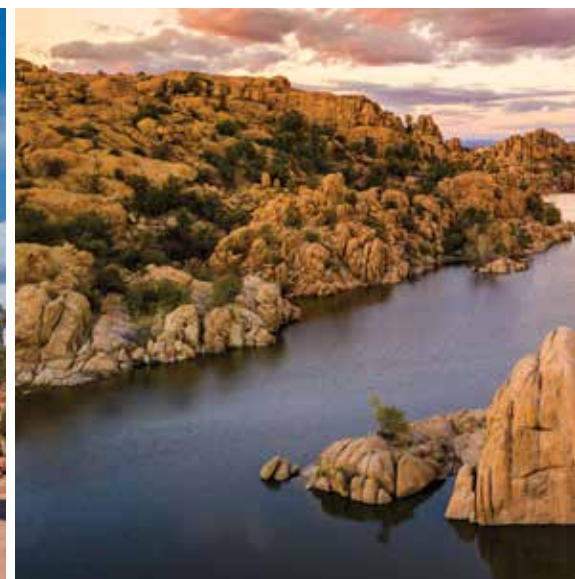

are golfing, hiking, hot air ballooning, day spas, and private day trips.

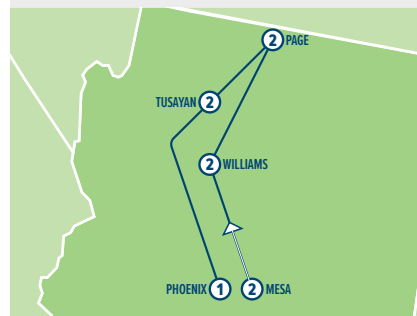

Conclude the day with a visit to one of the highest points in Austin at Mount Bonnell with amazing views of the Colorado River and 360 Pennybacker Bridge.

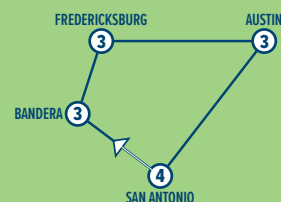

MISSOURI: ICONIC SITES & LOCAL BITES

Kansas City - Arrival

Day 1: Have a late lunch at Arthur Bryant's Barbeque, the legendary "King of Ribs." The most renowned pit master in history, Bryant created a sauce that has attracted former Presidents Harry Truman and Jimmy Carter to his restaurant. Visit the sights and sounds of a uniquely American art form at the American Jazz Museum. The museum's exhibits feature talented performers who helped the genre thrive. Located in the same complex, the Negro Leagues Baseball Museum (NLBM) can't be missed. It is the world's only museum dedicated to preserving and celebrating the rich history of African American baseball and its impact on the social advancement of America. The 10,000-square-foot multimedia exhibit chronicles the history and heroes of the leagues from their founding in 1920 to their demise in the 1960s. The NLBM was recently added to the U.S. Civil Rights Trail. Some believe the integration of baseball was a catalyst for the Civil Rights Movement, proving that an individual's worth should not be determined by the color of their skin. Have dinner at Fiorella's Jack Stack Barbecue. A Kansas City tradition since 1957, Jack Stack has one of the most extensive BBQ menus in the country. After dinner, enjoy live jazz music at The Blue Room. Named after the famous 1930s Street Hotel club in the historic 18th & Vine Jazz District, the

venue provides a distinctive platform to present dynamic performances from the best local and national jazz talent in an intimate setting. In addition to The Blue Room experience, sit in on a "jam session" at The Mutual Musicians Foundation—located in the heart of Kansas City's historic jazz district. Originally home to the Black Musicians' Protective Union Local 627 A.F. of M., the Foundation continues its grand tradition as a living tribute to the city's long and illustrious musical history. Jazz greats and popular local players alike continue to show up every weekend to play the night away just as they have since the 1930s.

Kansas City

Day 2: Enjoy breakfast at one of the local coffee shops or restaurants. A few suggestions are the Blue Bird Bistro, Succotash, Messenger. Next, make your way to Union Station Kansas City to enjoy the ever-changing exhibits, Science City, planetarium, shops, and grab a bite for lunch at either Harvey's Restaurant or Pierpont's. After lunch, learn a little bit about Kansas City's gangster history and how the city got its nickname: "Paris of the Plains." Gangster Tour highlights infamous crimes like the Union Station Massacre, shows the locations of speakeasies and gambling halls and explains how liquor flowed freely during Prohibition. The homes and workplaces of crime bosses and the sites of major turf wars are also

featured on the tour. Sounds like an "offer you can't refuse." After the gangster tour, head to J. Rieger & Co. to learn about the distillery's history, sample Kansas City Whiskey and hop on the only known distillery slide in the world! For dinner, you can choose from many award-winning restaurants in the city's eclectic food scene. Some of the favorites are Corvino Supper Club and Tasting Room, The Town Company, or The Savoy at 21c. Close out the evening with more jazz. Visit Green Lady Lounge, an exclusive jazz lounge featuring Kansas City musicians. Other attractions you might like to explore include The National Museum of Toys and Miniatures, National World War I Museum and Memorial or The Nelson-Atkins Museum of Art.

Kansas City - Branson

Day 3: Depart early from Kansas City, arriving in Branson in the afternoon to check in at the Hilton hotel. The beautiful Hilton Promenade at Branson Landing is a 4-star hotel located on the shores of Lake Taneycomo with shops, restaurants and entertainment venues nearby. Enjoy a cocktail before dinner at Andy B's Tiki Bar overlooking the lake and then select from sixteen different restaurants. After dinner, enjoy fun activities along the famous Highway 76 in Branson. Visit the Titanic Museum, Aquarium at the Boardwalk, Branson Auto & Farm Museum or Tommy Hawks Axe Throwing. Known as the "Live



Entertainment Capital of the World” and boasting over 100 shows, you can watch a live musical production, be amazed by magicians or marvel at acrobats.

Branson

Day 4: After breakfast, depart for Dogwood Canyon Nature Park, which is located only about half an hour from Branson. Dogwood Canyon features 10,000 acres of natural beauty and rugged scenery with so much to see and do. Choose from many outdoor activities such as hiking, biking, wildlife tram tours, horseback riding and trout fishing among towering bluffs, waterfall creek beds, handcrafted bridges and native wildlife. Enjoy lunch at the Mill & Canyon Grill Restaurant surrounded by floor-to-ceiling glass windows that overlook Little Indian Creek and the 120-foot-tall waterfall. Try one of the many house specialties, such as a bison burger and smoked trout cake BLT. After lunch, choose from a variety of activities. Visit Smith Creek Distillery for a moonshine tasting. Soar over Lake Taneycomo on Parakeet Pete’s Waterfront Zipline. Marvel at artifacts recovered from under the sea at the Shipwrecked Treasure Museum. Take an adrenaline ride-and get a little wet-aboard Branson Jet Boats. The light and water show on Branson Landing is highly recommended.

Experience a celebrity chef’s award-winning American cuisine right in the heart of Branson’s waterfront at Guy Fieri’s Branson Kitchen + Bar. After dinner, be entertained by Anthems of Rock at the King’s Castle Theatre on Highway 76. “The Biggest Rock Party in Branson” showcases the number one hits from the most famous bands of the 20th century,

including Queen, the Beatles, the Rolling Stones, Bon Jovi, Led Zeppelin, Journey, Aerosmith and more. This high-energy production will have you dancing and singing along with the greatest rock hits of all time.

Branson - St. Louis

Day 5: Depart early for St. Louis. Arrive for a late lunch and choose between Sugarfire Smoke House—a Southern-style, local BBQ chain serving ribs, salmon, brisket cheesesteaks, spiked shakes & more—or Broadway Oyster Bar—a lively restaurant featuring Cajun and Creole dishes. In the afternoon, discover magnificent views from the top of St. Louis’ Gateway Arch—an iconic monument symbolizing the westward expansion of the United States and the people who made it possible. See the city from 630 feet up in the air in this architectural wonder. If time permits, enjoy a river cruise aboard Gateway Arch Riverboats. Take a One-Hour Sightseeing Cruise or one of the many specialty cruises and relax to the sound of paddle wheels churning the waters of the mighty Mississippi River while taking in the best view of the city skyline. For dinner, head over to BB’s Jazz, Blues and Soups before picking up a sweet treat at Ted Drewes Frozen Custard. Since 1929, Route 66 travelers have been delighted by this popular custard stand located on Chippewa Street. Get a “concrete” and turn it upside down. This thick milkshake, made from vanilla frozen custard and blended with traditional and inventive treats, will not spill out of the cup.

St. Louis

Day 6: After breakfast, visit the Cathedral Basilica of St. Louis, which houses one of the largest mosaic collections in the

Western Hemisphere. The Cathedral is in the heart of the city, just east of Forest Park, and is one of the must-see attractions in St. Louis. Self-guided tours do not require reservations. Guided tours are available Monday-Saturday by appointment only. Don’t miss the Missouri History Museum located in Forest Park. Founded in 1866, the museum features both permanent and traveling exhibits about Missouri’s history. At the Saint Louis Science Center, you can explore over 700 exhibits, the OMNIMAX® Theater, James S. McDonnell Planetarium, special traveling exhibitions and more. Visit the Missouri Botanical Garden, the nation’s oldest botanical garden in continuous operation. Spanning 79-acres, the National Historic Landmark grows more than 27,000 plants. Enjoy a beer at Anheuser-Busch Brewery where you can also take a brewery tour and see the famous Budweiser Clydesdales. The National Blues Museum explores the blues and celebrates the genre as the foundation of all modern American music. Learn about famous musicians, iconic moments in popular culture and create your own masterpiece through interactive exhibits. Head over to Ballpark Village—the newest dining and entertainment district in St. Louis. The complex offers great food, drinks and an ideal ambiance for watching sports. After dinner, make your way to St. Louis Union Station for the Grand Hall Light Show and a ride on the St. Louis Wheel with 42 fully enclosed, climate-controlled gondolas that seat up to eight riders each.

Day 7: Return your car at the airport before your departure flight.

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New Orleans - Arrival

Day 1: On arrival, pick up your car, drive to your hotel and get ready to explore one of the most exciting cities in the world. New Orleans

Day 2: First, enjoy a traditional New Orleans style breakfast with beignets and café au lait. Afterwards, take a walking tour or a bus tour through the famous streets of the Garden District. piece of king cake! A must-see for history lovers and all patriots, The National WWII Museum is the next stop on the list. Powerful images and extraordinary artifacts bring to life the American Spirit, the courage, teamwork, and sacrifice of the young men and women who won the war and changed the world. Wind down your time in the Crescent City with an authentic Cajun dinner and finish the evening in true New Orleans style with a cocktail and some live jazz music at The Davenport Lounge or The Jazz Playhouse, and always remember to let the good times roll!

New Orleans - LaPlace

Day 3: Head west to Louisiana's River Parishes, an area from the outskirts of New Orleans to the outskirts of the Baton Rouge area. Influences from Germans, Acadians, French, Spanish, Native Americans and enslaved Africans blend together to create a regional culture—unique even to Louisiana. Explore 10 historic plantations and eat your fill of



andouille sausage. Explore the outdoors with a swamp tour, or zip line over the Maurepas Swamp. End your day with dinner at one of the area's local authentic restaurants.

LaPlace - Baton Rouge

Day 4: Head to Baton Rouge to explore the history and charm of Louisiana's Capital city. Stop at the Rural Life Museum for a glimpse into Louisiana culture of the 18th and 19th centuries. Stop downtown for lunch before touring the Old and New State Capitols. Head over to Mid-city for some shopping and dinner at one of Mid-City's restaurants. Before heading back to your hotel, tour Oxbow Rum Distillery and enjoy live music at Teddy's Juke Joint.

Baton Rouge - Lafayette

Day 5: Continue west and then head south to Avery Island, home to Tabasco headquarters. Tour the Tabasco museum and plant before heading to Lafayette, the heart of Cajun Country. Stop at Vermilionville and tour a living history museum and learn about the Acadian, Creole, and Native American cultures from 1765-1890. Head to Downtown Lafayette for lunch. After lunch, head to Parc Sans Souci for a photo op with downtown's famous LAFAYETTE sign. Visit one of Downtown Lafayette's many unique

shops offering a variety of clothing and furniture. Visit the Cathedral of St. John the Evangelist to see a 450-year-old oak tree, then have a sweet treat at the last Borden's Ice Cream Parlor in the world. Finish up with music at one of Downtown Lafayette's venues.

Lafayette - Lake Charles

Day 6: Head west to Lake Charles and drive down the Creole Nature Trail All-American Road. Alligators, over 400 bird species, marshlands teeming with life, 26 miles of natural Gulf of Mexico beaches, fishing, crabbing, Cajun culture and more can be experienced as you travel the Creole Nature Trail All-American Road. One of only 57 so designated scenic byways in the USA, and affectionately known as Louisiana's Outback, the Creole Nature Trail is a journey into one of America's "Last Great Wildernesses." Learn about alligators at Gator Chateau - A Rescue, Educate, Release program which fosters orphaned baby alligators until they are able to be released back into their natural habitat. Docents will educate you in all things alligator. If time permits, enjoy hands-on outdoor adventure at Sam Houston Jones State Park with kayaking or paddleboarding provided by Lake Area Adventure. Sam Houston Jones State Park has over 1,000 acres of lakes, trees, and rivers. The area

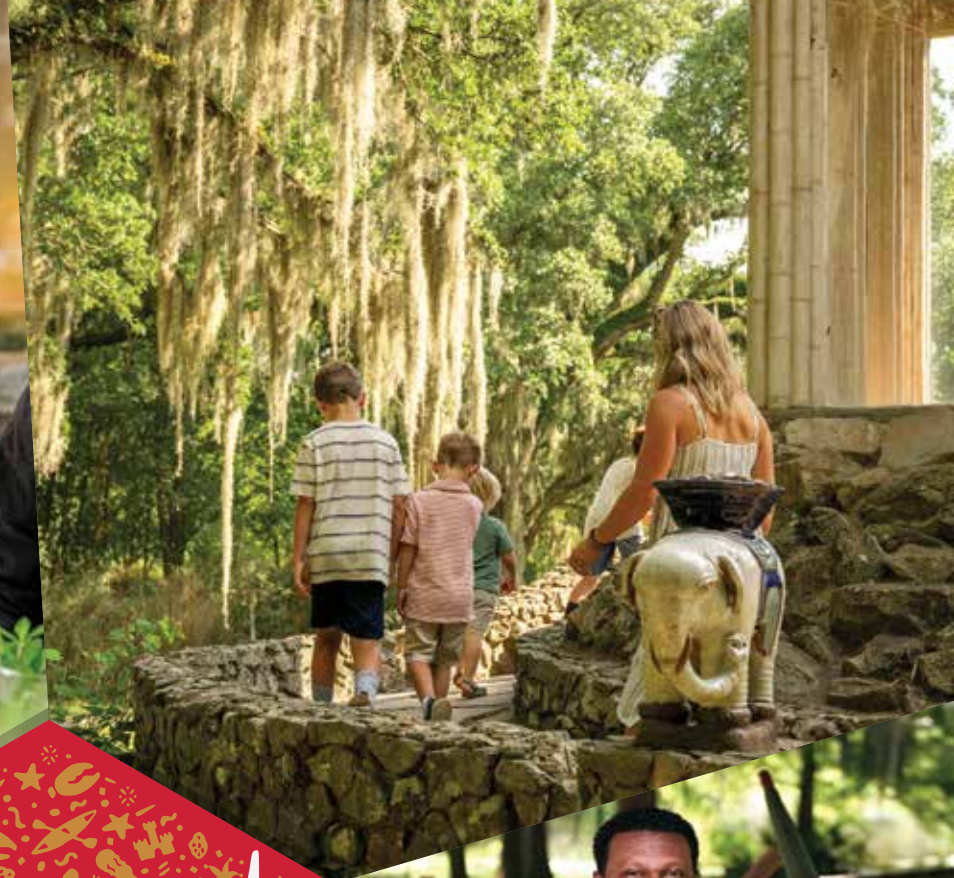
hosts an abundance of wildlife including squirrels, rabbits, alligators, otters, nutria rats, raccoons, foxes, and diverse birdlife. The numerous waterways in this area make water sports a natural highlight at the park.

Lake Charles

Day 7: Pay a visit to 1911 Historic City Hall Arts & Cultural Center. After extensive restoration, the 1911 Historic City Hall opened its doors as the City of Lake Charles' public art gallery and cultural facility in 2004. Since that time, Historic City Hall Arts & Cultural Center has highlighted numerous traveling exhibitions from around the world, as well as regional and local artists. Explore The Imperial Calcasieu Museum, leading historical, cultural, and fine arts museum serving the Southwest Louisiana region. Try your luck at one of Lake Charles' side-by-side casino resort properties, L'Auberge Casino Resort Lake Charles and Golden Nugget Lake Charles. In addition to gaming, these properties offer golf greens, top-name entertainment and poolside getaways.

Lake Charles - Houston - Departure

Day 8: This morning drive to Houston and return your car in time for your departure flight.



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MISSISSIPPI, FROM THE RIVER TO THE COAST

Memphis - Arrival - Tupelo

Day 1: Welcome to Mississippi! Begin just 20 miles south of Memphis at Tanger Outlets Southaven, located just off Interstate 55. After shopping, travel through picturesque Holly Springs, known for its historic homes, churches, and museums. Located in the foothills of Northeast Mississippi, Tupelo is a must-see along the Natchez Trace Parkway. Live like a King in the city where the world's greatest entertainer was born in a two-room shotgun shack. Visit the hardware store where in 1946 Gladys Presley bought her son, Elvis, his first guitar, and discover lots of small-town charm along Tupelo's Elvis Driving Tour.

Tupelo - Oxford

Day 2: Head east to Oxford, which is renowned for its deep-rooted history, charm and culture. The historic Courthouse Square has been the cultural and economic hub of Oxford since the town's founding in 1837. It thrives with businesses such as Neilson's, the oldest continuously operating department store in the South, and nationally

famous independent bookstore Square Books. Oxford is a charming college town immortalized in the writings of Nobel Prize laureate William Faulkner. Visit Rowan Oak, Faulkner's tranquil country home, where the outline of his novel, *A Fable*, is scribbled on the study wall. Next stop is the University of Mississippi's campus, known as "Ole Miss." The University of Mississippi and Oxford played a significant part in the American Civil Rights movement during the integration of the university. Oxford's monument and historic marker on the Mississippi Freedom Trail paint a picture of the events that took place during a challenging and significant time in American history.

Oxford - Clarksdale

Day 3: Today's journey takes us to Clarksdale where muddy waters can refer to the Mississippi River that creates the state's western border, as well as the blues singer who lived and recorded at the nearby Stovall plantation. If you follow the Mississippi Blues Trail, you will see markers for influential artists such

as John Lee Hooker, Son House and Ike Turner. Clarksdale's Delta Blues Museum houses exhibits that focus on the musical legacy that bluesmen have left for the world to enjoy. The Crossroads are where Highway 49 intersects with Highway 61, the fabled spot where legendary bluesman Robert Johnson is said to have sold his soul to the devil in exchange for unexplainable guitar talent. Ground Zero Blues Club has been named one of the "top 100 bars and nightclubs in America" and is co-owned by actor Morgan Freeman. Red's Blues Club is the real deal authentic Juke Joint and a Blues must-see.

Clarksdale - Cleveland - Indianola - Jackson

Day 4: Travel south to Cleveland, the hip little town recognized as "one of the 100 best small towns in America." Cleveland is home to a charming downtown Main Street area complete with locally owned boutiques, cafés, restaurants, art galleries and museums. While there, visit Dockery Farms, often called the Birthplace of the Blues. Dockery Farms tells of a storied



past where many blues greats lived and worked. A must-see is the state-of-the-art GRAMMY® Museum Mississippi, the only one of its kind outside of Los Angeles. The GRAMMY® Museum covers all genres of music and tells of story of the GRAMMY and its winning artists through interactive exhibits. Continue to Indianola and visit the B.B. King Museum and Delta Interpretive Center where the life and music of the renowned musician is shared along with the rich cultural heritage of the Mississippi Delta. Your day ends in Jackson, Mississippi's "City with Soul" and state capital of Jackson tells a story that is uniquely southern and entirely American. Visit the home of celebrated author Eudora Welty and groove to the rhythms and beats of authentic blues at Hal and Mal's. Learn more about the Civil Rights Movement at the Medgar and Myrlie Home National Monument and the Mississippi Civil Rights Museum, part of the Two Mississippi Museums. Try a little retail therapy in the eclectic Fondren District with its assorted shops and eateries.

Jackson

Day 5: Spend an extra day in Jackson exploring other downtown Jackson attractions, including the old Capitol State Historical Museum, one of the country's premier examples of Greek revival public architecture, and the Mississippi Governor's

Mansion, the second oldest continuously occupied governor's residence in the U.S. A visit to the Mississippi Museum of Art is a must, as is the new Capitol. Try a little retail therapy in the eclectic Fondren District with its assorted shops and eateries. Travel 12 miles to Ridgeland, where just off the scenic Natchez Trace Parkway you can visit the Bill Waller Craft Center, home to the Craftsman's Guild of Mississippi.

Jackson - Vicksburg

Day 6: Head east and immerse yourself in American history, Mississippi music, and southern charm in Vicksburg, the Key to the South. President Abraham Lincoln stated that Vicksburg was the "key to winning the war" and that the Civil War would not end until the "key" was in his pocket. The Vicksburg National Military Park stands in commemoration of the campaign for Vicksburg and to those who served as well as to thousands who lost their lives. Today Vicksburg is alive with music, arts, and entertainment. Stroll the brick-paved streets of historic downtown to enjoy a meal or fun shopping.

Vicksburg - Natchez

Day 7: Small town allure and over three centuries of rich history collide on the banks of the Mississippi River in Natchez. Natchez has one of the largest collections of historic buildings in the country, many of which are open daily for tours. Visitors can explore this history along Natchez's

five downtown walking trails or hop on a bus tour for a unique look at the historic homes and landmarks. Discover the stories at the Natchez Museum of African American History & Culture and sites like Forks of the Road or the Rhythm Night Club. Sip a beverage on the porch of an old Mississippi River tavern as you watch the sun set on Old Man River.

Natchez - Biloxi (Coastal Mississippi)

Day 8: Today's journey takes you to Coastal Mississippi's 62 miles of scenic coastline with an incredible variety of attractions, excursions, and activities, from outdoor adventures to museums, festivals, world-class gaming, and championship golf courses. Explore the Mississippi Sound on a charter fishing boat or hop aboard the ferry to Ship Island. Visit the new state-of-the-art Mississippi Aquarium. Indulge at one of the many quaint or fine-dining restaurants serving the freshest Gulf seafood. Each coastal community across the region has something different to offer; from scenic harbor towns and walkable downtown areas shaded with live oaks, to world-renowned shows and casino headliner entertainment.

Biloxi - New Orleans - Departure

Day 9: This morning drive to New Orleans and return your car in time for your departure flight.



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NASHVILLE TO NEW ORLEANS

Nashville - Arrival

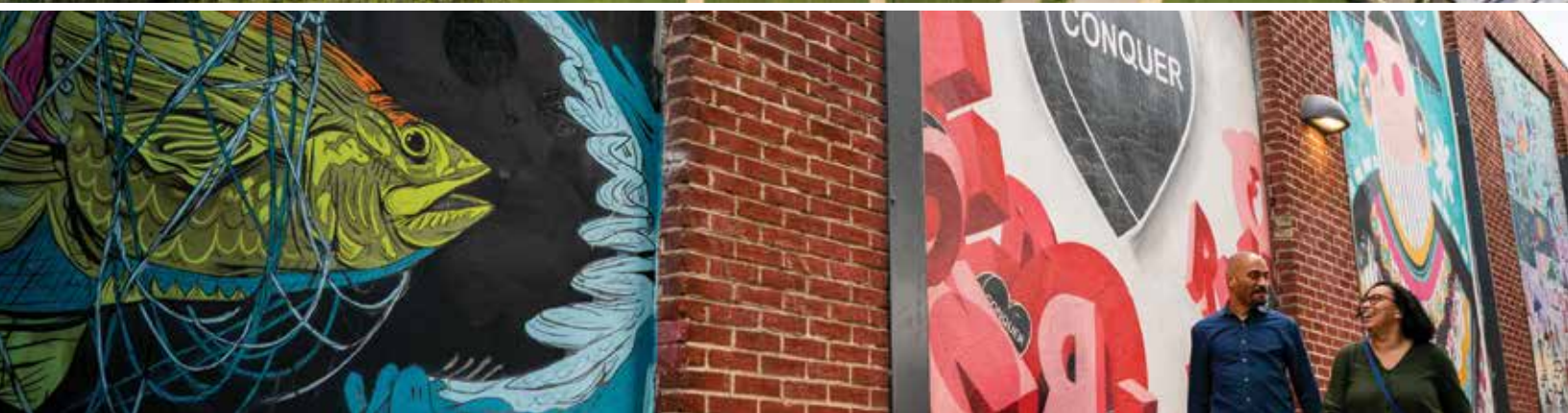

Old Town Lunenburg is home to Nova Scotia's famous racing schooner, Bluenose II. While in Lunenburg be sure to visit Ironworks Distillery and Fisheries Museum of the Atlantic or join Lunenburg Walking Tours for an insider's perspective of the town. Lunenburg is filled with fresh seafood that can be found at some of the best restaurants in the province: Salt Shaker Deli, The Old Fish Factory, The Grand Banker Bar & Grill,

The Half Shell, etc. If this is all you can fit into a day, Lunenburg is home to many inns and B&Bs.

Yarmouth

Day 3: Explore the rugged landscape and take in the breath taking views and sunsets at Cape Forchu Lighthouse. Take part in a Living Wharves demonstration to learn how to splice rope, hear fishing tales and ask questions to real fishermen. Make your way to Argyle Lodge for the night. While you're there be sure to enjoy a hands-on cooking class in the dining room or on the beach. The Argyle is a unique luxury oceanfront lodge in a fishing village on Lobster Bay.

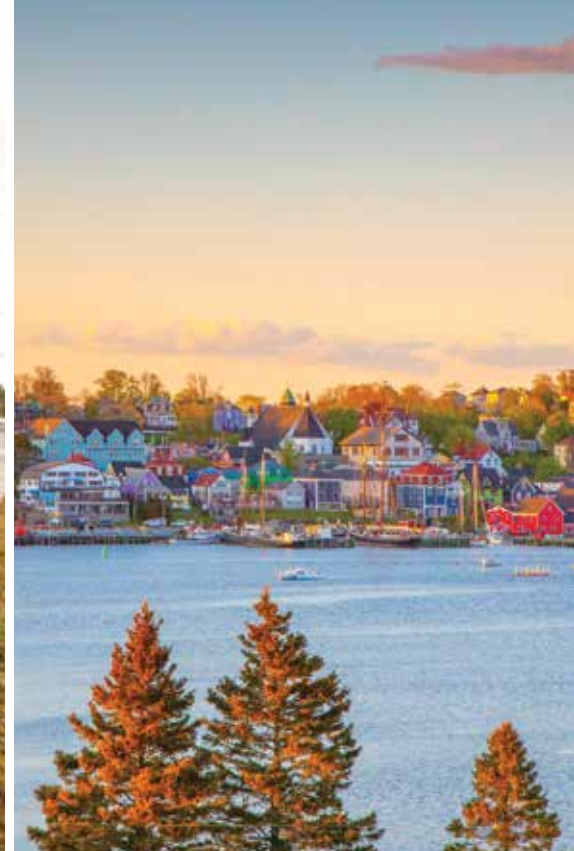
Yarmouth - Digby

Day 4: Make your way to Kejimikujik National Park and National Historic Site, offering visitors the opportunity to hike one of the 14 trails through woodlands and along waterways or to canoe one of the waterways used by the indigenous Mi'kmaq. Discover rock engravings known as petroglyphs, evidence of the presence of the Mi'kmaq people for thousands of years. After a day in the woods or on the water, visitors can set up camp at one of

the many campsites throughout the park. Whether you prefer to camp in a tent or trailer, travel to a wilderness site, or try our new equipped accommodations, there is a camping experience for you! When the sun sets, visit the Sky Circle and gaze at brilliant celestial bodies through an on-site telescope, binoculars, or with the naked eye. Alternatively, drive along the Digby Neck for whale watching on the Bay of Fundy! This is Nova Scotia's premier eco-tourism destination. Long Island and Brier Island cast out into the rich waters of the world famous Bay of Fundy. During the summer months these waters are home to up to 12 species of whales. Digby is port for a year-round ferry service that crosses the beautiful Bay of Fundy between Digby and Saint John, New Brunswick.

Wolfville

visitors alike flock to this tiny fishing village to select and have prepared a sample of the world renowned Bay of Fundy lobster. The experience is heightened by devouring this delicacy while seated in the waterfront dining room, the prime stage for observing the highest tides in the world. Begin your Annapolis Valley adventure in Grand Pré, home of Grand-Pré National Historic Site, one of three UNESCO World Heritage Sites in Nova Scotia - once the epicentre of Acadian culture and now the most significant memorial to their tragic upheaval. Take in the amazing smells of unique herbs and fruits at The Tangled Garden. The property features the owner's private home along with an extensive herb garden, a labyrinth, art gallery and shop. Explore Nova Scotia's Wine Country. Wolfville is perfectly nestled amongst the majority of Nova Scotia wineries here in the Annapolis Valley. The Wolfville Magic Winery bus is the perfect hop-on, hop-off option to travel between wineries! Wineries on route could include Lightfoot and Wolfville, Domain De Grand Pré, Luckett Vineyards, L'Acadie Vineyards and Gaspereau Vineyards. Stop for a bite at one of the cafes, bistros and pubs on Main St. while browsing boutique shops. Many of the restaurants in Wolfville are dedicated to creating

fresh seasonal dishes from local produce and seafood. Spend the night in one of the Victorian houses in the town which have been converted to historic inns and bed & breakfasts.

Wolfville - New Glasgow

Day 6: Come and walk, play and explore on the ocean floor at Burntcoat Head Park, home of the world's highest recorded tides. 160 billion tonnes of water flow daily into the Minas Basin every 13 hours which is more than the combined flow of the world's freshwater rivers! Experience the one-of-a-kind outdoor adventure, Tidal Bore Rafting! As the 160 billion tonnes of water rushes into the Bay of Fundy at high tide, there is only so much space for it to travel and therefore the great tides actually reverse the flow of rivers that would typically flow into the Bay. Nowhere else in the world can you find this kind of experience! Make your way towards Cape Breton Island, en route spend a night in the area of Pictou or New Glasgow.

New Glasgow - Ingonish

Day 7: Follow the Cabot Trail through the Cape Breton Highlands National Park. Check in at the Parks Canada Visitor Centre in Cheticamp. The park offers 26 hiking trails (from easy strolls to

strenuous climbs), camping, golf, cycling, wildlife, beaches, look-offs, and guided activities. Hike one of the park's most popular trails, Skyline Trail. The trail will lead you out to the top of a mountain headland to one of the most spectacular panoramic views in the province that overlooks the Cabot Trail and the ocean. Or enjoy a lobster boil on the beach. Get out and stretch your legs at the numerous look off points along the trail. Jump on board a whale watching tour departing from the Pleasant Bay Wharf. Summer and fall are the best times to go whale watching in Nova Scotia. Pleasant Bay is a convenient spot to grab a bite to eat before re-entering the park. If you've filled your day exploring the first leg of the Cabot Trail, Pleasant bay is scattered with welcoming accommodations to spend the night. Or continue along the Cabot Trail towards Ingonish. Chalets, inns, resorts, cottages and lodges are just a few of the many accommodations in Ingonish area.

Sydney

Day 8: Popular stops en route to Ingonish include: Black Brook Beach, Green Cove, and the Franey Trail only to name a few. Stop by one of the small cafes or bakeries to enjoy a freshly baked pastry and coffee as you take in the fresh salt air. Enjoy the



beautiful beaches and go for a dip in the Atlantic Ocean in the clean waters along the shores or head out kayaking to take part in some bird watching. Enjoy the spectacular views from the top of the world renowned Highland Links Golf Course as you hit a few rounds. Depart Ingonish for the charming town of Baddeck. Discover the Alexander Graham Bell National Historic Site, home to the world's largest collection of Bell's inventions and artifacts, including replicas of the first telephone and a full-scale model of the HD-4 hydrofoil watercraft. Explore the Bras d'Or lakes by water on a boat or kayaking tour. There are a wide range of accommodations in Baddeck, from quaint bed and breakfasts to full-sized inns and motels. Spend a night in Baddeck or make your way to Sydney.

Sydney - Liscomb Mills

Day 9: Rub shoulders with history at the Fortress of Louisbourg National Historic Site. Step through Louisbourg's fortress walls and time-warp back to the 1700s. Learn to fire a cannon as they did 300 years ago, don military regalia, or fire an exact replica of an 18th century musket. Enjoy a traditional 18th century lunch on site where costumed staff in period restaurants prepare and serve delicious food and beverages based on 18th

century tradition and recipes. Discover the taste and aroma of Fortress Rum and the story of this drink of 18th century Louisbourg. Your 18th century experience doesn't have to end when the gates close at 5:00. Camp under the stars, safe inside the fortress walls, or sleep in a period house just as they did 300 years ago. Make your way to Liscomb to spend the night. Hike along a portion of the 9 km of hiking trails or simply relax and enjoy the solitude of the area overlooking the river at Liscombe Lodge. Take a relaxing pontoon boat ride along the Liscomb River channel taking you into the open waters of the Atlantic Ocean with Marina Supervisor and Captain, Chester. Visit the resort restaurant for a true Maritime meal with a view of the Liscomb River and the rugged Eastern Shore landscape.

Liscomb - Halifax - Departure

Day 10: As you make your way back toward Halifax be sure to check out the beautiful beaches along the Eastern shore. Head to Lawrencetown and check-in at East Coast Surf School at Lawrencetown Beach Provincial Park to learn to ride the waves. If surfing isn't your thing check out Martinique, or one of the other beautiful beaches along the Eastern Shore.





WONDERS OF ATLANTIC CANADA - NEWFOUNDLAND & LABRADOR

St. John's - Arrival

Day 1: Welcome to Newfoundland and Labrador where wildlife and breathtaking scenery awaits you. Get settled into the Sandman Signature St. John's Hotel and spend the evening getting acquainted with your surroundings.

St. John's

Day 2: Kick off the day and explore all that the port city of St. John's has to offer. Visit the most easterly point in North America at Cape Spear Lighthouse National Historic Site, then visit downtown St. John's. Stop for lunch at one of the many cafes and pubs in

the area. Stroll along two of the oldest streets in North America, Duckworth Street and Water Street, and visit the shops and galleries that line them. At nearby Quidi Vidi Village check out Quidi Vidi Brewery, notable for their Iceberg beer (made with real icebergs), and head to the Quidi Vidi Village Artisan Studios, a collection of small studios highlighting emerging local artists. Downtown St. John's is also known for points of interest such as Jellybean Row, the Rooms, home of Provincial Museum, Archives and Art Gallery and the Terry Fox Memorial. Don't forget to stop at the Johnson Geo Centre and Signal Hill National Historic Site



to take in the colorful views and iconic photo opportunity of St. John's.

St. John's

Day 3: Visit the Irish Loop region just south of St. John's where you can experience Lighthouse Picnics, Ferryland and take a boat tour to the Witless Bay Ecological Reserve to see humpback whales and nesting seabirds. Travel to Ferryland (1 hour south of St. John's) and take short 40-minute hike to Ferryland Lighthouse and enjoy a gourmet picnic from Lighthouse Picnics. Watch for humpback whales from the coastline as you enjoy your picnic. Be sure to also visit the Colony of Avalon, Ferryland established in 1621 by Sir George Calvert (the First Lord Baltimore). Depart Ferryland for Bay Bulls and take a local boat tour to the Witless Bay Ecological Reserve to see whales, Atlantic puffins, and other seabirds. Marvel at marine wildlife up-close on this cruise through the Witless Bay Ecological Reserve. The reserve is home to over 2.5 million seabirds and one of the largest populations of whales in the North Atlantic. Aboard a spacious catamaran with ample viewing areas, admire

icebergs and watch for puffins, whales, razorbills, black legged kittiwakes, and more (wildlife attractions vary with the time of year). Hear live commentary from crew and naturalists on board about Newfoundland's heritage as you travel to Iceberg Alley.

St. John's - Clarenville

Day 4: If you enjoy nature viewing you will want to visit Cape St. Mary's Ecological Reserve to view the northern gannets that nest on a 200 ft sea stack, located on the south-west coast of the Avalon Peninsula near St. Bride's. Stand a mere 20 metres from Bird Rock at the Cape St. Mary's Ecological Reserve, one of the most accessible seabird nesting sites in the world. If you like history, Castle Hill National Historic Site is well worth the scenic drive. This site consists of the remains of French and British fortifications and outworks from the late 17th to the early 19th centuries that sits on the top of a peninsula, high above Placentia, Newfoundland offering fantastic views. Depart Placentia for Clarenville.

Clarenville - Gander

Day 5: Depart Clarenville for Gander. North

of Gander Twillingate offers stunningly rugged coastline, historical, picturesque streets, and lush countryside roads. In the waters off the coast, look for whales, dolphins, harp seals, seabirds, and - if the season is right - icebergs. Twillingate is one of the stops along Iceberg Alley, and best places to view all these sights is at Long Point Lighthouse, which looks out over the distant reaches of Notre Dame Bay. Take a boat expedition and witness whales breaching and playing.

Gander - Corner Brook

Day 6: Depart from Gander for Gros Morne National Park. Take in the beautiful scenery as you journey through Newfoundland and Labrador and making your way to a Canadian treasure, Gros Morne National Park, a UNESCO World Heritage Site. Option: Stop in King's Point and tour the sites there.

Corner Brook

Day 7: Spend your day hiking through Gros Morne National Park.

Corner Brook - St. John's

Day 8: Make your way back to St. John's or Depart via air from Deer Lake, NL.



WONDERS OF ATLANTIC CANADA - NEW BRUNSWICK

Saint John - Arrival

Day 1: Canada's oldest incorporated city (1785) and the only city on the Bay of Fundy, Saint John has a Loyalist heritage that goes back centuries. Today, Saint John is a popular port-of-call on many of the Canada-New England cruise itineraries. With the Bay of Fundy at its doorstep, Saint John is a vibrant port city full of urban adventure on the edge of nature. The Reversing Falls is where water runs backwards twice a day, and no one blinks an eye. Where the most powerful tug-of-war on earth takes place in the heart of the city thanks to a geological hip-check of South America and Africa, now recognized as the Stonehammer UNESCO Global GEOPark.

Saint John - St. Andrews

Day 2: Visit Saint John City Market, in operation since 1876 and built by shipbuilders. Its unique design - an upside-down ship's hull, has no center pillars or posts to hold up the roof. Nowhere else in Saint John can you

experience a traditional "farmers market" while shopping for such a wide selection of goods and services, ranging from dulce to hand-made local crafts, and enjoy a delicious meal from one of the numerous restaurants, featuring local and international foods. Visit the Area 506 Waterfront Container Village or take part in a historic walking tour of Uptown Saint John. Visit the Town of St. Andrews National Historic District. St. Andrews is a premier heritage seaside resort and is one of a select few National Historic Districts in Canada. Founded in 1783 by United Empire Loyalists from the U.S. state of Maine, St. Andrews is home to more than 140 heritage buildings, including five National Historic Sites: St. Andrews Blockhouse (1812), Minister's Island (1786), Greenock Church (1824), Charlotte County Courthouse (1840), Charlotte County Gaol (1832), and just a few kilometres up the St. Croix River you'll find the international historic site of Saint Croix Island, which history dates back to 1604. St. Andrews is exceptional among Canadian towns



in having an unusually large number of heritage buildings, some dating back as far as 230 years. Old-world charm in the 21st century awaits family, friends and visitors year-round in St. Andrews.

St. Andrews

Day 3: Experience a whale watching tour with Quoddy Link Marine. Awe-inspiring wildlife experiences in New Brunswick introduce visitors to whales, shorebirds, inland birds and other amazing species of wild animals.

St. Andrews - Fredericton

Day 4: The city of Fredericton, New Brunswick's Riverside Capital. Relax with locals over a craft beer on a lively patio; dive into the rich history on display throughout the city; catch a show at the theatre; explore gorgeous parks by land or water. In Fredericton, the urban comes with a delightful side of nature. Built along both sides of the meandering Saint John River, Fredericton has a special connection to the water. 'The Green' is a long park hugging the banks of the river, and locals value it for the breath of fresh air it provides in the heart of the city. Kayaking, rowing, canoeing, and stand-up paddleboarding are common pastimes. Plus, beaches, golf courses, gardens and trails combine to make Fredericton a very active, outdoor city. History lives loud here. Museums, heritage sites, large old Victorian homes, the historic Garrison District, and the legislative assembly

create a connection to bygone days that flavours any explorer's experience. Enjoy it as you discover new restaurants, city markets, and of course, a few of the city's microbreweries – the highest concentration of craft breweries and tasting experiences in the Maritimes. Culture is vibrant here, with galleries, festivals and artists' studios elevating your experience even more. Our province's capital city might just become your main event.

Fredericton - Moncton

Day 5: City of Moncton, Canada's only officially bilingual (English & French) city and voted "most polite city in Canada" is located at the geographic centre of the Canadian Maritimes. Location is everything in Moncton, with easy access to two contrasting New Brunswick coastlines – the Fundy Coastal Drive and the Acadian Coastal Drive. Stroll down Main Street, witness the tidal bore roll in from the Bay of Fundy, or discover the cool urban art that's springing up everywhere. There's a lot going on here!

Moncton - Bay Of Fundy Coast - Moncton

Day 6: New Brunswick's most famous geological feature is the Hopewell Rocks, home to the world's highest tides that rise and fall up to an incredible 48 ft. (14 m)! Older than the Appalachian Mountains and once larger than the Canadian Rocky Mountains, the red

cliffs of Hopewell Rocks have been chiseled, over millions of years, by the pounding force of the Fundy tides. It's a place to pause; a place to appreciate a remarkable story interwoven through time, tide, and the intricacies of nature. These are the highest tides in the world after all, and it happens twice a day, every day of the year! At low tide, the sea retreats so far visitors can walk for miles to explore a maze of sky-high rocks that look like sculpted flowerpots. FYI: Each summer, for a 4-6-week period beginning in mid-July, 1 to 2.5 million shorebirds congregate in waves at several key locations in the upper reaches of the bay. The Bay of Fundy is their only stopover on a 2,485 mi (4,000 km) migration south and one of the best locations to see these shorebirds just happens to be at Hopewell Rocks.

Moncton - Departure

Day 7: Do you trust your own perception? Magnetic Hill, where cars simply don't roll uphill. It's impossible, right? Well, drive to the bottom of this world-famous hill, shift into neutral, and be prepared to be amazed. Your car will roll uphill in total defiance of natural law, even as your brain is telling you it's simply not possible. Is it a magnetic pull, an illusion, or a gravitational mystery? Stories about Magnetic Hill have been around since the early 1800s, and this wondrous place has been puzzling visitors for decades.

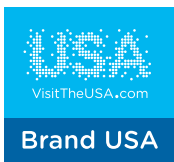

3. National Parks and American Indian Cultures

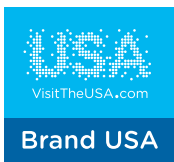
Arizona – Colorado – New Mexico – Utah

From Napa Valley, stop in Calistoga for mud baths and hot springs on your way to mom-and-pop wineries in Redding, California. Your next stop is Oregon’s Rogue Valley wine country and the Cascade Mountains, home to Crater Lake National Park.

Take a couple days to savor Eugene and the Willamette Valley, where pinot noir and pinot gris wines reign supreme and restaurants embrace farm-fresh ingredients. End your trip with a tour of the hip and original dining scene in big-city Portland, Oregon.

14. Quaint New England Towns

Massachusetts – New Hampshire – Maine – New Hampshire – Vermont – Connecticut – Rhode Island

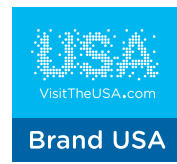
Begin with a tour of historic sites in bigcity Boston, then follow the scenic New England coastline from Massachusetts to Maine. Stay in a lovely inn in Kennebunkport and visit Atlantic Ocean beach towns, including Camden and Bar Harbor. See lighthouses and climb Cadillac Mountain in Acadia National Park. Drive through New Hampshire, stopping to hike trails and shop for locally made crafts, and head to Vermont to explore Green Mountains National Forest. Visit the Mystic Seaport in Connecticut, tour mansions in Rhode Island, and go whale-watching off Cape Cod.

15. Secret Trails – Back Roads, Beaches and Bayous

Texas – Louisiana

Take a road trip through Texas and Louisiana to discover breathtaking scenery, must-see attractions and exciting cities. In Austin, enjoy city parks and springs in addition to live music downtown. Make a side trip to view the cliffs, valleys and flower-covered meadows of Texas Hill Country. Continue to Houston, where visiting Space Center Houston is a must. Travel across the state line to Louisiana and see birds and other wildlife along the Creole Nature Trail. Learn about Mardi Gras history, stroll around the historic district and eat great cuisine in Lake Charles. Sample fresh seafood and other local specialties along the Cajun Corridor Byway, visit plantation estates, take a swamp tour and follow roads with moss-draped trees to New Orleans. Explore the city’s French Quarter and Garden District, then enjoy music and the festive atmospheres of Royal, Frenchmen and Bourbon streets.
