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

CENTENNIAL HISTORIC ROUTE 66

Chicago - Arrival

Day 1: Upon arrival at Chicago O'Hare International Airport, transfer independently to the hotel where you will meet your ATI tour director between the hours of 2 pm and 8 pm at the Hospitality/Welcome Desk. The remainder of the day is at your leisure.

Chicago

Day 2: Enjoy the included morning city tour of Chicago and see some of the most spectacular modern architecture designed by many famous architects like Mies van der Rohe, Frank Lloyd Wright, and Daniel Burnham. Experience the opulent Magnificent Mile filled with name-brand retail stores, Navy Pier, once used by the US Navy, now a point for restaurants and entertainment, Grant and Lincoln parks, home to several outdoor concerts and city gatherings, and not to forget the Cloud Gate sculpture. The afternoon is at leisure to explore many other points of interest, or book a visit through your Tour Director for the Willis Tower, an architectural river cruise, or a dinner cruise (Subject to availability)

Chicago - St. Louis

Day 3: Say farewell to Chicago, and the journey of Historic Route 66 commences. The legendary old road passes through a variety of pure Americana landscapes and takes in some of the country's biggest, oldest and most peculiar sites along the way. Begin the journey by following the traditional East-West direction of Route 66 from Chicago to St. Louis, Missouri, traveling through cornfields and flat prairies. When we arrive in St. Louis, one of the largest

cities along Route 66, you can follow in the footsteps of legendary explorers, including Lewis and Clark, at the Gateway Arch, the gate to the West and the nation's tallest monument within a National Park

St. Louis - Springfield

Day 4: Continue through the Ozark Highlands of Southern Missouri, recognized as the birthplace of Route 66. En route, stop at the Meramec Caverns, a natural limestone cave whose formations and colors are as unique as they are beautiful. Adding to the pleasure of exploring the caves is learning that Jesse James used them as a hideout and took advantage of the underground river to escape through the "Back Door."

Springfield - Tulsa - Oklahoma City

Day 5: This morning, cut through the south-eastern corner of Kansas on your way to Oklahoma City. The Oklahoma section of Route 66 contains more drivable miles than any other state. Portion of this stretch was even used by many Oklahoman families headed west in search of better opportunities during the 1930s. The famous blue whale statue in Catoosa remains a landmark along Route 66. Once arriving in Tulsa, the Avery Route 66 memorial bridge connects the east with the west. Constructed in 1915 but closed to both vehicles and pedestrians, it gained its place on the list of National Historic Places in 1996. A brief orientation tour will commence upon arrival in Oklahoma City, the state capital of Oklahoma.

Oklahoma City - Amarillo

Day 6: Continue to Amarillo, located in the pancake flat plains of the Texas Panhandle. This area of Texas was once the buffalo-rich grasslands of the Great Plains, inhabited by the Kiowa and Comanche Native Americans. Stop at the Oklahoma Route 66 museum in Clinton, where you can experience 6 decades of Route 66 history. (admission included) Stop in Shamrock, Texas, known for the once beloved Conoco Tower Station and U-drop café, and the 1929 opened and restored Phillips 66 gas station for a photo stop in Mclean. Oil companies opened many gas stations as the need for petrol increased, as the number of travelers increased on Route 66.

Amarillo - Albuquerque

Day 7: Before leaving Amarillo, a visit to the world-famous Cadillac Ranch is a must. Here, you experience a unique display of art featuring a row of ten colorful painted Cadillac cars. Buried grill first in the ground since 1974. The Cadillacs range in production years between 1949 and 1963. This art display is now home to over 1 million visitors a year. Continue westbound and arrive in the neighboring state of New Mexico with destination Albuquerque. This city is not only the state's largest but also known as the hub for technology, the arts, and the annual International Balloon Festival.

Albuquerque - Gallup - Holbrook

Day 8: Leave Albuquerque and travel north to another spectacular Route 66 community, Gallup. Having barely changed since Route 66's heydays, this





city serves up a slice of Americana rarely seen nowadays, along with one of the best strips of Neon signs you will see anywhere on the old route. Shop one of the unique gift stores of the Southwest. When leaving Gallup, you will enter the Nation's largest Native American Reservation, home to the Navajo Nation. Living on almost 18,000 acres of land, this reservation is found in the states of Arizona, New Mexico, and Utah. This afternoon, you could experience the wonders of Canyon de Chelly, where ancestral pueblos, pictographs of the ancient past will introduce you to Navajo culture. (Optional Excursion)

Holbrook - Monument Valley - Page

Day 9: Leave Holbrook and continue your expedition through the Navajo Nation to Monument Valley. Experience the beauty of this region through a variety of Monuments, Mesas, and Buttes. This backdrop was used for many western movies with actor John Wayne, including movies like Forrest Gump and Back to the Future. Get up close to some of the monuments through the Monument Valley jeep tour (Optional excursion). Overnight in Page, AZ

Page

- Grand Canyon National Park - Williams

Day 10: Before leaving Page, a visit to Antelope Canyon (optional Excursion) is scheduled and recommended to participate. Antelope Canyon is the American Southwest's most visited canyon, created through the force of water and wind erosion, leaving slot canyons and narrow pathways. This experience is not to be missed. Return to the Navajo Reservations and travel to the magnificent Grand Canyon. This region was proclaimed as a National Park in 1919 and continues to receive close to 5 million visitors annually. In

the late afternoon, you will arrive at the historic Route 66 community of Williams. You will take an unforgettable train ride (included) through the magnificent Grand Canyon National Park.

Williams - Seligman - Kingman - Las Vegas

Day 11: Depart Williams and continue via route 40 to route 66 and visit Seligman, Arizona. It was this community that lobbied to have the name changed from Route 66 to Historic Route 66 back in 1987. Many residents who had called Seligman home still live there today and always welcome visitors all year round. Continue via Kingman to the glitz and glamour of the City of Las Vegas, where mega resort hotels dot the Las Vegas Strip. From the 24-hour-a-day Casino to the large variety of shows gave this city the slogan, the entertainment capital of the world. Join your fellow travelers tonight for the orientation tour of the city, where you will be introduced to some of the hotels during this walking and driving tour. (Optional Excursion)

Las Veaas

Day 12: Enjoy this day at leisure to explore more of Las Vegas at your own pace or consult the Tour Director for the optional excursions planned for the day, including a visit to the Hoover Dam and the Dinner and Show program for tonight.

Las Vegas - Barstow/Yermo - Los Angeles

Day 13: After a leisurely morning, and before we depart Las Vegas, we will stop at the iconic Welcome To Las Vegas sign before we continue our journey through the Mojave Desert into the state of California on our way to Barstow / Yermo. Once arrived, a stop will be made at Calico Ghost Town (admission included). Once a bustling community of the 19th century during

the local silver ore rush, it fell into despair during the 1930s but was then purchased by the amusement park Knotts Berry Farm, reconstructed as it was during its peak years and then donated as a gift to San Bernardino County as an attraction. Relive the days of the Old West. In the afternoon, we arrive in Los Angeles, a metropolis of more than 18 million residents.

Los Angeles

Day 14: Enjoy a full day city tour of this mega city and visit some of the neighborhoods the city is so famous for, including downtown Los Angeles, Hollywood and the walk of fame, Farmers Market and the Grove, passing Beverly Hills on our way to the final stop of route 66, Santa Monica. Here you will have time at leisure to explore the beach, Santa Monica Pier with the famous "END OF ROUTE 66" sign. After a farewell dinner (included), your Historic Route 66 tour will end upon arrival at the LAX Hotel.

Los Angeles Departure

Day 15: Individual check out and transfer via hotel Shuttle on your own to the LAX Airport.

WEST COAST INSIDER

San Francisco - Arrival

Day 1: Arrive in San Francisco and transfer independently to your hotel where you will meet with your ATI Insider Tour Director in the evening.

San Francisco

Day 2: This morning, a fun and exciting city tour provides an overview of the city and enables you to truly appreciate many of San Francisco's most famous sights, including Chinatown, Union Square, and Fisherman's Wharf. Your tour will include a ride on one of San Francisco's historic cable cars. And for an extra thrill, consider hanging off the running board, Doris Day-style. As no visit to San Francisco would be complete without taking a cruise on the

Bay or crossing the Golden Gate Bridge, in the afternoon we collect a bike from Fisherman's wharf and pedal across the Golden Gate before boarding a ferry back across the Bay, passing the famous PIER 39 sea lions along the historic waterfront which reveals the city's spectacular skyline. Be sure to take full advantage of prime photo opportunities with unobstructed views of the Golden Gate Bridge and the notorious Alcatraz Island. This evening you may join your Tour Director for the San Francisco evening tour (optional).

San Francisco (Napa Valley or Muir Woods Optional)

Day 3: Your Tour Director is on hand to assist with making your plans for the day: perhaps another cable car ride

to Fisherman's Wharf where you may enjoy a "Taste of San Francisco": local seafood, famous sourdough breads or decadent Ghiradelli's Chocolate. Or take a stroll by Sea Lions' Marina to watch them frolic. Be sure to gaze across the bay to Alcatraz Island where "America's Most Wanted" such as Al Capone and "Machine Gun" Kelly were incarcerated. Or visit Union Square for a shopping stop at Macy's Department Store. If you would like to explore beyond the city, we recommend you embark on a wine tasting tour to Napa Valley, world renowned for its fine wineries and beautiful scenery. Or you may choose to take in the natural wonder of the Bay Area by hiking through the "enchanted" forest at nearby Muir Woods (optional).



San Francisco - Yosemite - Yosemite Gateway

Day 4: This morning we journey east toward the tranquility of California's High Sierras and Yosemite National Park's nearly 1,200 square miles of mountainous terrain. Once inside the park you will be introduced to some of Yosemite's most famous and aweinspiring scenery, including Yosemite Falls, Half Dome, El Capitan, Tunnel View, and Bridalveil Falls. Postcardperfect pictures abound so be sure to have your camera ready.

Yosemite Gateway - Mojave Desert - Las Vegas

Day 5: Today, travel through the Mojave Desert on your way to Las Vegas. A late afternoon arrival in the dazzling "Entertainment Capital of the World" will give you enough time to start enjoying this fantastic city right away with an exciting evening tour featuring the famed casinos along the Strip followed by a visit to Downtown Las Vegas, where you will enjoy the glitzy lights of the Fremont Experience.

Las Vegas - Grand Canyon West - Las Vegas

Day 6: This morning we stop at the iconic Las Vegas Welcome Sign where you may wish to capture a photo memory of Las Vegas before making your way on an included day trip to the Grand Canyon's West Rim. On the way, admire the beauty of Lake Mead, the largest reservoir in the U.S. formed by the Hoover Dam. At the Grand Canyon West, you will have time to explore the views on your own and if you choose, join an optional helicopter trip over the canyon, a float on the Colorado, or walk on the Skywalk platform. This evening at leisure - your ATI Tour Director will provide recommendations that cater to your desired experience, whether it

be partaking in the stellar shopping or enjoying the countless fine dining options that Vegas has to offer.

Las Vegas - Palm Springs - San Diego

Day 7: Today your journey takes you from Las Vegas through Palm Springs, the winter playground for Hollywood royalty, with its lively downtown area and immaculately kept golf courses at the base of the rugged San Jacinto Mountains. This city in the desert was once known as the winter retreat of stars like Frank Sinatra, Jane Russell and Elvis Presley. Today it is a flourishing resort town with great shops, restaurants and year round desert climate. A sea of wind turbines mark the entrance to this desert oasis. We continue south to San Diego, a city known for its beaches, parks, and perfect climate. Enjoy the evening at leisure and perhaps visit some of the vibrant neighborhoods of San Diego.



San Diego

Day 8: Today you will explore California's second largest city with your Tour Director. The relaxed seaside surf vibes of neighborhoods such as Sunset Beach provide a quintessential California Coastal experience. During your Insider city tour of San Diego's sites, you will witness central role of the American Navy in this port city. You may choose to enjoy one of San Diego's many attractions such as Sea World or the World Famous San Diego Zoo. In the evening, we recommend checking out another of the city's bustling neighborhoods or perhaps a dinner cruise on the bay (optional).

"Head north along Highway 1 to one of California's most unique destinations, Hearst Castle."

San Diego - The OC - Los Angeles

Day 9: This morning we head north along the SoCal coast toward Orange County, or the OC, as it has come to be called by locals. Enjoy the atmosphere of cliffside Laguna Beach, with its local art galleries and vibrant surf culture. Continue onward to Los Angeles, America's second largest city, a sprawling metropolis and the home of America's entertainment industry. Enjoy an evening at leisure. Your Tour Director may suggest you explore LA's smaller neighboring city of Long Beach, with one of the largest ports in the United States is also home to a historic ocean liner, the Queen Mary, which you may choose and explore (optional).

Los Angeles

Day 10: Embark upon an extensive and entertaining insider tour of Los Angeles that will deliver a true taste of Southern California with a visit to the most popular seaside communities like Venice whose

boardwalk is famous for its Muscle Beach, and Santa Monica, home to one of California's oldest pleasure piers. You'll catch a glimpse the glitz and glamor of Beverly Hills, where you just might cross paths with a celebrity shopper or two along Rodeo Drive. Enjoy local flavors at the LA Farmer's Market before making your way to Hollywood, where you'll check out the Stars on the Walk of Fame, the celebrity hand and footprints at the Chinese Theatre, and of course the Hollywood Sign! An afternoon partaking in the thrills offered at Universal Studios (optional) is recommended.

Los Angeles - Malibu - Santa Barbara - Central Coast

Day 11: This morning you depart LA travelling through the coastal hamlet of Malibu, home to celebrities and recluses alike, this enclave is like none other in California. Continue north up Pacific Coast Highway (called PCH by locals)



to Santa Barbara, where palm-lined walkways border white sandy beaches. Known as the "American Riviera" for its similarities to the South of France, enjoy local food and wine during a lunch stop. Make sure to check out the city's unique Spanish architecture at it's beautiful City Hall before continuing to a central coast town for an overnight stay.

Central Coast - Hearst Castle - Big Sur - Monterey

Day 12: Head north along Highway
1 to one of California's most unique
destinations, Hearst Castle. Built by
newspaper baron William Randolph
Hearst, the eclectic collection of oldworld architecture and grand gardens
is situated amidst a stunning coastal
landscape that will leave you in wonder.
Continue up the curvy coast road
through Big Sur, a cliffside retreat where
viewpoints over the rugged Pacific
coastline are truly unparalleled. Continue

onward over the famed "Bixby Bridge" to Monterey, California's first capital city, where you will be able to enjoy you evening at leisure with recommendations from your Tour Director.

Monterey/Carmel - San Francisco

Day 13: This morning you will experience all that the Monterey Peninsula has to offer by visiting the quaint village of Carmel after an exhilarating journey along one of the most scenic roads in the world, 17-Mile Drive. Afterwards, take in the sights, sounds and smells of Monterey at Old Fisherman's Wharf and explore Cannery Row's historic waterfront district, John Steinbeck's inspiration for his novel of the same name. You may choose to visit the world renowned Monterey Bay Aquarium where you will be able to see and even interact with local aquatic wildlife, including the Aquarium's most famous and adorable Sea Otter residents. In

the afternoon, pass the fertile valleys of Castroville and Santa Clara en route back to where you started your unforgettable journey, San Francisco.

San Francisco - Departure

Day 14: Your West Coast Insider tour has come to an end. Transfer independently to the airport for your return flight home.







WESTERN HIGHLIGHTS

San Francisco - Arrival

Day 1: Welcome to San Francisco! The California Gold Rush of 1849 transformed this small, sleepy village into a bustling port nicknamed "City by the Bay." Its cosmopolitan flair and breathtaking view of the bay attracts visitors from all over the world. San Francisco ranks as one of America's most popular destinations for American and foreign visitors alike.

San Francisco

Day 2: Experience for yourself why so many people leave their hearts in San Francisco. A half-day city tour will introduce you to many sights and sounds of the city. Hear the horns of ships leaving from the Bay to faraway places, see shoppers rush by on busy Union Square, and listen to the cable car operators clanging their bells. The afternoon is yours to cruise the bay onboard of San Francisco's most popular 1-hour bay cruise (optional), shop, ride the cable cars or just stroll and explore the streets. Your ATI Tour Director will be on hand to assist you in planning your activities in the city. Tonight, join your fellow passengers for an optional evening tour of San Francisco. Start off your evening with an exciting cable car ride. Next, we take a stroll through China Town. We continue to Treasure Island. where you will experience a captivating

panoramic view of the San Francisco skyline (weather permitting) and slowly drive back to your hotel.

San Francisco - Yosemite - Fresno

Day 3: Leave San Francisco and drive on to Yosemite National Park. Drive through California's Central Valley, where extensive irrigation projects turned the region into an agricultural wonder, unequaled on the North American continent. Over 240 different crops are grown here, including almonds, oranges, and grapes. Later, we arrive in Yosemite National Park, which is home to the truly spectacular collection of waterfalls, majestic granite formations such as El Capitan and Half Dome, and remarkable wildlife. We will explore the park by motorcoach, but you will also have time on the valley floor to enjoy the spectacular scenery. Overnight in Fresno.

Fresno - Mojave Desert - Las Vegas

Day 4: Get an early start this morning for the drive south through the Central Valley and over the mountains into the rugged Mojave Desert. Continue east and you will immediately notice you have entered Nevada. Casinos at the state line greet weary interstate travelers on both sides of the road. A few more miles and there it is, like a mirage in the desert: the entertainment capital of the world, Las Vegas. Once a small settlement, founded as a farming center, it fleetingly boomed during the silver rush of the 1860s. Today, Las Vegas is one of the great gambling capitals of the world, with sensational entertainment and famous shows. See the best attractions in Las Vegas during an evening tour with or without Helicopter flight over the Las Vegas Strip (optional).

Las Vegas (Death Valley Optional)

Day 5: The day is yours to enjoy in Las Vegas. Maybe do a little shopping at one of the fine shopping outlets in Las Vegas, lounge by the pool, or join an optional tour to Death Valley National Park, the lowest (below sea level) and hottest region in the western hemisphere.

Las Vegas - Cedar City - Bryce Canyon

Day 6: Continue the adventure as you travel north bound through the Mojave Desert towards the neighboring state of Arizona, which is then followed almost immediately by the state of Utah. Traveling through the Virgin River Gorge you can see how the scenery changes from a desert to a mountainous plateau. Once you have entered the state of Utah also known as the Beehive State and





headquarters to the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-Day Saints, also known as the Mormon Church, the elevation will rise as well to an average of 6000 feet. For the next couple of days we will visit the Colorado Plateau, home to several national parks including our destination today, Bryce Canyon.

Enjoy the spectacular views of Bryce and Inspiration points where you see how the canyon is filled with numerous Hoodoos, a Pillar of Rock. Join Ebenezer's dinner show for an evening of country music and local cuisine (optional).

Bryce Canyon - Grand Canyon - Williams

Day 7: After Leaving Bryce Canyon travel through the community of Kanab, where at one time the movie industry was alive and cowboys like Roy Rogers, John Wayne, and Ronald Reagan, just to name a few, filmed the old western movies with the beautiful scenery of Kanab as the background, giving the town its nickname "Little Hollywood"

After Page Arizona, we enter the Navajo Indian Reservation, where this ancient culture remains through today a fascinating one. See the original homes of the Navajo's known as the Hogan, the vast and spread-out lands, the magnificent color formation where certain regions are knows as the painted desert. Once we have travelled through, we enter the Grand Canyon National Park, one of the 7 natural wonders of the world. Consult your Tour Director about

a helicopter flight above the canvon and experience the canyon from a bird's eye view. Overnight in the historic Route 66 community of Williams.

Williams - Route 66 Seligman - Kingman - Bullhead City

Day 8: After experiencing historic Williams, Arizona, once a thriving railroad community connecting east and westbound train travelers but also the start and end station of the Grand Canyon Railway, it is now time to travel onto Historic Route 66 and relive the 50ies and 60ies, by stopping in one of last remain historic towns, Seligman. If souvenir shopping is on your mind, this is where you find them ranging from road signs to T-shirts displaying the history of the Route. Continue to Kingman, the largest community within the region, before returning into the state of Nevada after you have crossed the Colorado River into Laughlin named after Don Laughlin, once a land and business entrepreneur, who created the city of Laughlin, NV. Explore some of the Casinos tonight or perhaps just a relaxing stroll along the Colorado River. Overnight in Bullhead City.

Bullhead City - Palm Springs - Los Angeles

Day 9: An early start will take us back into the State of California and on our way to the desert Community of Palm Springs, where celebrities had their winter retreats when they wanted to escape the hustle and bustle of their

busy Hollywood lifestyles of the 40ies through today. Palm Springs is also a community of Great classic Spanish Revival as well as Mid Century Modern architecture and great art festivals during the winter season. We continue to our last destination, Los Angeles, where an orientation tour will commence upon arrival, focusing on neighborhoods of downtown Los Angeles, Hollywood and a bit of Beverly Hills before ending at our overnight hotel.

Continue to Cheyenne, Wyoming's capital city that embodies the spirit of the Old West. Considered the nation's railroad capital. Chevenne is home to a collection of steam engines, including Old Number 4004, the world's largest

steam locomotive and one of the eight remaining Big Boys on display throughout the country.

Cheyenne - Rapid City

Day 3: Your journey begins this morning with a visit to Fort Laramie National Historic Site. Originally established as a private fur trading fort, this "grand old post" evolved into the largest and best-known military post on the Northern Plains and witnessed the entire sweeping saga of America's western expansion. Continue through the majestic beauty of South Dakota's Black Hills to Mount Rushmore National Memorial where you'll come face to face with George Washington, Thomas Jefferson, Theodore Roosevelt, Abraham Lincoln, and America's rich heritage.

Rapid City - Cody

Day 4: Today, crossing back into Wyoming en route to Cody, you'll travel through Bighorn National Forest where undisturbed rolling hills, alpine lakes, craggy cliffs, thick pine forests and the Bighorn Mountains dominate the landscape. Upon arrival in Cody you'll visit the Buffalo Bill Museum. Cody - Yellowstone



Overnight in Flagstaff, a famed stop on Historic Route 66.

Flagstaff - Seligman/Route 66 - Las Vegas

Day 15: This morning depart Flagstaff and travel on to Las Vegas, the dazzling "Entertainment Capital of the World".

Along the way, pass through Seligman, a town built along the famed Route 66 that looks as if it were frozen in time sixty years ago. The remainder of the day is at leisure for you to explore the dazzling Las Vegas Strip.

Las Vegas - Mojave Desert - Beverly Hills - Los Angeles

Day 16: Travel to Los Angeles through the Mojave Desert, where clusters of unique Joshua trees dot the mountainous landscape. Upon arrival in Los Angeles you will enjoy a tour through the "City of Angels" including Hollywood, Sunset Strip and parts of Beverly Hills, before reaching your hotel.

The Cape Neddick Lighthouse (also called 'the Nubble") is considered the most photographed lighthouse in America. Your next stop will be Kennebunkport. Kennebunkport is a small, charming coastal town and home to the palatial summer estates of prominent politicians, including the 41st U.S. President, George Herbert Walker Bush. You will experience first-hand why it was voted 'the place to be all year'. From Kennebunkport, it's on to Portland, Maine's largest city. You will enjoy the beauty of this coastal region, including lighthouses and local lobster fishermen. Afterwards, you are free to explore Portland, stroll the cobblestone streets of Portland's famous Old Port waterfront and perhaps you may wish to enjoy the famous Maine lobster roll!

Portland - Acadia National Park - Bar Harbor

Day 3: Journey to the North today to the "Crown Jewel of the North Atlantic Coast": - Acadia National Park, Situated on the coast of Maine and home to stunning landscapes and diverse wildlife, Acadia National Park is beautiful year-round and gorgeous in every season. We then enter Rhode Island, the 'Ocean State',-home to spectacular coastal scenery and awe-inspiring architecture. We then arrive at our destination for today:,- Newport is considered by many as the Sailing Capital of the World. Here you may wish to explore Newport's natural beauty along its Cliff Walk. Here, between the pounding surf of the Atlantic Ocean and sprawling lawns, sit the famed Gilded Age mansions that once were the summer playgrounds for socialite families such as the Astor's and Vanderbilt's. Visit one of these opulent mansions for a glimpse into the lavish lifestyle.

Newport - Cape Cod

Day 7: From the opulence of Newport you'll continue onward today to the natural beauty of Cape Cod where beaches with high sand dunes, beautiful rocks and the never-ending sea awaits. Beachcombing in Cape Cod is a wonderful pastime. While there are

Cape Cod

You'll cross the international border to enter the Canadian province of Québec. Perhaps visit an authentic maple farm and this evening, take the opportunity to sample some of the celebrated French Canadian cuisine (optional).

Québec City - Montréal

Day 4: Begin the day with a tour of Québec City, the French capital of the province and a UNESCO World Heritage Site. Highlights include the Québec Provincial Parliament Building and the Citadelle. Then enjoy a walking tour of the walled city, where you will see the Chateau de Frontenac, as well as unparalleled views of the Saint

Lawrence River. Then you may want to enjoy a delicious pastry, baquette or candy treat or, if time allows, may we suggest a visit to Rue du Tresor before departing to Montréal. Roanoke - Blue Ridge Mountains - Great Smoky Mountains - Gatlinburg

Day 11: Travel along portions of the Blue Ridge Parkway/Mountains before entering the breathtaking scenery of the Great Smoky Mountains and National Park, before arriving in Gatlinburg in the afternoon and explore some of the unique restaurants on main-street, during this evening leisure time.

Gatlinburg - Nashville

Day 12: Continue today through Knoxville, the state's third largest city before you arrive in the early afternoon in Music City USA, Nashville.

Nashville - Memphis

Take a city tour including Beale Street, the heart of the blues music scene. Memphis - Jackson - New Orleans

Day 14: Today's tour takes you to Mississippi, the Magnolia State. Pass through Jackson, the state capital, and continue to Louisiana and New Orleans, the home of the infamous Mardi Gras celebrations. Tonight, immerse yourself in Creole culture on board an authentic Mississippi Riverboat dinner cruise and enjoy the rhythms of a Dixieland jazz band (optional).

New Orleans

Day 15: A full day at leisure to take in the French flavor and grandeur of New Orleans. Explore the French Quarter with its trademark wrought iron balconies overlooking the narrow, cobblestone streets. Stand atop one of the infamous New Orleans levees and gain the perspective of how these unique feats of architecture guard the city.

New Orleans - Gulf Of Mexico - Pensacola

Atlanta - Arrival

The city recovered from its losses and today is one of the most dynamic in the South, boasting a successful cultural and business hub. Transfer independently to your hotel where you will meet your ATI Tour Director.

Atlanta

Day 2: This morning, enjoy a comprehensive city tour of Atlanta, including a visit to the boyhood home of Martin Luther King. You will also learn about another of Atlanta's most famous residents, Margaret Mitchell, who wrote the historical novel that became a masterpiece of American cinema, "Gone with the Wind." Visit the Road to Tara Museum and Stately Oaks Plantation, which was the inspiration for plantation in the film. You will have the opportunity to see memorabilia from the movie including costumes worn by the stars Clark Gable and Vivien Leigh. In the evening, enjoy a welcome reception which will give you the opportunity to meet your fellow travelers.

Atlanta - Augusta - Charleston

Day 3: Leave Atlanta today and head west to Augusta. Augusta is the second oldest city in Georgia and is home to the prestigious Masters golf tournament. In the late afternoon, you will arrive in Charleston one of the most historic and charming cities of the South. For evening

activities, you may wish to consult your Tour Director for the possibilities.

Charleston - Savannah

Day 4: In the morning, enjoy a locally guided tour of Charleston Walk the streets of Charleston's preserved historic district, the best protected in the nation. Natural disasters, the Revolutionary War, and the Civil War all took their toll on this beautiful city, yet it stands out as a historic gem of the South. In the afternoon, you may wish to participate in an optional excursion to historic Boone Hall Plantation with its famous Avenue of Oaks. The property has appeared in numerous American movies, among them "North and South".

Savannah

Day 5: Today, enjoy the charm of Savannah, once the world's largest cotton port. When cotton was king, Savannah controlled the prices of the world cotton market at her cotton exchange. Founder James Oglethorpe laid out the famed city squares. The Civil War destroyed a large portion of Georgia, but Savannah was spared. Numerous buildings around the treeshaded squares are hundreds of years old; providing the setting for the popular novel "Midnight in the Garden of Good and Evil."

Savannah - Montgomery

Day 6: Set course west across the state of Georgia and into the heart of the Deep South, Alabama. Upon arrival in Montgomery, Alabama's capital city and a central backdrop of the American Civil Rights Movement, visit the Rosa





Parks Library and Museum. Learn about the Montgomery Bus Boycott inspired by Parks, which ignited the Civil Rights movement and changed American history. You may also wish to visit the Dexter Avenue King Memorial Baptist Church, where Martin Luther King Jr. led the Boycott with his powerful sermons.

Montgomery - Selma - New Orleans

Day 7: Depart Montgomery this morning to discover Selma, Alabama, another centerpiece of the Civil Rights Movement. Visit the Edmund Pettis Bridge where the historic March from Selma to Montgomery began and where the brutal events of Bloody Sunday took place. Experience another historic site of the Civil Rights Trail, the Brown Chapel AME Church before heading south through Mississippi to New Orleans, a city immersed in Creole culture. The city today is a unique blend of Spanish, French, Caribbean, African and Anglo-Saxon influences. This is obvious in the food, architecture and of course, the music. Experience this melting pot aboard a Riverboat Dinner Cruise (optional) and enjoy the rhythms of a Dixieland jazz band.

New Orleans

Day 8: The day is yours to explore the charm and excitement of one of America's most unique cities and for you to take in the French flavor & grandeur of New Orleans. May we suggest starting the day with a visit to a working plantation (optional). Explore the French Quarter with its trademark wrought iron balconies overlooking the narrow cobblestone streets.

New Orleans - Baton Rouge - Natchez

Day 9: This morning, we will travel to the capitol of Louisiana, Baton Rouge, and conduct a brief city tour. From there, we will travel via the historic Natchez Trace Parkway to Natchez. The parkway is a 444-mile drive through exceptional scenery and years of Native American and European history. Natchez is the oldest European settlement on the Mississippi River. Before the Civil War, wealthy plantation owners from Louisiana built magnificent Antebellum homes here because the area was considered safer from flooding. This afternoon, we will visit one of the homes and learn about the wealth of these 19th century millionaires.

Natchez - Mississippi River Valley - Memphis

Day 10: Leave Natchez and drive on to Memphis, home of 'Sun Records'. As a large river port, it was one of the most important links in the cotton trade before the Civil War. Memphis is also known as the "home of the blues." A brief city tour will take you to the city's liveliest street, Beale Street, where the blues and other types of music are played nightly in almost a dozen clubs. Travel along historic Front Street, known as Cotton Row in the days when cotton traders and merchants conducted business here. Of course, no visit to Memphis would be complete without a visit to Graceland, the home of Elvis Presley (optional).

Memphis - Nashville

Day 11: Continue on to Nashville, known as the capital of country music. The city earned its title with the very first airing of the WSM Barn Dance radio program, the forerunner of the Grand Ole Opry. The newly renovated Ryman Auditorium in downtown Nashville, once home of the Grand Ole Opry, the studios near Music Row, and Opryland itself attest to Nashville's reputation as the most important city in country music.

Nashville

Day 12: Begin your day in this dynamic and thriving cultural and state capital

of Tennessee with a morning city tour. While exploring the city's landmarks, perhaps you'll discover a new country music classic before they even hit the charts while visiting one of the many recording studios around town. Perhaps enjoy dinner and a show in the evening as a optional excursion.

Nashville - Chattanooga - Atlanta

Day 13: Leaving Music City, we head to Chattanooga, home to the famous Choo Choo and which has received national recognition for the renaissance of its beautiful downtown and redevelopment of its riverfront. In the afternoon, our trails lead us back to Atlanta where you may want to check our one of the sites you were not able to experience at the start of the tour like the Georgia Aquarium, World of Coca Cola, CNN Center.

Atlanta - Departure

Day 14: Morning at your leisure before departure. Your ATI Tour Director will be available to assist you in arranging individual transfers to Atlanta International Airport or with sightseeing recommendation for the day should you want to enjoy this great city further. We hope you have had a memorable journey and look forward to you the opportunity to host your next visit to America.

Miami - Arrival

Day 1: Welcome to Miami! This Metropolis, known for its hospitality, white sandy beaches of South Beach, the Salsa music and the world's largest International Cruise ship port, greets you upon exiting the airport terminals. Miami - Orlando

parks and themed attractions, Orlando. The city, home to Walt Disney World, Sea World and of course Universal Studios and many others, was at one point the fastest developed and growing region during the 1970s. Join your fellow travelers tonight for a local dinner and show. (Optional)

Orlando

Day 3: Today is your day at leisure. Enjoy exploring the entertainment complex of Walt Disney World or see Orca's at SeaWorld Orlando or peek behind the scenes at Universal Studios Orlando or Disney's Hollywood Studios (attractions and transportation not included). Your ATI Tour Director will be available to assist with planning your day.

Orlando

- Kennedy Space Center (Optional Tour) - St. Augustine

Day 4: This morning with an early start, you will be traveling eastbound towards Cape Canaveral where those that signed up for the optional tour to Kennedy Space Center will be dropped off and those not participating will spend time this morning at Coco Beach. After lunch (not included) you will continue northeast to St. Augustine, the nations' oldest settlement. Settled by the Spanish in 1565 it still has that old world Spanish influence today, marked by architecture and cobble stone streets and of course Castillo de San Marcos fortress.

St. Augustine - Crystal River - Clearwater / Tampa Bay

Day 5: This morning you will depart westbound and travel towards Gainesville, home of the Florida State University and named after a US Army officer Edmund Gaines who serviced during the war of 1812 and the Seminole Wars within Florida. The journey continues through the center of the state via Ocala to Crystal River. Once in Crystal River you will visit the three Sisters' Springs known







for beautiful scenery, and the springs with the most interesting color combinations. Manatees have been spotted at the Three Sisters' Springs so keep an eye out for them! (admission included) You continue along the coast to the Clearwater / Tampa Bay region and visit the beach before arriving at the hotel.

Clearwater / Tampa Bay - Sarasota - Naples

Day 6: Travel south along the coast to Sarasota. At one time home to the Ringling brothers, who became famous through their years of running a successful and popular circus. Sarasota became their favorite winter residence, followed by many others who turned the city into one of the most sought-after communities filled with fine dining and upscale boutiques. Continuing along the gulf coast, passing Ft. Myers, where both Henry Ford and Thomas Edison were among the residents in the city's past. As you approach Naples, the destination of the day, you have experienced many different beach communities along the way including Ft. Myers Beach, and Bonita Springs, where many visitors and residents alike enjoy the beach and the warm

waters of the Mexican Gulf. Enjoy a brief visit to Naples before reaching your hotel.

Naples - Everglades - Key West

Day 7: A short drive southbound will take you to the Everglades where an exciting airboat ride awaits you and where you will learn about the Everglades and its National Park. This wetland is home to many species of wildlife, including the blue Heron. Pelicans and of course the Alligator. Enjoy the airboat ride and the safari park. (Admission included). After the visit to the Everglades your adventure continues back towards Miami but then following Highway 1 south across the keys passing Key Largo, Islamorada and Marathon before reaching your overnight stop in Key West. Key West is the southernmost city in the contiguous United States and is only 90 miles away from Cuba. Attracting many visitors a year, Key West was also home to individuals like American novelist Ernest Hemingway, American Playwright and Screenwriter Tennessee Williams and the 33rd US President Harry Truman. Join your fellow group members tonight on the catamaran boat ride, "Commotion on the Ocean"

(Optional tour) to witness the beautiful sunsets Key West is known for.

Key West - Miami - Departure

Day 8: Before we journey back to Miami, enjoy a morning at leisure to explore the Key West community some more by yourself. Or take an optional Conch Train tour across the Island to learn more interesting facts. This morning is also a good opportunity for last-minute souvenir shopping before you return to Miami. 

Live it up in more than 200 live music venues and clubs in Chicago. See Prince's Paisley Park estate near Minneapolis, soak up Midwestern hospitality on Route 66 in Springfield, then visit the National Blues Museum in St. Louis. 3. National Parks and American Indian Cultures

Arizona - Colorado - New Mexico - Utah

While riding the Denali Star Train to Denali National Park, get spectacular views of the Alaskan wilderness and Mount McKinley. Once there, go white-water rafting, tour a historic gold town or visit sled dog kennels.


6. At the Movies - Southern SightsLouisiana - Mississippi - Alabama Georgia - Florida





Home to world-renowned Longwood Gardens, The Countryside of Philadelphia is the heart of America's Garden Capital, with the highest concentration of public gardens in Greater Philadelphia's 35 in 30 miles. Longwood is a must-stop on every Countryside itinerary, featuring acres of lush outdoor gardens, breathtaking seasonal displays, and the most significant fountain collection in North America. Longwood's summer Festival of Fountains features illuminated performances - thousands of glowing jets delight as they soar up to 175 feet and dance to music. New spaces at Longwood include a 32,000-squarefoot West Conservatory, Bonsai Courtyard, Cascade Garden, and finedining restaurant: 1906.

The legacy of the du Pont family is alive in the Countryside, with grandiose mansions and magnificent gardens to tour. Visitors can step back in time to the age of aristocracy at Winterthur Museum, Garden & Library and Nemours Estate, featuring some of the finest examples of French-inspired formal gardens in the United States.

On the National Register of Historic Places, Morris Arboretum boasts an enchanting collection of over 12,000 plants - some the largest of their kind in North America, and others exceedingly rare.

These stories are brought to life in engaging living history villages, including a revolutionary war hospital and soldier's orphan school.



The Kaibab National Forest, which surrounds Tusayan, has hiking & biking trails, wildlife viewing and spectacular stargazing...no light pollution here. The Grand Canyon sunrises and sunsets are amazing!

Tusayan - Phoenix

Day 9: Finish your journey in Phoenix. Sunny days and comfortable temperatures are the rule November through April, making this time the most enjoyable and popular time of year to visit. Vacation resorts are plentiful throughout the valley and the most

Day 10: Check out from the hotel and continue your journey to your departure airport to return the rental car.



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








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UTAH'S DREAM ROAD TRIP

Utah is the road trip you've been dreaming about. With amazing diverse landscapes and 28 scenic byways, there's never a dull moment. Utah is well known for its Mighty 5® National Parks: Zion, Arches, Canyonlands, Capitol Reef and Bryce Canyon. The beauty of Utah includes all that lies between these epic parks.

The state has a variety of themes that inspire the great American Road Trip. From a classic western with cowboys and vast desert landscapes to a Thelma & Louise epic. Many iconic scenes from Thelma & Louise were filmed in Utah, and you can visit these locations, such as Arches National Park and Dead Horse Point State Park. Take your time and drive the 22.5-mile scenic byway called Dead Horse Mesa Scenic Byway, where you will have views of the La Sal Mountains to the east, the Abajo Mountains to the south, the Henry Mountains to the west and the Bookcliffs to the north as you wind your way through breathtaking scenery.

Utah's All-American Road, Scenic Byway 12, has been designated thus

because of the unique features you can't find elsewhere, making it a tourist destination. This road connects Panguitch and Bryce Canyon in the west with Torrey and Capitol Reef in the northeast. Although this isn't the quickest route, it is by far the most beautiful. The whole drive can be completed in 3 hours, but that is without a stop to photograph, marvel and explore. As you proceed east from Panguitch, you'll enjoy driving through the two red arches in Red Canyon. Then, you'll be in awe as you witness the actual "stairs" in the Grand Staircase-Escalante National Monument just past Henrieville – a different sandstone color to the north and the south. Along the "Hogsback" between Escalante and Boulder, hairpin turns dare you on a road that drastically drops off from the shoulders into deep canyons below.


Take this opportunity to stop in Escalante and Boulder to eat at Hell's Backbone Grill, where the food couldn't get fresher as they grow their vegetables, fruits, herbs, flowers, and greens, as well as Boulder-raised, grassfed local lamb and beef. Break up your drive and hike the famed Calf Creek Falls to see a desert waterfall.

While looking for great small town stops, we recommend the town of Helper in central Utah. Looking at a map, the topography of the cliffs seems to swallow the town up in the river valley between the Western Tavaputs and Wasatch plateaus. Settled in 1881, Helper was named after the team of "helper" coal-powered steam engines that assisted freight trains up the neighboring canyon and over Soldier's Summit; the city was created because of and for the coal industry. Now a community of art, culture, history, and stories of the power of togetherness, Helper has evolved into a destination of incredible artistry, opportunity and discovery. Enjoy a great coffee at Happiness Within or a warm meal at Balanced Rock Eatery and Pub.



TRAILBLAZERS IN HOSPITALITY

From Waypoint to Wow-Point: St. George's Story Of Hospitality Innovation

When St. George, Utah, was settled in 1861, it was a desolate desert. Early settlers were sent to the area to grow cotton. They built the St. George Temple, the first temple completed by the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-Day Saints in Utah. Finished in 1877 and fully renovated in 2023, it still stands today. Nearly a century later, St. George became a sought-after tourist destination.

Hospitality was always a part of St. George's identity. As the city grew, new opportunities emerged. In 1918, the first paved highways were built, later becoming U.S. Highway 91. The next year, Zion National Park was founded, and Bryce Canyon National Park followed in 1928. These parks, along with early tourism promotions, brought the first wave of visitors.

The rise of the automobile industry and the appeal of National Parks brought more travelers. Seeing this opportunity, Lester Wittwer, a local

farmer who transported produce to Nevada and California, ventured into the hospitality business.

In 1955, after briefly running a motel in Las Vegas, Lester returned home to Santa Clara and opened the Wittwer Motor Lodge on St. George Blvd. An early innovator, he brought the first refrigerated air conditioning to a Utah hotel and built the state's second hotel swimming pool.

That original property still welcomes guests today as Aiden by Best Western



St. George, the rebranded version of the Wittwer Motor Lodge—and is the hotel featured in the photo above.

By the 1950s and '60s, roadside motels lined St. George Blvd. As more tourists discovered the area, some chose to make St. George home. A pivotal moment in the city's tourism came in 1965 when Dixie Red Hills Golf Course opened. Many credit this addition for turning St. George from a stopover into a true destination.

Lester and Vanola Wittwer raised six children, teaching them the values of hospitality and hard work. Their four sons Royden, Tony, Mel, and Sheldon helped on the farm and at the motel. As they grew, they expanded the family business. In 1968, they opened their second motel, Best Western Coral Hills,

just two blocks from the original lodge and close to the new golf course.

The 1960s were pivotal for St. George's tourism industry. Snow Canyon State Park was created in 1962. In 1967, Utah's Division of Travel Development was established to promote recreation, scenery, and attractions, making St. George a prime focus. More state parks followed: Gunlock (1970), Quail Creek (1986), and Sand Hollow (2003).

Tourism surged in the 1990s. In 1995, Tuacahn Amphitheater opened, offering breathtaking performances against a red rock backdrop. A year later, the Wittwer family opened Best Western Plus Abbey Inn, the first hotel in town with a full complimentary hot breakfast, an amenity still popular today. More golf courses, trails, and restaurants followed, cementing St. George as a premier destination.

Over the following decades, Wittwer Hospitality grew, adding multiple properties and solidifying its reputation. Today, it is one of southern Utah's most trusted names in lodging, known for innovation and Heartfelt HospitalityTM. As of 2025, St. George remains one of the fastest-growing metro areas in the U.S., with tourism at the heart of its thriving economy.

The future is bright for this desert town. With several new hotels in development and a proud legacy of hospitality, Wittwer Hospitality and the city it helped shape continue to lead the way.

Stroll down Main Street, lined with locally owned boutiques, art galleries, and tasting rooms from award-winning wineries. Dive into local heritage at Nash Farm, where 19thcentury farm life comes alive. Families can ride the vintage Grapevine Vintage Railroad, while shoppers and kids enjoy Grapevine Mills Mall, home to SEA LIFE Aguarium and LEGOLAND Discovery Center. As the sun sets, ascend the Grapevine Observation Tower for panoramic views of this welcoming Texas gem.

Grapevine - Durant

Day 3: Cross into Oklahoma and arrive in Durant, the capital of the Choctaw Nation. In Elk City, the National Route 66 Museum Complex offers an immersive look at mid-century travel, complete with vintage cars and a replica town. Cross into Texas and arrive in Amarillo, where you can dine in a classic steakhouse or visit the quirky roadside art of Cadillac Ranch.

Amarillo - Santa Fe

Day 8-9: Drive into New Mexico through the ghost town of Glenrio, a relic of Route 66's heyday. Arrive in Santa Fe, where adobe buildings, art galleries, and Native American culture create a distinctive Southwestern ambiance. Explore Canyon Road's galleries, the mystical Loretto Chapel, and the modern Meow Wolf art experience. The Santa Fe Plaza bustles with markets, music, and historic landmarks. 

MISSOURI: ICONIC SITES & LOCAL BITES

Kansas City - Arrival

Day 1: Have a late lunch at Arthur Bryant's Barbeque, the legendary "King of Ribs." The most renowned pit master in history, Bryant created a sauce that has attracted former Presidents Harry Truman and Jimmy Carter to his restaurant. Visit the sights and sounds of a uniquely American art form at the American Jazz Museum. The museum's exhibits feature talented performers who helped the genre thrive. Located in the same complex, the Negro Leagues Baseball Museum (NLBM) can't be missed. It is the world's only museum dedicated to preserving and celebrating the rich history of African American baseball and its impact on the social advancement of America. The 10,000-square-foot multimedia exhibit chronicles the history and heroes of the leagues from their founding in 1920 to their demise in the 1960s. The NLBM was recently added to the U.S. Civil Rights Trail. Some believe the integration of baseball was a catalyst for the Civil Rights Movement, proving that an individual's worth should not be determined by the color of their skin. Have dinner at Fiorella's Jack Stack Barbecue. A Kansas City tradition since 1957, Jack Stack has one of the most extensive BBQ menus in the country. After dinner, enjoy live jazz music at The Blue Room. Named after the famous 1930s Street Hotel club in the historic 18th & Vine Jazz District, the venue provides a

distinctive platform to present dynamic performances from the best local and national jazz talent in an intimate setting. In addition to The Blue Room experience, sit in on a "jam session" at The Mutual Musicians Foundation-located in the heart of Kansas City's historic jazz district. Originally home to the Black Musicians' Protective Union Local 627 A.F. of M., the Foundation continues its grand tradition as a living tribute to the city's long and illustrious musical history. Jazz greats and popular local players alike continue to show up every weekend to play the night away just as they have since the 1930s.

Kansas City

Day 2: Enjoy breakfast at one of the local coffee shops or restaurants. A few suggestions are the Blue Bird Bistro, Succotash, Messenger. Next, make your way to Union Station Kansas City to enjoy the ever-changing exhibits, Science City, planetarium, shops, and grab a bite for lunch at either Harvey's Restaurant or Pierpont's. After lunch, learn a little bit about Kansas City's gangster history and how the city got its nickname: "Paris of the Plains." Gangster Tour highlights infamous crimes like the Union Station Massacre, shows the locations of speakeasies and gambling halls and explains how liquor flowed freely during Prohibition. The homes and workplaces of crime bosses and the sites of major turf wars are also featured on the tour.

Sounds like an "offer you can't refuse." After the gangster tour, head to J. Rieger & Co. to learn about the distillery's history, sample Kansas City Whiskey and hop on the only known distillery slide in the world! For dinner, you can choose from many award-winning restaurants in the city's eclectic food scene. Some of the favorites are Corvino Supper Club and Tasting Room, The Town Company, or The Savoy at 21c. Close out the evening with more jazz. Visit Green Lady Lounge, an exclusive jazz lounge featuring Kansas City musicians. Other attractions you might like to explore include The National Museum of Toys and Miniatures, National World War I Museum and Memorial or The Nelson-Atkins Museum of Art.

Kansas City - Branson

Day 3: Depart early from Kansas City, arriving in Branson in the afternoon to check in at the Hilton hotel. The beautiful Hilton Promenade at Branson Landing is a 4-star hotel located on the shores of Lake Taneycomo with shops, restaurants and entertainment venues nearby. Enjoy a cocktail before dinner at Andy B's Tiki Bar overlooking the lake and then select from sixteen different restaurants. After dinner, enjoy fun activities along the famous Highway 76 in Branson. Visit the Titanic Museum, Aquarium at the Boardwalk, Branson Auto & Farm Museum or Tommy Hawks Axe Throwing. Known as the "Live Entertainment Capital of the World" and boasting







over 100 shows, you can watch a live musical production, be amazed by magicians or marvel at acrobats.

Branson

Day 4: After breakfast, depart for Dogwood Canyon Nature Park, which is located only about half an hour from Branson. Dogwood Canyon features 10,000 acres of natural beauty and rugged scenery with so much to see and do. Choose from many outdoor activities such as hiking, biking, wildlife tram tours, horseback riding and trout fishing among towering bluffs, waterfall creek beds, handcrafted bridges and native wildlife. Enjoy lunch at the Mill & Canyon Grill Restaurant surrounded by floorto-ceiling glass windows that overlook Little Indian Creek and the 120-foot-tall waterfall. Try one of the many house specialties, such as a bison burger and smoked trout cake BLT. After lunch, choose from a variety of activities. Visit Smith Creek Distillery for a moonshine tasting. Soar over Lake Taneycomo on Parakeet Pete's Waterfront Zipline. Marvel at artifacts recovered from under the sea at the Shipwrecked Treasure Museum. Take an adrenaline ride-and get a little wet-aboard Branson Jet Boats. The light and water show on Branson Landing is highly recommended.

Experience a celebrity chef's awardwinning American cuisine right in the heart of Branson's waterfront at Guy Fieri's Branson Kitchen + Bar. After dinner, be entertained by Anthems of Rock at the King's Castle Theatre on Highway 76. "The Biggest Rock Party in Branson" showcases the number one hits from the most famous bands of the 20th century, including Queen, the



Head over to Ballpark Village-the newest dining and entertainment district in St. Louis. The complex offers great food, drinks and an ideal ambiance for watching sports. 





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NASHVILLE TO NEW ORLEANS

Nashville - Arrival




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MISSISSIPPI, FROM THE RIVER TO THE COAST

Memphis - Arrival - Tupelo

Day 1: Welcome to Mississippi! Begin just 20 miles south of Memphis at Tanger Outlets Southaven, located just off Interstate 55. After shopping, travel through picturesque Holly Springs. known for its historic homes, churches, and museums. Located in the foothills of Northeast Mississippi, Tupelo is a mustsee along the Natchez Trace Parkway. Live like a King in the city where the world's greatest entertainer was born in a two-room shotgun shack. Visit the hardware store where in 1946 Gladys Presley bought her son, Elvis, his first guitar, and discover lots of small-town charm along Tupelo's Elvis Driving Tour.

Tupelo - Oxford

Day 2: Head east to Oxford, which is renowned for its deep-rooted history, charm and culture. The historic Courthouse Square has been the cultural and economic hub of Oxford since the town's founding in 1837. It thrives with businesses such as Neilson's, the oldest continuously operating department store in the South, and nationally

famous independent bookstore Square Books. Oxford is a charmina college town immortalized in the writings of Nobel Prize laureate William Faulkner. Visit Rowan Oak, Faulkner's tranquil country home, where the outline of his novel, A Fable, is scribbled on the study wall. Next stop is the University of Mississippi's campus, known as "Ole Miss." The University of Mississippi and Oxford played a significant part in the American Civil Rights movement during the integration of the university. Oxford's monument and historic marker on the Mississippi Freedom Trail paint a picture of the events that took place during a challenging and significant time in American history.

Oxford - Clarksdale

Day 3: Today's journey takes us to Clarksdale where muddy waters can refer to the Mississippi River that creates the state's western border, as well as the blues singer who lived and recorded at the nearby Stovall plantation. If you follow the Mississippi Blues Trail, you will see markers for influential artists such as John Lee Hooker, Son House and Ike

Turner. Clarksdale's Delta Blues Museum houses exhibits that focus on the musical legacy that bluesmen have left for the world to enjoy. The Crossroads are where Highway 49 intersects with Highway 61, the fabled spot where legendary bluesman Robert Johnson is said to have sold his soul to the devil in exchange for unexplainable guitar talent. Ground Zero Blues Club has been named one of the "top 100 bars and nightclubs in America" and is co-owned by actor Morgan Freeman. Red's Blues Club is the real deal authentic Juke Joint and a Blues must-see.

Clarksdale - Cleveland - Indianola - Jackson

Day 4: Travel south to Cleveland, the hip little town recognized as "one of the 100 best small towns in America." Cleveland is home to a charmina downtown Main Street area complete with locally owned boutiques, cafés, restaurants, art galleries and museums. While there, visit Dockery Farms, often called the Birthplace of the Blues. Dockery Farms tells of a storied past where many blues greats lived and worked. A must-see is







the state-of-the-art GRAMMY® Museum Mississippi, the only one of its kind outside of Los Angeles. The GRAMMY® Museum covers all genres of music and tells of story of the GRAMMY and its winning artists through interactive exhibits. Continue to Indianola and visit the B.B. King Museum and Delta Interpretive Center where the life and music of the renowned musician is shared along with the rich cultural heritage of the Mississippi Delta. Your day ends in Jackson, Mississippi's "City with Soul" and state capital of Jackson tells a story that is uniquely southern and entirely American. Visit the home of celebrated author Eudora Welty and groove to the rhythms and beats of authentic blues at Hal and Mal's. Learn more about the Civil Rights Movement at the Medgar and Myrlie Home National Monument and the Mississippi Civil Rights Museum, part of the Two Mississippi Museums. Try a little retail therapy in the eclectic Fondren District with its assorted shops and eateries.

Jackson

Day 5: Spend an extra day in Jackson exploring other downtown Jackson attractions, including the old Capitol State Historical Museum, one of the country's premier examples of Greek revival public architecture, and the Mississippi Governor's Mansion, the second oldest continuously occupied

governor's residence in the U.S. A visit to the Mississippi Museum of Art is a must, as is the new Capitol. Try a little retail therapy in the eclectic Fondren District with its assorted shops and eateries. Travel 12 miles to Ridgeland, where just off the scenic Natchez Trace Parkway you can visit the Bill Waller Craft Center, home to the Craftsmen's Guild of Mississippi.

Jackson - Vicksburg

Day 6: Head east and immerse yourself in American history, Mississippi music, and southern charm in Vicksburg, the Key to the South. President Abraham Lincoln stated that Vicksburg was the "key to winning the war" and that the Civil War would not end until the "key" was in his pocket. The Vicksburg National Military Park stands in commemoration of the campaign for Vicksburg and to those who served as well as to thousands who lost their lives. Today Vicksburg is alive with music, arts, and entertainment. Stroll the brickpaved streets of historic downtown to enjoy a meal or fun shopping.

Vicksburg - Natchez

Day 7: Small town allure and over three centuries of rich history collide on the banks of the Mississippi River in Natchez. Natchez has one of the largest collections of historic buildings in the country, many of which are open daily for tours. Visitors can explore this history along Natchez's

five downtown walking trails or hop on a bus tour for a unique look at the historic homes and landmarks. Discover the stories at the Natchez Museum of African American History & Culture and sites like Forks of the Road or the Rhythm Night Club. Sip a beverage on the porch of an old Mississippi River tavern as you watch the sun set on Old Man River.



Each coastal community across the region has something different to offer: from scenic harbor towns and walkable downtown areas shaded with live oaks, to world-renowned shows and casino headliner entertainment.

New Orleans - Arrival

Day 1: On arrival, pick up your car, drive to your hotel and get ready to explore one of the most exciting cities in the world. Head to Jackson Square, which is also nestled in the center of the French Quarter. Known as one of New Orleans' most recognizable landmarks, this 2.5-acre space boasts unique shops, art galleries, and the local artists and musicians that cascade the fences of the Place d'Armes. Must-see venues include the Cabildo, the Presbytère, and St. Louis Cathedral. After, discover the different areas of New Orleans such as the Garden District, St. Louis Cemetery No. 1, the National World War II Museum, Tremé, or Magazine Street. For dinner, try one of the many New Orleans' signature restaurants. Any of New Orleans' restaurants are guaranteed to offer the best of savory Creole, Cajun, or seafood dishes that will satisfy your hunger. After dinner, take a taxi to Frenchmen Street for music and cocktails. Frenchman Street has various musical venues featuring anything from

rock to reggae and traditional jazz to Latin. Also, be sure to check out the Frenchmen Art Market, open at night.

New Orleans

Day 2: First, enjoy a traditional New Orleans style breakfast with beignets and café au lait. Afterwards, take a walking tour or a bus tour through the famous streets of the Garden District. The neighborhood is known for its variety of historic homes, from colorful row houses to Classic Revival mansions and charming cottages shadowed by giant oak trees. Nearby Magazine Street offers great shops, restaurants and bars. Next, see where Mardi Gras is made with a tour of Mardi Gras World. More than 80 percent of the floats that journey down New Orleans' streets during the Carnival season are designed and built here. Learn about the many traditions surrounding Mardi Gras parades, balls and music, as well as the intricacies of float designing and building. Don't leave without trying a

piece of king cake! A must-see for history lovers and all patriots, The National WWII Museum is the next stop on the list. Powerful images and extraordinary artifacts bring to life the American Spirit, the courage, teamwork, and sacrifice of the young men and women who won the war and changed the world. Wind down your time in the Crescent City with an authentic Cajun dinner and finish the evening in true New Orleans style with a cocktail and some live jazz music at The Davenport Lounge or The Jazz Playhouse, and always remember to let the good times roll!

New Orleans - LaPlace

Day 3: Head west to Louisiana's River Parishes, an area from the outskirts of New Orleans to the outskirts of the Baton Rouge area. Influences from Germans, Acadians, French, Spanish, Native Americans and enslaved Africans blend together to create a regional culture-unique even to Louisiana. Explore 10 historic plantations and eat







your fill of andouille sausage. Explore the outdoors with a swamp tour, or zip line over the Maurepas Swamp. End your day with dinner at one of the area's local authentic restaurants.

LaPlace - Baton Rouge

Day 4: Head to Baton Rouge to explore the history and charm of Louisiana's Capital city. Stop at the Rural Life Museum for a glimpse into Louisiana culture of the 18th and 19th centuries. Stop downtown for lunch before touring the Old and New State Capitols. Head over to Mid-city for some shopping and dinner at one of Mid-City's restaurants. Before heading back to your hotel, tour Oxbow Rum Distillery and enjoy live music at Teddy's Juke Joint.

Baton Rouge - Lafayette

Day 5: Continue west and then head south to Avery Island, home to Tabasco headquarters. Tour the Tabasco museum and plant before heading to Lafayette, the heart of Cajun Country. Stop at Vermilionville and tour a living history museum and learn about the Acadian. Creole, and Native American cultures from 1765-1890. Head to Downtown Lafayette for lunch. After lunch, head to Parc Sans Souci for a photo op with downtown's famous LAFAYETTE sign. Visit one of Downtown Lafayette's

many unique shops offering a variety of clothing and furniture. Visit the Cathedral of St. John the Evangelist to see a 450-year-old oak tree, then have a sweet treat at the last Borden's Ice Cream Parlor in the world. Finish up with music at one of Downtown Lafayette's venues.

Lafayette - Lake Charles

Day 6: Head west to Lake Charles and drive down the Creole Nature Trail All-American Road. Alligators, over 400 bird species, marshlands teeming with life, 26 miles of natural Gulf of Mexico beaches, fishing, crabbing, Cajun culture and more can be experienced as you travel the Creole Nature Trail All-American Road. One of only 57 so designated scenic byways in the USA, and affectionately known as Louisiana's Outback, the Creole Nature Trail is a journey into one of America's "Last Great Wildernesses." Learn about alligators at Gator Chateau - A Rescue, Educate, Release program which fosters orphaned baby alligators until they are able to be released back into their natural habitat. Docents will educate you in all things alligator. If time permits, enjoy hands-on outdoor adventure at Sam Houston Jones State Park with kayaking or paddleboarding provided by Lake Area Adventure. Sam Houston Jones State Park has over 1.000 acres of lakes, trees, and rivers. The area




Lake Charles

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FAMOUS FACES & SCENIC PLACES - OKLAHOMA, ARKANSAS **AND MEMPHIS**

Dallas/Grapevine Arrival

Day 1: Upon arrival at Dallas/Ft. Worth Airport (DFW), pick up your rental car and drive the short distance to Grapevine. Head to Grapevine Main Station, offering seven different international kitchens or get in some shopping time at Grapevine Mills mall, with over 180 shops or Bass Pro Shops Outdoor World, to get any items that the modern-day Cowboy may need. Enjoy dinner in Grapevine's Historic Main Street District, followed by live entertainment at local restaurants and winery tasting rooms throughout.

Grapevine - Oklahoma City

Day 2: Head north to Oklahoma. Upon arrival into Oklahoma City, your day continues with a visit to the National Cowboy and Western Heritage Museum. From fine art, pop culture and halls of fame to Native American objects, historical cowboy gear, shopping and dining, the figure of the cowboy tells America's Western story at this unique museum. Make a stop at the Oklahoma City National Memorial and Museum, one of the city's most notable destinations. This memorial and museum stands as a celebrated example of a

living monument to honor those who were killed, those who survived and those changed forever by the April 19, 1995, bombing of the Alfred P. Murrah Federal Building. Head on over to the Bricktown District and stop in at the American Banjo Museum. Here you will find the largest collection of banjos on public display in the world, as the nation's only museum dedicated to America's instrument. Take a fun ride through Oklahoma City's Bricktown Entertainment District with Bricktown Water Taxi. During the water taxi rides, guests will learn history about the Oklahoma City buildings they pass, as well as fun facts along the one-mile canal. Enjoy dinner in the district and check out the local bars after.

Oklahoma City - Tulsa

Day 3: Today's journey takes you to Tulsa, Oklahoma, Located on the Arkansas River Tulsa is known for a variety of bustling urban districts, exceptional dining, and unsurpassed love of the arts and one of the largest collections of art deco architecture in the nation. Route 66 related iconic photo stops include Buck Atoms Space Cowboy, the Golden Driller, Praying Hands, East Meets West symbolic halfway point, and Neon Park at Centennial Plaza. Must-see attractions in Tulsa include the Bob Dylan Center, Woody Guthrie Center, the Church Studio, Greenwood Rising, Philbrook Museum and Gardens, and the Gathering Place.

Tulsa - Bentonville

Day 4: Heading East you'll reach the Ozark Mountain city of Bentonville, Arkansas - The Natural State. Bentonville is the home of Walmart and located on its charming town square you'll find a small museum charting the company's history and that of its charismatic founder - Sam Walton as well as classic candy, period music and more; reliving the dime store era of original Walton's 5&10. Crystal Bridges Museum of American Art is located a short walk from the downtown square and spans 200,000 sq ft of gallery space, home to over 500 pieces of early to present day American art. Further explore the downtown Square filled with history, local shopping and unique dining experiences.







Bentonville - Fort Smith

Day 5: After breakfast and a final stroll to take in the city's charms, you will drive south to the former frontier town of Fort Smith. Upon arrival, visit the monuments of William O. Darby, founder and hero of the famous Darby Rangers in World War II: Bass Reeves, the first African American to ride as a U. S. Deputy Marshal west of the Mississippi River, and Judge Isaac C. Parker at Gateway Park, all located in Downtown Fort Smith. Next stop, the Fort Smith Museum of History. From its founding in 1817 to the present day, the remarkable stories of the roaring frontier city of Fort Smith are told in fascinating exhibits on two floors. Just outside of Fort Smith is the Chaffee Barbershop Museum at Chaffee Crossing, the Barber Shop where Elvis Presley got the "Buzz Cut that was heard around the World" on March 25, 1958, as he was inducted into the United States Army. Complete with the original barber pole, you will see footage of the event and included in the exhibits is a letter written to President Dwight D. Eisenhower by three teenage girls, pleading with the President that Presley's hair not be cut!

Fort Smith - Hot Springs

Day 6: Further South into Arkansas, you'll reach the elegant spa town of Hot Springs. Located in the beautiful Ouachita Mountains, Hot Springs is known for its thermal waters, eight of which form the Hot Springs National Park. At the visitors center you can learn about the history of Bathhouse Row and downtown, including the period in the early 20th century when the city played host to some of America's most famous gangsters. Highlights of Bathhouse

Row include: The Buckstaff Bathhouse. a traditional thermal water bathhouse that also offers massages, manicures, pedicures and facials to further enhance your experience. Quapaw Baths and Spa - built in the Spanish Colonial Revival style and named for a local Native American tribe. Quapaw offers thermal spas, a natural steam cave and a large variety of treatments. Superior Bathhouse Brewery is home to the only brewery within a U.S. National Park, and the only brewery in the world to utilize thermal spring water as a main ingredient.

Hot Springs - Little Rock

Day 7: Less than an hour's drive from Hot Springs lays Little Rock, the state capital and largest city in Arkansas. First stop in Little Rock is the William J. Clinton Presidential Center and Park. Walk in the footsteps of our 42nd president as you explore the Clinton Presidential Center and Park and see how his presidency was shaped by the Civil Rights Act of 1964. See if you can spot his iconic saxophone on display! Pay a visit to Rocktown Distillery and take in one of their fascinating tasting tours to learn how grain (corn, wheat and rye), can turn into bourbon, vodka or gin. This award-winning distillery uses grains grown not more than 125-miles from the distillery. After dinner, explore the River Market District for a night on the town with music. The Rev Room is one of Little Rock's best places for live music offering a variety of entertainment options and music genres. Stickyz Rock and Roll Chicken Shack, showcases the best national and international touring bands, unique and funky vibe, and award-winning chicken fingers with

warm buttermilk biscuits. Or enjoy a spirited sing-along with dueling pianos at Willy D's Piano Bar.

Little Rock - Memphis

Day 8: After breakfast, visit the Little Rock Central High School National Historic Site, the nation's only high school that operates within a national park. Here you will see the role the Little Rock Nine played in the desegregation of America's public schools. Depart Little Rock for Wilson and plan a stop to White's Mercantile, also known as "A general store for the modern tastemaker." White's Mercantile is the brainchild of singer-songwriter Holly Williams (Hank William's Granddaughter), and named after William's maternal grandparents, Warren and June White, who owned a mercantile in Mer Rouge, Louisiana in the late 1800s. White's Mercantile, "it's your one-stop shop for well, everything." From here continue to Dyess, Arkansas just a short ride away. In Dyess, visit Johnny Cash's boyhood home where you will learn about the Dyess colony. The Cash family was given 20-acres of fertile delta bottomland and a five-room house in 1935 as part of the New Deal social experiment. Today, this visitor center has exhibits on the colony and illustrates the impact that growing up in Dyess had on Johnny Cash and his music. Depart Dyess for Memphis. Explore the birthplace of the blues by taking in a performance in one of the entertaining Beale Street blues bars.

Memphis - Departure

Day 9: Return your car at the airport before your departure flight.

You'll be in awe as you explore the coastline and beaches of Prince Edward Island National Park, uncovering a vibrant lobster fishing harbour in North Rustico along the way. Tonight, sit back and watch as the story of Anne & Gilbert comes alive in the musical at the Florence Simmons Performance Hall.

Charlottetown

Day 4: Discover an insider's view of Island life along the eastern touring region of Prince Edward Island. Climb to the top of the Point Prim Lighthouse, PEI's oldest lighthouse. Take a step back in time at Orwell Corner Historic Village or Roma at Three Rivers. Tour an Island winery or relax at one of 50 beaches.

Charlottetown - Summerside

Day 5: Pack your beach bag and enjoy the day relaxing along Prince Edward

Island National Park at Brackley Beach. You'll want to have your camera near for a photo at nearby Covehead Lighthouse, or maybe a stroll throughout the Robinson's Island trail system. Grab a local craft brew and a delicious meal at Evermore Brewing and do not forget to stop for a homemade ice cream at Holman's Ice Cream Parlor. Tonight, take in a performance at

the Harbourfront Theatre or visit the College of Piping and Celtic Performing Arts for a unique experience.

Summerside



Halifax - Arrival

While you're there tour the Halifax Public Gardens, a rare example of a formal Victorian garden. Get a taste for Halifax at one of the local restaurants or food vendors. Spend the evening exploring the nightlife of Argyle Street. You'll find no shortage of evening entertainment. Grab a drink at one of the unique cocktail bars, take in a bit of live music at one of the many pubs, or get a taste for the Halifax craft beer scene at one of the breweries.

Halifax - Lunenburg

Day 2: Depart for the South Shore and be sure to stop at the iconic Peggy's Cove Lighthouse. Wander the working

fishing village of Peggy's Cove where you can visit one of several gift shops, get a taste for the local seafood and snap a photo of one of the world's most photographed lighthouses. Visit the seafaring town of Lunenburg, a UNESCO World Heritage Site, with its colourful waterfront, narrow streets and captivating architecture. Old Town Lunenburg is home to Nova Scotia's famous racing schooner, Bluenose II. While in Lunenburg be sure to visit Ironworks Distillery and Fisheries Museum of the Atlantic or join Lunenburg Walking Tours for an insider's perspective of the town. Lunenburg is filled with fresh seafood that can be found at some of the best restaurants in the province: Salt Shaker Deli, The Old Fish Factory, The Grand Banker Bar & Grill, The Half Shell and many more.

Lunenburg - Yarmouth

Day 3: Explore the rugged landscape and take in the breathtaking views and sunsets at Cape Forchu Lighthouse. Take part in a Living Wharves





demonstration to learn how to splice rope, hear fishing tales and ask questions to real fishermen.

Yarmouth - Digby

Day 4: Make your way to Kejimkujik National Park and National Historic Site, offering visitors the opportunity to hike one of the 14 trails through woodlands and alona waterways or to canoe one of the waterways used by the indigenous Mi'kmag. When the sun sets, visit the Sky Circle and gaze at brilliant celestial bodies through an on-site telescope, binoculars, or with the naked eye. Alternatively, drive along the Digby Neck for whale watching on the Bay of Fundy! This is Nova Scotia's premier eco-tourism destination.

Digby - Wolfville

Day 5: Visit the charming little village of Hall's Harbour, home to the "Lobster in the Rough" dining experience. Begin your Annapolis Valley adventure in Grand Pre, home of Grand Pré National Historic Site, one of three UNESCO World Heritage Sites in Nova Scotia - once the epicentre of Acadian culture and now the most significant memorial to their tragic upheaval. Explore Nova Scotia's Wine Country. Wolfville is perfectly nestled amongst the majority of Nova Scotia wineries here in the Annapolis Valley.

Wolfville - New Glasgow

Day 6: Come and walk, play and explore on the ocean floor at Burntcoat Head

Park, home of the world's highest recorded tides. 160 billion tonnes of water flow daily into the Minas Basin every 13 hours which is more than the combined flow of the world's freshwater rivers! Experience the one-of-a-kind outdoor adventure, Tidal Bore Rafting! Nowhere else in the world can you find this kind of experience! Make your way towards Cape Breton Island, en route spend a night in the area of Pictou or New Glasgow.

New Glasgow - Ingonish

Day 7: Follow the Cabot Trail through the Cape Breton Highlands National Park. Check in at the Parks Canada Visitor Centre in Cheticamp. The park offers 26 hiking trails (from easy strolls to strenuous climbs), camping, golf, cycling, wildlife, beaches, look-offs, and guided activities. Hike one of the park's most popular trails, Skyline Trail. The trail will lead you out to the top of a mountain headland to one of the most spectacular panoramic views in the province that overlooks the Cabot Trail and the ocean. Get out and stretch your legs at the numerous look off points along the trail. Jump on board a whale watching tour departing from the Pleasant Bay Wharf. Summer and fall are the best times to go whale watching in Nova Scotia.

Ingonish - Sydney

Day 8: Popular stops near Ingonish include: Black Brook Beach, Green Cove, and the Franey Trail only to name a few. Stop by one of the small cafes or bakeries to enjoy a freshly baked pastry and coffee as you take in the fresh salt air. Discover the Alexander Graham Bell National Historic Site. home to the world's largest collection of Bell's inventions and artifacts, including replicas of the first telephone and a full-scale model of the HD-4 hydrofoil watercraft. Explore the Bras d'Or lakes by water on a boat or kayaking tour.

Sydney - Liscomb Mills

Day 9: Rub shoulders with history at the Fortress of Louisbourg National Historic Site. Step through Louisbourg's fortress walls and time-warp back to the 1700s. Enjoy a traditional 18th-century lunch on site where costumed staff in period restaurants prepare and serve delicious food and beverages based on 18thcentury tradition and recipes. Make your way to Liscomb to spend the night. Take a relaxing pontoon boat ride along the Liscomb River channel taking you into the open waters of the Atlantic Ocean with Marina Supervisor and Captain, Chester. Visit the resort restaurant for a true Maritime meal with a view of the Liscomb River and the rugged Eastern Shore landscape.

WONDERS OF ATLANTIC CANADA - NEWFOUNDLAND & LABRADOR

St. John's - Arrival

Day 1: Welcome to Newfoundland and Labrador where wildlife and breathtaking scenery awaits you. Get settled into the Sandman Signature St. John's Hotel and spend the evening getting acquainted with your surroundings.

St. John's

Day 2: Kick off the day and explore all that the port city of St. John's has to offer. Visit the most easterly point in North America at Cape Spear Lighthouse National Historic Site, then visit downtown St. John's. Stop for lunch at one of the many cafes and pubs in the area. Stroll along two of the oldest

streets in North America, Duckworth Street and Water Street, and visit the shops and galleries that line them. At nearby Quidi Vidi Village check out Quidi Vidi Brewery, notable for their Iceberg beer (made with real icebergs), and head to the Quidi Vidi Village Artisan Studios, a collection of small studios highlighting emerging local artists. Downtown St. John's is also known for points of interest such as Jellybean Row, the Rooms, home of Provincial Museum, Archives and Art Gallery and the Terry Fox Memorial. Don't forget to stop at the Johnson Geo Centre and Signal Hill National Historic Site to take in the colorful views and iconic photo opportunity of St. John's.





St. John's

Day 3: Visit the Irish Loop region just south of St. John's where you can experience Lighthouse Picnics, Ferryland and take a boat tour to the Witless Bay Ecological Reserve to see humpback whales and nesting seabirds. Travel to Ferryland (1 hour south of St. John's) and take short 40-minute hike to Ferryland Lighthouse and enjoy a gourmet picnic from Lighthouse Picnics. Watch for humpback whales from the coastline as you enjoy your picnic. Be sure to also visit the Colony of Avalon, Ferryland established in 1621 by Sir George Calvert (the First Lord Baltimore). Depart Ferryland for Bay Bulls and take a local boat tour to the Witless Bay Ecological Reserve to see whales, Atlantic puffins, and other seabirds. Marvel at marine wildlife up-close on this cruise through the Witless Bay Ecological Reserve. The reserve is home to over 2.5 million seabirds and one of the largest populations of whales in the North Atlantic. Aboard a spacious catamaran with ample viewing areas, admire icebergs and watch for puffins, whales, razorbills, black legged kittiwakes, and more (wildlife attractions vary with the

time of year). Hear live commentary from crew and naturalists on board about Newfoundland's heritage as you travel to Iceberg Alley.

St. John's - Clarenville

Day 4: If you enjoy nature viewing you will want to visit Cape St. Mary's Ecological Reserve to view the northern gannets that nest on a 200 ft sea stack, located on the south-west coast of the Avalon Peninsula near St. Bride's. Stand a mere 20 metres from Bird Rock at the Cape St. Mary's Ecological Reserve, one of the most accessible seabird nesting sites in the world. If you like history, Castle Hill National Historic Site is well worth the scenic drive. This site consists of the remains of French and British fortifications and outworks from the late 17th to the early 19th centuries that sits on the top of a peninsula, high above Placentia, Newfoundland offering fantastic views. Depart Placentia for Clarenville.

Clarenville - Gander

Day 5: Depart Clarenville for Gander. North of Gander Twillingate offers

stunningly rugged coastline, historical, picturesque streets, and lush countryside roads. In the waters off the coast, look for whales, dolphins, harp seals, seabirds, and - if the season is right icebergs. Twillingate is one of the stops along Iceberg Alley, and best places to view all these sights is at Long Point Lighthouse, which looks out over the distant reaches of Notre Dame Bay. Take a boat expedition and witness whales breaching and playing.

Gander - Corner Brook

Day 6: Depart from Gander for Gros Morne National Park. Take in the beautiful scenery as you journey through Newfoundland and Labrador and making your way to a Canadian treasure. Gros Morne National Park, a UNESCO World Heritage Site. Option: Stop in King's Point and tour the sites there.

WONDERS OF ATLANTIC CANADA - NEW BRUNSWICK

Saint John - Arrival

Day 1: Canada's oldest incorporated city (1785) and the only city on the Bay of Fundy, Saint John has a Loyalist heritage that goes back centuries. Today, Saint John is a popular portof-call on many of the Canada-New England cruise itineraries. With the Bay of Fundy at its doorsteps, Saint John is a vibrant port city full of urban adventure on the edge of nature. The Reversing Falls is where water runs backwards twice a day, and no one blinks an eye. Where the most powerful tug-of-war on earth takes place in the heart of the city thanks to a geological hip-check of South America and Africa, and is now recognized as Stonehammer UNESCO Global Geopark.

Saint John - St. Andrews

Day 2: Visit Saint John City Market, in operation since 1876 and built by shipbuilders. Its unique design - an upside-down ship's hull, has no center pillars or posts to hold up the roof. Nowhere else in Saint John can you

experience a traditional "farmers market" while shopping for such a wide selection of goods and services, ranging from dulse to hand-made local crafts, and enjoy a delicious meal from one of the numerous restaurants, featuring local and international foods. Visit the Area 506 Waterfront Container Village or take part in a historic walking tour of Uptown Saint John. Visit the Town of St. Andrews National Historic District. St. Andrews is a premier heritage seaside resort and is one of a select few National Historic Districts in Canada. Founded in 1783 by United Empire Loyalists from the U.S. state of Maine, St. Andrews is home to more than 140 heritage buildings, including five National Historic Sites: St. Andrews Blockhouse (1812), Minister's Island (1786), Greenock Church (1824), Charlotte County Courthouse (1840), Charlotte County Gaol (1832), and just a few kilometres up the St. Croix River you'll find the international historic site of Saint Croix Island, which history dates back to 1604. St. Andrews is exceptional





among Canadian towns in having an unusually large number of heritage buildings, some dating back as far as 230 years. Old-world charm in the 21st century awaits family, friends and visitors year-round in St. Andrews.

St. Andrews

Day 3: Experience a whale watching tour with Quoddy Link Marine. Awe-inspiring wildlife experiences in New Brunswick introduce visitors to whales, shorebirds, inland birds and other amazing species of wild animals.

St. Andrews - Fredericton

Day 4: The city of Fredericton, New Brunswick's Riverside Capital. Relax with locals over a craft beer on a lively patio; dive into the rich history on display throughout the city; catch a show at the theatre; explore gorgeous parks by land or water. In Fredericton, the urban comes with a delightful side of nature. Built along both sides of the meandering Saint John River, Fredericton has a special connection to the water. 'The Green' is a long park hugging the banks of the river, and locals value it for the breath of fresh air it provides in the heart of the city. Kayaking, rowing, canoeing, and stand-up paddleboarding are common pastimes. Plus, beaches, golf courses, gardens and trails combine to make Fredericton a very active, outdoor city. History lives loud here. Museums, heritage sites, large old

Victorian homes, the historic Garrison District, and the legislative assembly create a connection to bygone days that flavours any explorer's experience. Enjoy it as you discover new restaurants, city markets, and of course, a few of the city's microbreweries - the highest concentration of craft breweries and tasting experiences in the Maritimes. Culture is vibrant here, with galleries, festivals and artists' studios elevating your experience even more. Our province's capital city might just become your main event.

Fredericton - Moncton

Day 5: City of Moncton, Canada's first officially bilingual (but not the only bilingual city) voted "most polite city in Canada" is located at the geographic centre of the Canadian Maritimes. Location is everything in Moncton, with easy access to two contrasting New Brunswick coastlines - the Fundy Coastal Drive and the Acadian Coastal Drive. Stroll down Main Street, witness the tidal bore roll in from the Bay of Fundy, or discover the cool urban art that's springing up everywhere. There's a lot going on here!

Moncton - Bay Of Fundy Coast - Moncton

Day 6: New Brunswick's most famous geological feature is the Hopewell Rocks, home to the world's highest tides that rise and fall up to an incredible 48ft. (14 m)! Older than the Appalachian Mountains

and once larger than the Canadian Rocky Mountains, the red cliffs of Hopewell Rocks have been chiseled, over millions of years, by the pounding force of the Fundy tides. It's a place to pause; a place to appreciate a remarkable story interwoven through time, tide, and the intricacies of nature. These are the highest tides in the world after all, and it happens twice a day, every day of the year! At low tide, the sea retreats so far visitors can walk for miles to explore a maze of sky-high rocks that look like sculpted flowerpots. FYI: Each summer, for a 4-6-week period beginning in mid-July, 1 to 2.5 million shorebirds congregate in waves at several key locations in the upper reaches of the bay. The Bay of Fundy is their only stopover on a 2,485 mi (4,000 km) migration south and one of the best locations to see these shorebirds just happens to be at Hopewell Rocks.

Moncton - Departure

Day 7: Do you trust your own perception? Magnetic Hill, where cars simply don't roll uphill. It's impossible, right? Well, drive to the bottom of this world-famous hill, shift into neutral, and be prepared to be amazed. Your car will roll uphill in total defiance of natural law, even as your brain is telling you it's simply not possible. Is it a magnetic pull, an illusion, or a gravitational mystery? Stories about Magnetic Hill have been around since the early 1800s, and this wondrous place has been puzzling visitors for decades.


