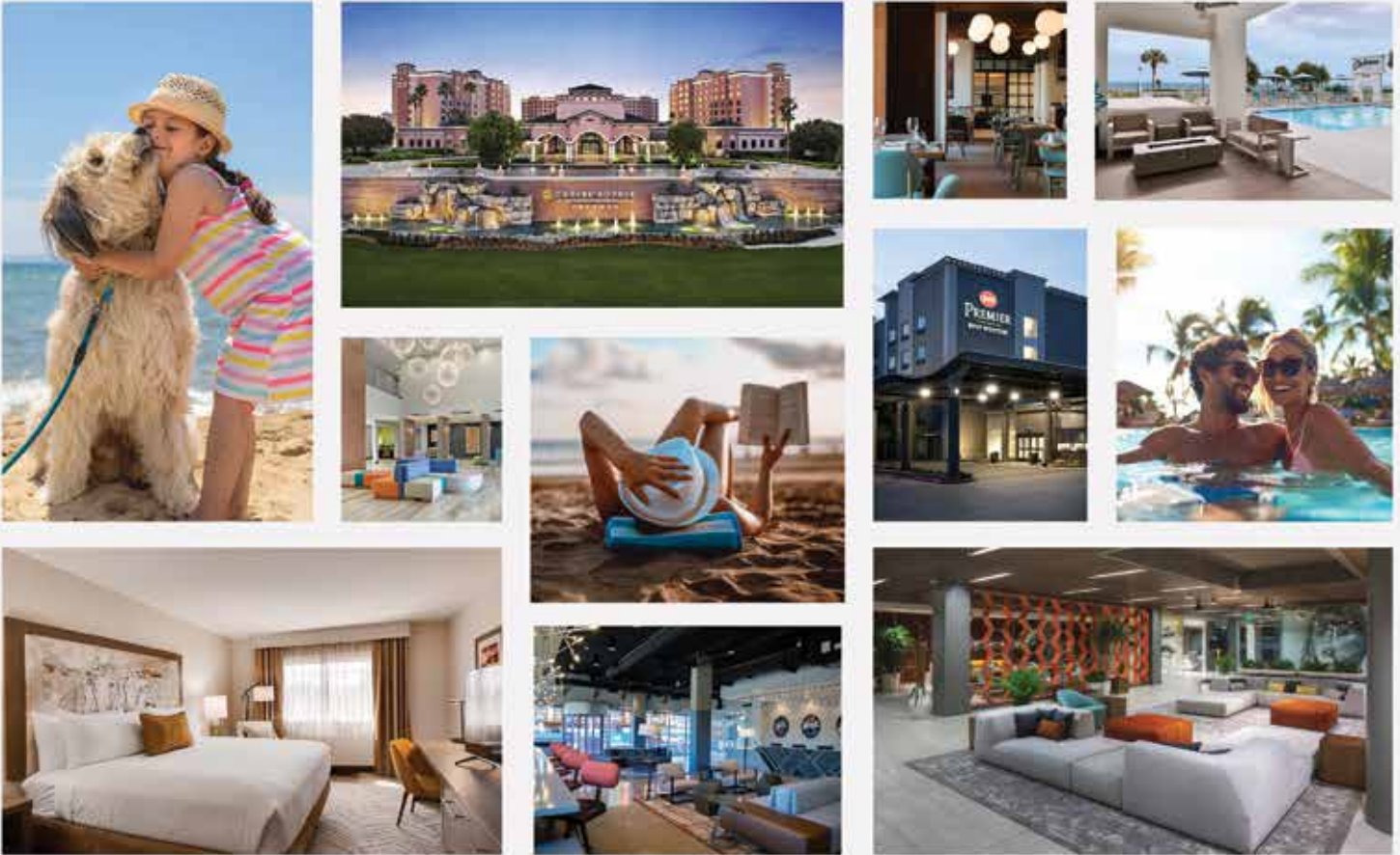

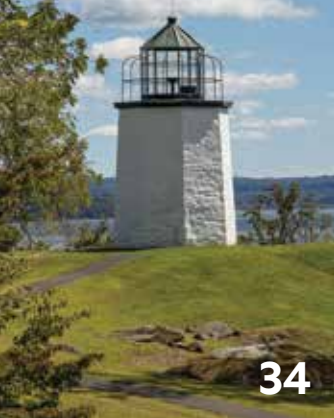

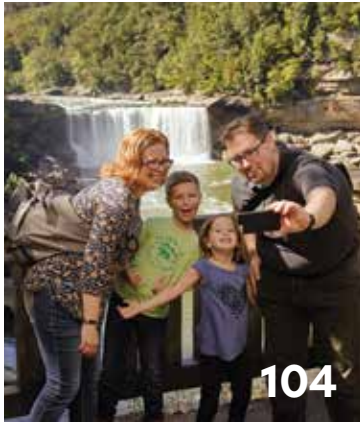

CENTENNIAL HISTORIC ROUTE 66

Chicago - Arrival

Day 1: Upon arrival at Chicago O'Hare International Airport, transfer independently to the hotel where you will meet your ATI tour director between the hours of 2 pm and 8 pm at the Hospitality/Welcome Desk. The remainder of the day is at your leisure.

Chicago

Day 2: Enjoy the included morning city tour of Chicago and see some of the most spectacular modern architecture designed by many famous architects like Mies van der Rohe, Frank Lloyd Wright, and Daniel Burnham. Experience the opulent Magnificent Mile filled with name-brand retail stores, Navy Pier, once used by the US Navy, now a point for restaurants and entertainment, Grant and Lincoln parks, home to several outdoor concerts and city gatherings, and not to forget the Cloud Gate sculpture. The afternoon is at leisure to explore many other points of interest, or book a visit through your Tour Director for the Willis Tower, an architectural river cruise, or a dinner cruise (Subject to availability)

Chicago - St. Louis

Day 3: Say farewell to Chicago, and the journey of Historic Route 66 commences. The legendary old road passes through a variety of pure Americana landscapes and takes in some of the country's biggest, oldest and most peculiar sites along the way. Begin the journey by following the traditional East-West direction of Route 66 from Chicago to St. Louis, Missouri, traveling through cornfields and flat prairies. When we arrive in St. Louis, one of the largest

cities along Route 66, you can follow in the footsteps of legendary explorers, including Lewis and Clark, at the Gateway Arch, the gate to the West and the nation's tallest monument within a National Park.

St. Louis - Springfield

Day 4: Continue through the Ozark Highlands of Southern Missouri, recognized as the birthplace of Route 66. En route, stop at the Meramec Caverns, a natural limestone cave whose formations and colors are as unique as they are beautiful. Adding to the pleasure of exploring the caves is learning that Jesse James used them as a hideout and took advantage of the underground river to escape through the "Back Door."

Springfield - Tulsa - Oklahoma City

Day 5: This morning, cut through the south-eastern corner of Kansas on your way to Oklahoma City. The Oklahoma section of Route 66 contains more drivable miles than any other state. Portion of this stretch was even used by many Oklahoman families headed west in search of better opportunities during the 1930s. The famous blue whale statue in Catoosa remains a landmark along Route 66. Once arriving in Tulsa, the Avery Route 66 memorial bridge connects the east with the west. Constructed in 1915 but closed to both vehicles and pedestrians, it gained its place on the list of National Historic Places in 1996. A brief orientation tour will commence upon arrival in Oklahoma City, the state capital of Oklahoma.

Oklahoma City - Amarillo

Day 6: Continue to Amarillo, located in the pancake flat plains of the Texas Panhandle. This area of Texas was once the buffalo-rich grasslands of the Great Plains, inhabited by the Kiowa and Comanche Native Americans. Stop at the Oklahoma Route 66 museum in Clinton, where you can experience 6 decades of Route 66 history. (admission included) Stop in Shamrock, Texas, known for the once beloved Conoco Tower Station and U-drop café, and the 1929 opened and restored Phillips 66 gas station for a photo stop in Mclean. Oil companies opened many gas stations as the need for petrol increased, as the number of travelers increased on Route 66.

Amarillo - Albuquerque

Day 7: Before leaving Amarillo, a visit to the world-famous Cadillac Ranch is a must. Here, you experience a unique display of art featuring a row of ten colorful painted Cadillac cars. Buried grill first in the ground since 1974. The Cadillacs range in production years between 1949 and 1963. This art display is now home to over 1 million visitors a year. Continue westbound and arrive in the neighboring state of New Mexico with destination Albuquerque. This city is not only the state's largest but also known as the hub for technology, the arts, and the annual International Balloon Festival.

Albuquerque - Gallup - Holbrook

Day 8: Leave Albuquerque and travel north to another spectacular Route 66 community, Gallup. Having barely changed since Route 66's heydays, this



city serves up a slice of Americana rarely seen nowadays, along with one of the best strips of Neon signs you will see anywhere on the old route. Shop one of the unique gift stores of the Southwest. When leaving Gallup, you will enter the Nation's largest Native American Reservation, home to the Navajo Nation. Living on almost 18,000 acres of land, this reservation is found in the states of Arizona, New Mexico, and Utah. This afternoon, you could experience the wonders of Canyon de Chelly, where ancestral pueblos, pictographs of the ancient past will introduce you to Navajo culture. (Optional Excursion)

Holbrook - Monument Valley - Page

Day 9: Leave Holbrook and continue your expedition through the Navajo Nation to Monument Valley. Experience the beauty of this region through a variety of Monuments, Mesas, and Buttes. This backdrop was used for many western movies with actor John Wayne, including movies like Forrest Gump and Back to the Future. Get up close to some of the monuments through the Monument Valley jeep tour (Optional excursion). Overnight in Page, AZ

Page - Grand Canyon National Park - Williams

Day 10: Before leaving Page, a visit to Antelope Canyon (optional Excursion) is scheduled and recommended to participate. Antelope Canyon is the American Southwest's most visited canyon, created through the force of water and wind erosion, leaving slot canyons and narrow pathways. This experience is not to be missed. Return to the Navajo Reservations and travel to the magnificent Grand Canyon. This region was proclaimed as a National Park in 1919 and continues to receive close to 5 million visitors annually. In

the late afternoon, you will arrive at the historic Route 66 community of Williams. You will take an unforgettable train ride (included) through the magnificent Grand Canyon National Park.

Williams - Seligman - Kingman - Las Vegas

Day 11: Depart Williams and continue via route 40 to route 66 and visit Seligman, Arizona. It was this community that lobbied to have the name changed from Route 66 to Historic Route 66 back in 1987. Many residents who had called Seligman home still live there today and always welcome visitors all year round. Continue via Kingman to the glitz and glamour of the City of Las Vegas, where mega resort hotels dot the Las Vegas Strip. From the 24-hour-a-day Casino to the large variety of shows gave this city the slogan, the entertainment capital of the world. Join your fellow travelers tonight for the orientation tour of the city, where you will be introduced to some of the hotels during this walking and driving tour. (Optional Excursion)

Las Vegas

Day 12: Enjoy this day at leisure to explore more of Las Vegas at your own pace or consult the Tour Director for the optional excursions planned for the day, including a visit to the Hoover Dam and the Dinner and Show program for tonight.

Las Vegas - Barstow/Yermo - Los Angeles

Day 13: After a leisurely morning, and before we depart Las Vegas, we will stop at the iconic Welcome To Las Vegas sign before we continue our journey through the Mojave Desert into the state of California on our way to Barstow / Yermo. Once arrived, a stop will be made at Calico Ghost Town (admission included). Once a bustling community of the 19th century during

the local silver ore rush, it fell into despair during the 1930s but was then purchased by the amusement park Knotts Berry Farm, reconstructed as it was during its peak years and then donated as a gift to San Bernardino County as an attraction. Relive the days of the Old West. In the afternoon, we arrive in Los Angeles, a metropolis of more than 18 million residents.

Los Angeles

Day 14: Enjoy a full day city tour of this mega city and visit some of the neighborhoods the city is so famous for, including downtown Los Angeles, Hollywood and the walk of fame, Farmers Market and the Grove, passing Beverly Hills on our way to the final stop of route 66, Santa Monica. Here you will have time at leisure to explore the beach, Santa Monica Pier with the famous "END OF ROUTE 66" sign. After a farewell dinner (included), your Historic Route 66 tour will end upon arrival at the LAX Hotel.

Los Angeles Departure

Day 15: Individual check out and transfer via hotel Shuttle on your own to the LAX Airport.

This itinerary is valid for departures in the 2026 season.

WEST COAST INSIDER

San Francisco - Arrival

Day 1: Arrive in San Francisco and transfer independently to your hotel where you will meet with your ATI Insider Tour Director in the evening.

San Francisco

Day 2: This morning, a fun and exciting city tour provides an overview of the city and enables you to truly appreciate many of San Francisco's most famous sights, including Chinatown, Union Square, and Fisherman's Wharf. Your tour will include a ride on one of San Francisco's historic cable cars. And for an extra thrill, consider hanging off the running board, Doris Day-style. As no visit to San Francisco would be complete without taking a cruise on the

Bay or crossing the Golden Gate Bridge, in the afternoon we collect a bike from Fisherman's wharf and pedal across the Golden Gate before boarding a ferry back across the Bay, passing the famous PIER 39 sea lions along the historic waterfront which reveals the city's spectacular skyline. Be sure to take full advantage of prime photo opportunities with unobstructed views of the Golden Gate Bridge and the notorious Alcatraz Island. This evening you may join your Tour Director for the San Francisco evening tour (optional).

San Francisco (Napa Valley or Muir Woods Optional)

Day 3: Your Tour Director is on hand to assist with making your plans for the day: perhaps another cable car ride

to Fisherman's Wharf where you may enjoy a "Taste of San Francisco": local seafood, famous sourdough breads or decadent Ghiradelli's Chocolate. Or take a stroll by Sea Lions' Marina to watch them frolic. Be sure to gaze across the bay to Alcatraz Island where "America's Most Wanted" such as Al Capone and "Machine Gun" Kelly were incarcerated. Or visit Union Square for a shopping stop at Macy's Department Store. If you would like to explore beyond the city, we recommend you embark on a wine tasting tour to Napa Valley, world renowned for its fine wineries and beautiful scenery. Or you may choose to take in the natural wonder of the Bay Area by hiking through the "enchanted" forest at nearby Muir Woods (optional).



San Francisco - Yosemite - Yosemite Gateway

Day 4: This morning we journey east toward the tranquility of California's High Sierras and Yosemite National Park's nearly 1,200 square miles of mountainous terrain. Once inside the park you will be introduced to some of Yosemite's most famous and awe-inspiring scenery, including Yosemite Falls, Half Dome, El Capitan, Tunnel View, and Bridalveil Falls. Postcard-perfect pictures abound so be sure to have your camera ready.

Yosemite Gateway - Mojave Desert - Las Vegas

Day 5: Today, travel through the Mojave Desert on your way to Las Vegas. A late afternoon arrival in the dazzling "Entertainment Capital of the World" will give you enough time to start enjoying this fantastic city right away with an exciting evening tour featuring

the famed casinos along the Strip followed by a visit to Downtown Las Vegas, where you will enjoy the glitzy lights of the Fremont Experience.

Las Vegas - Grand Canyon West - Las Vegas

Day 6: This morning we stop at the iconic Las Vegas Welcome Sign where you may wish to capture a photo memory of Las Vegas before making your way on an included day trip to the Grand Canyon's West Rim. On the way, admire the beauty of Lake Mead, the largest reservoir in the U.S. formed by the Hoover Dam. At the Grand Canyon West, you will have time to explore the views on your own and if you choose, join an optional helicopter trip over the canyon, a float on the Colorado, or walk on the Skywalk platform. This evening at leisure - your ATI Tour Director will provide recommendations that cater to your desired experience, whether it

be partaking in the stellar shopping or enjoying the countless fine dining options that Vegas has to offer.

Las Vegas - Palm Springs - San Diego

Day 7: Today your journey takes you from Las Vegas through Palm Springs, the winter playground for Hollywood royalty, with its lively downtown area and immaculately kept golf courses at the base of the rugged San Jacinto Mountains. This city in the desert was once known as the winter retreat of stars like Frank Sinatra, Jane Russell and Elvis Presley. Today it is a flourishing resort town with great shops, restaurants and year round desert climate. A sea of wind turbines mark the entrance to this desert oasis. We continue south to San Diego, a city known for its beaches, parks, and perfect climate. Enjoy the evening at leisure and perhaps visit some of the vibrant neighborhoods of San Diego.



San Diego

Day 8: Today you will explore California's second largest city with your Tour Director. The relaxed seaside surf vibes of neighborhoods such as Sunset Beach provide a quintessential California Coastal experience. During your Insider city tour of San Diego's sites, you will witness central role of the American Navy in this port city. You may choose to enjoy one of San Diego's many attractions such as Sea World or the World Famous San Diego Zoo. In the evening, we recommend checking out another of the city's bustling neighborhoods or perhaps a dinner cruise on the bay (optional).

San Diego - The OC - Los Angeles

Day 9: This morning we head north along the SoCal coast toward Orange County, or the OC, as it has come to be called by locals. Enjoy the atmosphere of cliffside Laguna Beach, with its local art galleries and vibrant surf culture. Continue onward to Los Angeles, America's second largest city, a sprawling metropolis and the home of America's entertainment industry. Enjoy an evening at leisure. Your Tour Director may suggest you explore LA's smaller neighboring city of Long Beach, with one of the largest ports in the United States is also home to a historic ocean liner, the Queen Mary, which you may choose and explore (optional).

Los Angeles

Day 10: Embark upon an extensive and entertaining insider tour of Los Angeles that will deliver a true taste of Southern California with a visit to the most popular seaside communities like Venice whose

boardwalk is famous for its Muscle Beach, and Santa Monica, home to one of California's oldest pleasure piers. You'll catch a glimpse the glitz and glamor of Beverly Hills, where you just might cross paths with a celebrity shopper or two along Rodeo Drive. Enjoy local flavors at the LA Farmer's Market before making your way to Hollywood, where you'll check out the Stars on the Walk of Fame, the celebrity hand and footprints at the Chinese Theatre, and of course the Hollywood Sign! An afternoon partaking in the thrills offered at Universal Studios (optional) is recommended.

Los Angeles - Malibu - Santa Barbara - Central Coast

Day 11: This morning you depart LA travelling through the coastal hamlet of Malibu, home to celebrities and recluses alike, this enclave is like none other in California. Continue north up Pacific Coast Highway (called PCH by locals)



to Santa Barbara, where palm-lined walkways border white sandy beaches. Known as the “American Riviera” for its similarities to the South of France, enjoy local food and wine during a lunch stop. Make sure to check out the city’s unique Spanish architecture at its beautiful City Hall before continuing to a central coast town for an overnight stay.

Central Coast - Hearst Castle - Big Sur - Monterey

Day 12: Head north along Highway 1 to one of California’s most unique destinations, Hearst Castle. Built by newspaper baron William Randolph Hearst, the eclectic collection of old-world architecture and grand gardens is situated amidst a stunning coastal landscape that will leave you in wonder. Continue up the curvy coast road through Big Sur, a cliffside retreat where viewpoints over the rugged Pacific coastline are truly unparalleled. Continue

onward over the famed “Bixby Bridge” to Monterey, California’s first capital city, where you will be able to enjoy your evening at leisure with recommendations from your Tour Director.

Monterey/Carmel - San Francisco

Day 13: This morning you will experience all that the Monterey Peninsula has to offer by visiting the quaint village of Carmel after an exhilarating journey along one of the most scenic roads in the world, 17-Mile Drive. Afterwards, take in the sights, sounds and smells of Monterey at Old Fisherman’s Wharf and explore Cannery Row’s historic waterfront district, John Steinbeck’s inspiration for his novel of the same name. You may choose to visit the world renowned Monterey Bay Aquarium where you will be able to see and even interact with local aquatic wildlife, including the Aquarium’s most famous and adorable Sea Otter residents. In

the afternoon, pass the fertile valleys of Castroville and Santa Clara en route back to where you started your unforgettable journey, San Francisco.

San Francisco - Departure

Day 14: Your West Coast Insider tour has come to an end. Transfer independently to the airport for your return flight home.

San Francisco - Arrival

Day 1: Welcome to San Francisco! The California Gold Rush of 1849 transformed this small, sleepy village into a bustling port nicknamed "City by the Bay." Its cosmopolitan flair and breathtaking view of the bay attracts visitors from all over the world. San Francisco ranks as one of America's most popular destinations for American and foreign visitors alike.

San Francisco

Williams - Route 66 Seligman - Kingman - Bullhead City

Continue to Kingman, the largest community within the region, before returning into the state of Nevada after you have crossed the Colorado River into Laughlin named after Don Laughlin, once a land and business entrepreneur, who created the city of Laughlin, NV. Explore some of the Casinos tonight or perhaps just a relaxing stroll along the Colorado River. Overnight in Bullhead City.

Bullhead City - Palm Springs - Los Angeles

Day 9: An early start will take us back into the State of California and on our way to the desert Community of Palm Springs, where celebrities had their winter retreats when they wanted to escape the hustle and bustle of their

busy Hollywood lifestyles of the 40ies through today. Palm Springs is also a community of Great classic Spanish Revival as well as Mid Century Modern architecture and great art festivals during the winter season. We continue to our last destination, Los Angeles, where an orientation tour will commence upon arrival, focusing on neighborhoods of downtown Los Angeles, Hollywood and a bit of Beverly Hills before ending at our overnight hotel.

Along the way, pass through Seligman, a town built along the famed Route 66 that looks as if it were frozen in time sixty years ago. The remainder of the day is at leisure for you to explore the dazzling Las Vegas Strip.

Las Vegas - Mojave Desert - Beverly Hills - Los Angeles

Day 16: Travel to Los Angeles through the Mojave Desert, where clusters of unique Joshua trees dot the mountainous landscape. Upon arrival in Los Angeles you will enjoy a tour through the "City of Angels" including Hollywood, Sunset Strip and parts of Beverly Hills, before reaching your hotel.

Boston - Arrival

Day 1: Welcome to Boston, the Cradle of American Liberty. Upon arrival at Logan International Airport, transfer independently to your hotel where you will meet your ATI Tour Director.

Boston - Cape Neddick Lighthouse - Kennebunkport - Portland

Atlanta

Day 2: This morning, enjoy a comprehensive city tour of Atlanta, including a visit to the boyhood home of Martin Luther King. You will also learn about another of Atlanta's most famous residents, Margaret Mitchell, who wrote the historical novel that became a masterpiece of American cinema, "Gone with the Wind." Visit the Road to Tara Museum and Stately Oaks Plantation, which was the inspiration for plantation in the film. You will have the opportunity to see memorabilia from the movie including costumes worn by the stars Clark Gable and Vivien Leigh. In the evening, enjoy a welcome reception which will give you the opportunity to meet your fellow travelers.

Atlanta - Augusta - Charleston

Day 3: Leave Atlanta today and head west to Augusta. Augusta is the second oldest city in Georgia and is home to the prestigious Masters golf tournament. In the late afternoon, you will arrive in Charleston one of the most historic and charming cities of the South. For evening

activities, you may wish to consult your Tour Director for the possibilities.

Charleston - Savannah

Founder James Oglethorpe laid out the famed city squares. The Civil War destroyed a large portion of Georgia, but Savannah was spared. Numerous buildings around the tree-shaded squares are hundreds of years old; providing the setting for the popular novel "Midnight in the Garden of Good and Evil."

Savannah - Montgomery

Day 6: Set course west across the state of Georgia and into the heart of the Deep South, Alabama. Upon arrival in Montgomery, Alabama's capital city and a central backdrop of the American Civil Rights Movement, visit the Rosa



Parks Library and Museum. Learn about the Montgomery Bus Boycott inspired by Parks, which ignited the Civil Rights movement and changed American history. You may also wish to visit the Dexter Avenue King Memorial Baptist Church, where Martin Luther King Jr. led the Boycott with his powerful sermons.

Montgomery - Selma - New Orleans

Day 7: Depart Montgomery this morning to discover Selma, Alabama, another centerpiece of the Civil Rights Movement. Visit the Edmund Pettis Bridge where the historic March from Selma to Montgomery began and where the brutal events of Bloody Sunday took place. Experience another historic site of the Civil Rights Trail, the Brown Chapel AME Church before heading south through Mississippi to New Orleans, a city immersed in Creole culture. The city today is a unique blend of Spanish, French, Caribbean, African and Anglo-Saxon influences. This is obvious in the food, architecture and of course, the music. Experience this melting pot aboard a Riverboat Dinner Cruise (optional) and enjoy the rhythms of a Dixieland jazz band.

New Orleans

Day 8: The day is yours to explore the charm and excitement of one of America's most unique cities and for you to take in the French flavor & grandeur of New Orleans. May we suggest starting the day with a visit to a working plantation (optional). Explore the French Quarter with its trademark wrought iron balconies overlooking the narrow cobblestone streets.

New Orleans - Baton Rouge - Natchez

Day 9: This morning, we will travel to the capitol of Louisiana, Baton Rouge, and conduct a brief city tour. From there, we will travel via the historic

Natchez Trace Parkway to Natchez. The parkway is a 444-mile drive through exceptional scenery and years of Native American and European history. Natchez is the oldest European settlement on the Mississippi River. Before the Civil War, wealthy plantation owners from Louisiana built magnificent Antebellum homes here because the area was considered safer from flooding. This afternoon, we will visit one of the homes and learn about the wealth of these 19th century millionaires.

Natchez - Mississippi River Valley - Memphis

Day 10: Leave Natchez and drive on to Memphis, home of 'Sun Records'. As a large river port, it was one of the most important links in the cotton trade before the Civil War. Memphis is also known as the "home of the blues." A brief city tour will take you to the city's liveliest street, Beale Street, where the blues and other types of music are played nightly in almost a dozen clubs. Travel along historic Front Street, known as Cotton Row in the days when cotton traders and merchants conducted business here. Of course, no visit to Memphis would be complete without a visit to Graceland, the home of Elvis Presley (optional).

Memphis - Nashville

Day 11: Continue on to Nashville, known as the capital of country music. The city earned its title with the very first airing of the WSM Barn Dance radio program, the forerunner of the Grand Ole Opry. The newly renovated Ryman Auditorium in downtown Nashville, once home of the Grand Ole Opry, the studios near Music Row, and Opryland itself attest to Nashville's reputation as the most important city in country music.

Nashville

Day 12: Begin your day in this dynamic and thriving cultural and state capital

of Tennessee with a morning city tour. While exploring the city's landmarks, perhaps you'll discover a new country music classic before they even hit the charts while visiting one of the many recording studios around town. Perhaps enjoy dinner and a show in the evening as a optional excursion.

Nashville - Chattanooga - Atlanta

Day 13: Leaving Music City, we head to Chattanooga, home to the famous Choo Choo and which has received national recognition for the renaissance of its beautiful downtown and redevelopment of its riverfront. In the afternoon, our trails lead us back to Atlanta where you may want to check our one of the sites you were not able to experience at the start of the tour like the Georgia Aquarium, World of Coca Cola, CNN Center.

Atlanta - Departure

After lunch (not included) you will continue northeast to St. Augustine, the nations' oldest settlement. Settled by the Spanish in 1565 it still has that old world Spanish influence today, marked by architecture and cobble stone streets and of course Castillo de San Marcos fortress.

St. Augustine - Crystal River - Clearwater / Tampa Bay

Day 5: This morning you will depart westbound and travel towards Gainesville, home of the Florida State University and named after a US Army officer Edmund Gaines who serviced during the war of 1812 and the Seminole Wars within Florida. The journey continues through the center of the state via Ocala to Crystal River. Once in Crystal River you will visit the three Sisters' Springs known



for beautiful scenery, and the springs with the most interesting color combinations. Manatees have been spotted at the Three Sisters' Springs so keep an eye out for them! (admission included) You continue along the coast to the Clearwater / Tampa Bay region and visit the beach before arriving at the hotel.

Clearwater / Tampa Bay - Sarasota - Naples

Day 6: Travel south along the coast to Sarasota. At one time home to the Ringling brothers, who became famous through their years of running a successful and popular circus. Sarasota became their favorite winter residence, followed by many others who turned the city into one of the most sought-after communities filled with fine dining and upscale boutiques. Continuing along the gulf coast, passing Ft. Myers, where both Henry Ford and Thomas Edison were among the residents in the city's past. As you approach Naples, the destination of the day, you have experienced many different beach communities along the way including Ft. Myers Beach, and Bonita Springs, where many visitors and residents alike enjoy the beach and the warm

waters of the Mexican Gulf. Enjoy a brief visit to Naples before reaching your hotel.

Naples - Everglades - Key West

Day 7: A short drive southbound will take you to the Everglades where an exciting airboat ride awaits you and where you will learn about the Everglades and its National Park. This wetland is home to many species of wildlife, including the blue Heron, Pelicans and of course the Alligator. Enjoy the airboat ride and the safari park. (Admission included). After the visit to the Everglades your adventure continues back towards Miami but then following Highway 1 south across the keys passing Key Largo, Islamorada and Marathon before reaching your overnight stop in Key West. Key West is the southernmost city in the contiguous United States and is only 90 miles away from Cuba. Attracting many visitors a year, Key West was also home to individuals like American novelist Ernest Hemingway, American Playwright and Screenwriter Tennessee Williams and the 33rd US President Harry Truman. Join your fellow group members tonight on the catamaran boat ride, " Commotion on the Ocean"

(Optional tour) to witness the beautiful sunsets Key West is known for.

Key West - Miami - Departure

Day 8: Before we journey back to Miami, enjoy a morning at leisure to explore the Key West community some more by yourself. Or take an optional Conch Train tour across the Island to learn more interesting facts. This morning is also a good opportunity for last-minute souvenir shopping before you return to Miami. The tour concludes upon arrival at the Miami Hotel at approximately 18:00 Hrs.

Food lovers can explore Scott & Joe, a specialty market known for artisan cheeses, gourmet pantry staples, and locally sourced delights. Just down the street, bibliophiles will enjoy browsing the shelves at Pickwick Bookshop, a beloved independent bookstore that has been part of Nyack's literary culture since 1945.

No visit to Nyack is complete without a stop at the Edward Hopper House Museum & Study Center, the historic family home where American realist artist

Edward Hopper was born and spent his early years. Built in 1858, the “Hopper House” showcases rotating exhibitions, early works, and the bedroom-studio where Hopper began his creative journey. As you wander the rooms and galleries, you'll see how the riverside village—and its interplay of light, color, and everyday life—shaped some of America's most iconic paintings.

Lunch With A Local Flavor

For culinary enthusiasts, the Rockland Community College Hospitality & Culinary Arts Center offers a hands-on experience with cooking demonstrations, tastings, and workshops celebrating regional Hudson Valley ingredients.

For a more casual meal, stop at The Burger Loft, a favorite local eatery serving hand-pressed burgers, crispy Idaho potato fries, and refreshing craft beverages. Its laid-back atmosphere and friendly service make it a perfect spot to recharge before continuing your afternoon adventure through Rockland County.



Afternoon: Explore Historic Haverstraw

Take a scenic drive along Route 9W to Haverstraw, one of Rockland County's most historic and culturally diverse Hudson River towns.

Once known as the "brickmaking capital of the world," Haverstraw played a major role in building New York City. Learn about that history at the Haverstraw Brick Museum, home to an extraordinary collection documenting more than two centuries of Hudson River brickmaking industry and its influence on American architecture.

Next door, satisfy your sweet tooth at Lucas Candies, a family-owned chocolatier delighting visitors since 1896. Handmade confections crafted from recipes passed down through generations can be paired with craft beer or wine in a cozy tavern setting.

A visit to Haverstraw would not be complete without stopping at the Haverstraw African American Memorial Park, a meaningful waterfront space honoring the African American workers who labored in the region's historic brickyards during the 19th and early 20th centuries. Through interpretive displays, public art, and community storytelling, the park sheds light on the resilience and impact of the African American community that helped shape Haverstraw's industrial past.

In 2024, the park welcomed a permanent sculpture of Harriet Tubman, titled

Beacon of Hope. This powerful artwork depicts Tubman reaching forward with a "generational key," symbolizing courage, freedom, and the enduring strength to shape one's own destiny. Alongside other installations, it offers visitors a reflective and inspiring experience that connects history with contemporary community spirit.

On your way out, make a stop in West Haverstraw to visit the GARNER Historic District, a beautifully preserved 19th-century industrial complex reimaged as a vibrant arts destination. Once home to one of the nation's largest textile mills, the historic brick buildings now house working artists' studios, galleries, and creative spaces. Visitors can explore rotating exhibitions, meet local artists, and wander through peaceful creekside grounds where outdoor sculptures are thoughtfully integrated into the landscape.

The GARNER Historic District isn't just a hub for art and history—it's also home to two must-visit spots for food and drink. Hudson's Mill, a modern tavern set within the historic mill building, serves locally inspired dishes, craft cocktails, and an array of beers in a warm, inviting setting that honors the space's rich history. Just steps away, Round Table Brewery offers a community-focused experience where guests can sample locally crafted beers and soak in the lively, welcoming atmosphere. Together, these destinations make the GARNER Historic District a true gathering place,

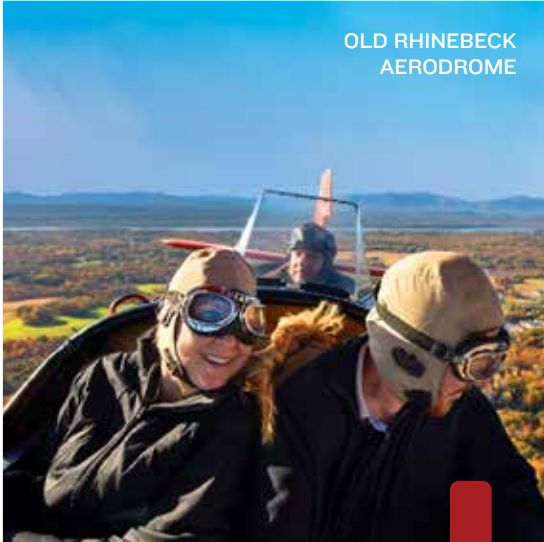

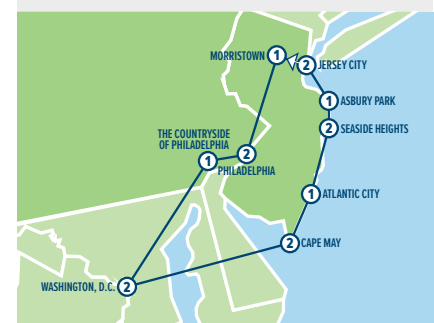

Valley Forge National Historical Park is also home to the United States National Memorial Arch, Washington's Headquarters, and Washington Memorial Chapel. These stories are brought to life in engaging living history villages, including a revolutionary war hospital and soldier's orphan school.

The Countryside of Philadelphia has some of the country's most breathtaking architectural masterpieces that are now being preserved as historic sites. In particular, the Bryn Athyn Historic District is famous for its towering Gothic-Romanesque cathedral and its castle-like building next door, the Glencairn Museum.

Three generations of Wyeth family artists and Wharton Esherick, the Dean of American Craftsmen made The Countryside of Philadelphia their muse. UTAH'S DREAM ROAD TRIP

Utah is the road trip you've been dreaming about. With amazing diverse landscapes and 28 scenic byways, there's never a dull moment. Utah is well known for its Mighty 5® National Parks: Zion, Arches, Canyonlands, Capitol Reef and Bryce Canyon. The beauty of Utah includes all that lies between these epic parks.

The state has a variety of themes that inspire the great American Road Trip. From a classic western with cowboys and vast desert landscapes to a Thelma & Louise epic. Many iconic scenes from Thelma & Louise were filmed in Utah, and you can visit these locations, such as Arches National Park and Dead Horse Point State Park. Take your time and drive the 22.5-mile scenic byway called Dead Horse Mesa Scenic Byway, where you will have views of the La Sal Mountains to the east, the Abajo Mountains to the south, the Henry Mountains to the west and the Bookcliffs to the north as you wind your way through breathtaking scenery.

Utah's All-American Road, Scenic Byway 12, has been designated thus

because of the unique features you can't find elsewhere, making it a tourist destination. This road connects Panguitch and Bryce Canyon in the west with Torrey and Capitol Reef in the northeast. Although this isn't the quickest route, it is by far the most beautiful. The whole drive can be completed in 3 hours, but that is without a stop to photograph, marvel and explore. As you proceed east from Panguitch, you'll enjoy driving through the two red arches in Red Canyon. Then, you'll be in awe as you witness the actual "stairs" in the Grand Staircase-Escalante National Monument just past Henrieville — a different sandstone color to the north and the south. Along the "Hogsback" between Escalante and Boulder, hairpin turns dare you on a road that drastically drops off from the shoulders into deep canyons below.

Take this opportunity to stop in Escalante and Boulder to eat at Hell's Backbone Grill, where the food couldn't get fresher as they grow their vegetables, fruits, herbs, flowers, and

greens, as well as Boulder-raised, grass-fed local lamb and beef. Break up your drive and hike the famed Calf Creek Falls to see a desert waterfall.

While looking for great small town stops, we recommend the town of Helper in central Utah. Looking at a map, the topography of the cliffs seems to swallow the town up in the river valley between the Western Tavaputs and Wasatch plateaus. Settled in 1881, Helper was named after the team of "helper" coal-powered steam engines that assisted freight trains up the neighboring canyon and over Soldier's Summit; the city was created because of and for the coal industry. Now a community of art, culture, history, and stories of the power of togetherness, Helper has evolved into a destination of incredible artistry, opportunity and discovery. Enjoy a great coffee at Happiness Within or a warm meal at Balanced Rock Eatery and Pub.

SALT LAKE CITY: TWO SEASONS WORTH GETTING TO KNOW

Where else can you hike through wildflower meadows in the morning, grab lunch at an award-winning downtown restaurant, and catch a live concert on an outdoor stage by evening, all without getting in a car more than twice? That's just a regular summer day in Salt Lake City.

The Wasatch Mountains rise directly above the city, and from June through August the canyons are alive with hikers, mountain bikers, and families looking for something more than a pool and a lobby bar. Trails range from easy canyon walks to serious alpine routes, and the views back down at the Salt Lake Valley never get old. When the day on the mountain is done, downtown is ready

for you. Craft breweries, rooftop bars, and a dining scene that has earned national recognition. The 9th and 9th neighborhood alone is worth an afternoon: locally owned shops, coffee spots, and restaurants tucked into one of the city's most walkable and creative districts.

Come fall, the canyons just outside the city put on one of the mountain West's best seasonal shows. Big Cottonwood and Little Cottonwood turn gold and amber from late September into October. Snowbird's aerial tram keeps running through the season, carrying visitors 2,900 vertical feet up to views that look out over rivers of yellow aspen between evergreen slopes. Back in the

city, the pace settles into something easy. Neighborhood coffee shops, harvest menus, streets that are suddenly a pleasure to wander. Fall here is the kind of discovery that turns first-time visitors into people who come back every year.

And when you're ready to go further, Salt Lake is the natural starting point. Head south toward the red rock of Arches and Zion, or north toward Yellowstone and the Grand Tetons. Most are within a day's drive, and Salt Lake's downtown hotels, restaurants, and mountain access make it a far better home base than the alternatives.

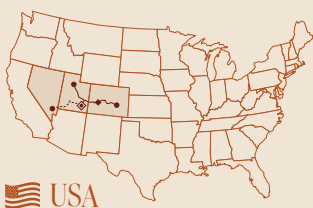

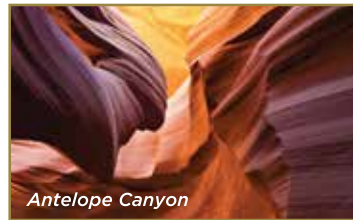

New York City - Arrival

Day 1: Arrive in New York City and settle in as the skyline rises around you. Begin in Midtown, where iconic sights cluster within walking distance. Take in Times Square's energy before heading to the Top of the Rock for sweeping views of Manhattan, Central Park, and the Empire State Building. Wander to Bryant Park and the New York Public Library for a moment of calm, then continue along Fifth Avenue before unwinding in Central Park and choosing a lively spot for dinner.

New York City

Day 2: Start downtown, where New York's history and harbor meet. Take the ferry to the Statue of Liberty, then explore Ellis Island's moving immigration exhibits. Visit the 9/11 Memorial's reflecting pools and the museum's powerful galleries. Walk the Brooklyn Bridge for skyline views, then choose dinner in the Seaport District, West Village, or along the Brooklyn waterfront, where Manhattan glitters across the river.

New York City - Washington, D.C.

Day 3: Pick up your rental car and ease out of New York through New Jersey toward Philadelphia for a midday stop at Independence Hall, the Liberty Bell, or Reading Terminal Market. Continue south through Delaware and Maryland before reaching Washington, DC, where broad avenues and glowing monuments set the tone. Spend the afternoon on the National Mall, in the Smithsonian museums, or along Georgetown's cobblestone streets.

Washington, D.C. - Roanoke

Day 4: Leave Washington as monuments give way to Virginia foothills. Enter Shenandoah National Park and drive scenic Skyline Drive, dotted with overlooks from Dickey Ridge to Spitler Knoll. Transition to the Blue Ridge Parkway for wider vistas and pastoral valleys, pausing at Humpback Rocks or Peaks of Otter for lake views beneath Sharp Top Mountain. Descend into Roanoke, crowned by the Mill Mountain Star, and dine in the lively Market District.

Roanoke - Great Smoky Mountains - Gatlinburg

Day 5: Head southwest along I-81 through the Blue Ridge as the mountains rise around you. Stop in historic Abingdon for lunch before continuing into Tennessee. Enter Great Smoky Mountains National Park at Sugarlands Visitor Center, then drive Newfound Gap Road, one of the Smokies' most scenic routes, with mountain overlooks and lush forests. End the day in Gatlinburg, a warm, lively gateway near the park's highlights.

Gatlinburg - Nashville

Day 6: Head toward I-40 West, climbing the Cumberland Plateau with sweeping views of forested hills. Stop in Cookeville for lunch, then continue as the plateau eases into rolling Middle Tennessee farmland. Arrive in Nashville by afternoon to explore vibrant neighborhoods, live-music venues, and welcoming Southern charm—a perfect contrast to the mountain landscapes of recent days.

Nashville

Day 7: Spend a full day exploring Nashville's musical legacy. Visit the Country Music Hall of Fame and RCA Studio B, then the National Museum of African American Music. Tour the historic Ryman Auditorium and wander Lower Broadway, where live bands spill into the street. End the evening with a performance or backstage tour at the iconic Grand Ole Opry.

Nashville - St. Louis

Day 8: Drive northwest through Tennessee farmland toward Kentucky. A detour through Land Between the Lakes offers forested trails before reaching Paducah, a relaxed river town for lunch. Cross into Missouri, where St. Louis rises ahead, crowned by the Gateway Arch. Ride to the top for Mississippi River views, explore historic neighborhoods, and enjoy dinner in Soulard.

St. Louis - Springfield

Day 9: Head southwest tracing historic Route 66 through small towns and rolling fields. Arrive in Springfield, birthplace of Route 66, where murals, restored neon, and museums honor the Mother Road's legacy. Visit the Route 66 Car Museum or the Wonders of Wildlife Museum & Aquarium, then stop by the original Bass Pro Shops before dinner downtown.

Springfield - Oklahoma City

Day 10: Continue southwest along Route 66, stopping at Gay Parita, a restored 1930s service station, and



Galena, whose storefronts inspired scenes in *Cars*. Enter Oklahoma as the scenery opens to prairie and big sky. Arrive in Oklahoma City and unwind with a stroll along the Bricktown Canal or classic barbecue.

Oklahoma City - Amarillo

Day 11: Travel west through plains country, stopping at Lucille's Historic Service Station and Weatherford's Stafford Air & Space Museum. Cross into Texas through Shamrock's restored Tower Station and past Groom's leaning water tower. Near Amarillo, leave your mark at Cadillac Ranch, then explore the Route 66 Historic District or dine at the iconic Big Texan.

Amarillo - Albuquerque

Day 12: Head west toward Adrian, the official Route 66 midpoint. Continue to Tucumcari for neon-lit motels and murals, then climb into the high desert through Santa Rosa and Clines Corners. Enter Albuquerque through Tijeras Canyon and explore Old Town's adobe charm or Nob Hill's mid-century glow as evening lights flicker on.

Albuquerque - Flagstaff

Day 13: Head west through New Mexico's high desert past Gallup's trading posts and Route 66 neon. Cross into Arizona for a detour through Petrified Forest National Park and the Painted Desert, where fossilized logs and layered badlands create otherworldly scenery. Stop in Winslow at the "Standin' on the Corner" landmark and Meteor Crater before arriving in Flagstaff, a lively mountain town known for its alpine climate, Route 66 downtown, and local breweries.

Flagstaff - Kingman Via Grand Canyon

Day 14: Turn north toward Grand Canyon National Park, where Mather Point, Yavapai Point, and Desert View reveal immense cliffs and the Colorado River far below. Backtrack to Williams, a classic Route 66 town, then drive west through Seligman—birthplace of Route 66's preservation movement—and Peach Springs. Stop at the Hackberry General Store before arriving in Kingman, a proud Route 66 hub of murals, museums, and classic diners.

Kingman - Barstow

Day 15: Wind over Sitgreaves Pass to Oatman, where wild burros roam the streets. Cross into California at Needles and follow old Route 66 through the Mojave Desert. Stop at Amboy's iconic Roy's Motel & Café, continue through the ghost-town remnants of Chambless and Bagdad, and pass the Bagdad Café in Newberry Springs before reaching Barstow.

Barstow - Santa Monica

Day 16: Begin at the Route 66 "Mother Road" Museum in the historic Casa del Desierto, then head toward the Pacific through Cajon Pass and into San Bernardino, where the First Original McDonald's Museum and the Wigwam Motel make for memorable stops. Follow Old Route 66 along Foothill Boulevard to Pasadena, cross the historic Colorado Street Bridge, and make a lunch stop at Grand Central Market in Downtown Los Angeles. Wind along Sunset Boulevard to Beverly Hills before arriving in Santa Monica. Walk to the pier, where a plaque marks the official end of the Mother Road, then settle in for a Pacific sunset and dinner at a waterfront restaurant.

Santa Monica

Day 17: Spend the day strolling along the beaches of Santa Monica or browsing the adjacent indoor/outdoor shops at Third Street Promenade. Enjoy beach volleyball, bike the 22 mi/35km bike path known as "The Strand", or simply relax by the ocean. Next wander along Abbott Kinney Blvd in Venice Beach, one of the hippest streets in LA, to discover trend-setting boutiques, renowned restaurants, bars, and Instagrammable street art. Or further explore L.A.'s one-of-a-kind destinations, playgrounds of the rich and famous and architectural gems to glimpse some of the glitz and glamour of the City of Angels. Check out the Hollywood Walk of Fame, TCL Chinese Theatre and the Sunset Strip, Beverly Hills and Rodeo Drive. Universal Studios Hollywood and Anaheim's original Disneyland Park are also located within easy driving distance.

Santa Monica - Departure

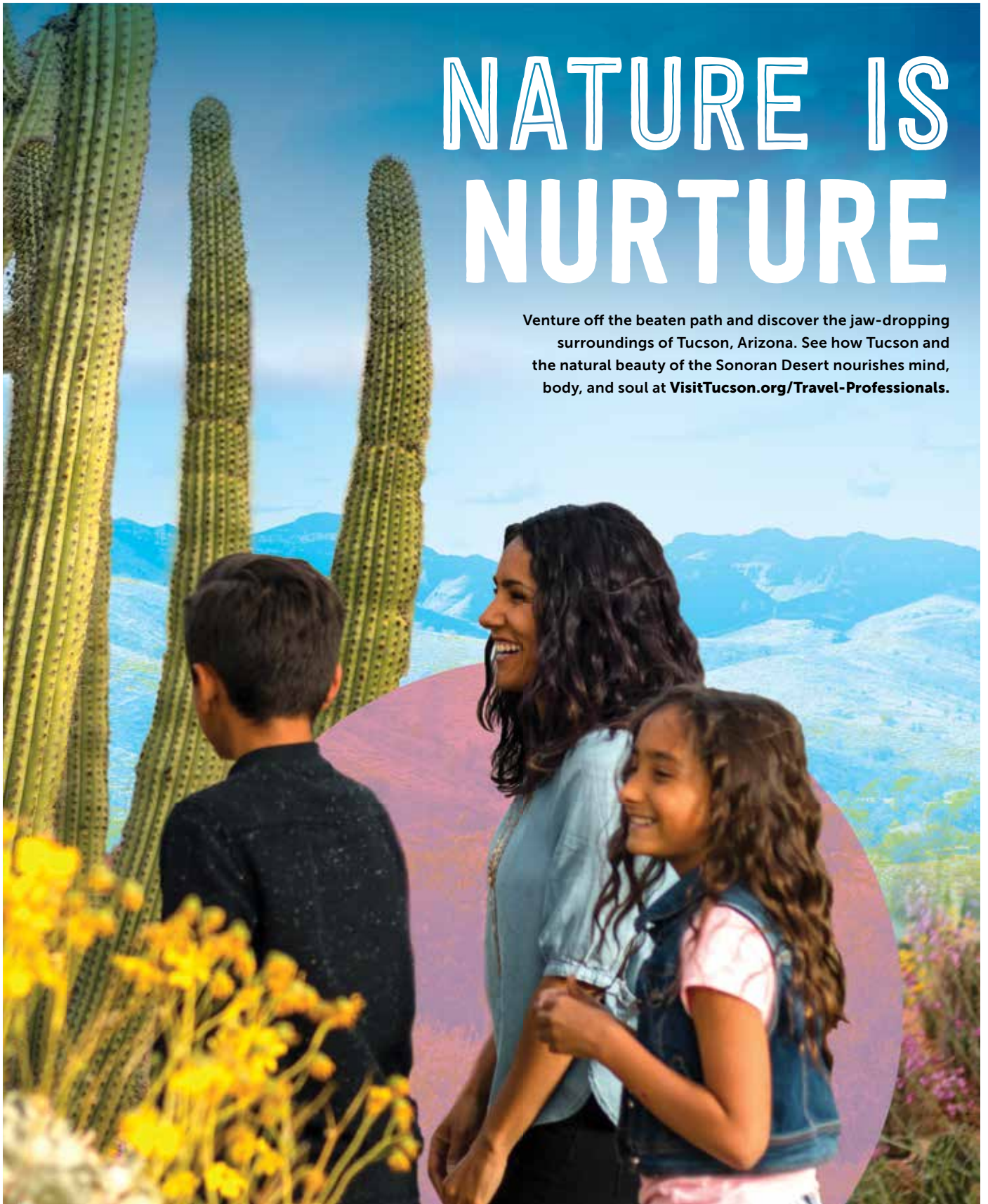

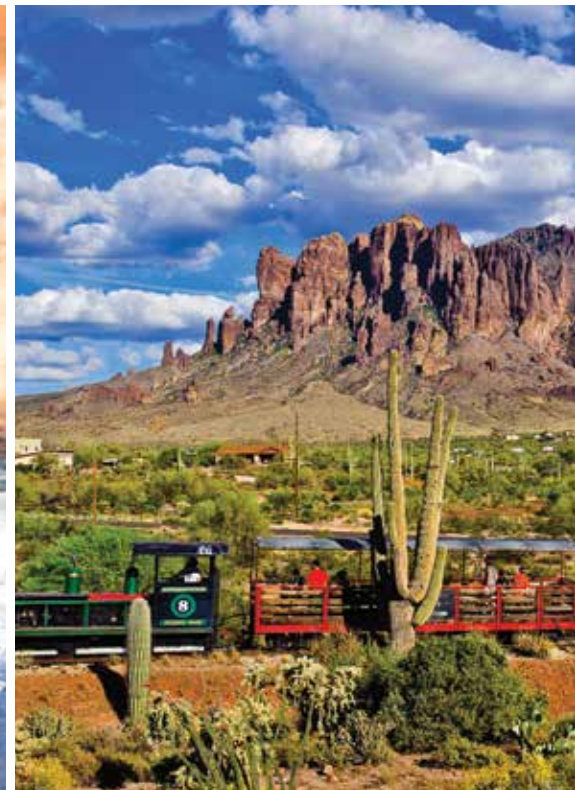

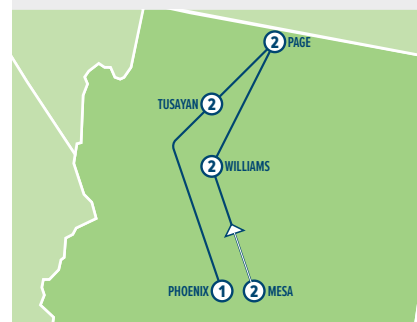

NASHVILLE TO NEW ORLEANS

Nashville - Arrival

Day 1: Upon arrival, pick up your rental car and start off your trip with a tour of Ryman Auditorium –the “Birthplace of Bluegrass.” Nashville has many places to hear bluegrass music while you are in town. Pair your musical experiences with a tour of Nelson’s Green Brier Distillery. Learn about the distillery’s German founder and taste some of the hand-crafted Tennessee whiskey.

Nashville

Attractions within walking distances of downtown Mobile hotels are GulfQuest Maritime Museum, History Museum of Mobile & Fort Conde and the Conde Charlotte Museum. Mobile

New Orleans - Arrival

Day 1: On arrival, pick up your car, drive to your hotel and get ready to explore one of the most exciting cities in the world. Head to Jackson Square, which is also nestled in the center of the French Quarter. MISSISSIPPI, FROM THE RIVER TO THE COAST

Memphis - Arrival - Tupelo

Day 1: Welcome to Mississippi! Begin just 20 miles south of Memphis at Tanger Outlets Southaven, located just off Interstate 55. After shopping, travel through picturesque Holly Springs, known for its historic homes, churches, and museums. Located in the foothills of Northeast Mississippi, Tupelo is a must-see along the Natchez Trace Parkway. Live like a King in the city where the world's greatest entertainer was born in a two-room shotgun shack. Visit the hardware store where in 1946 Gladys Presley bought her son, Elvis, his first guitar, and discover lots of small-town charm along Tupelo's Elvis Driving Tour.

Tupelo - Oxford

Day 2: Head east to Oxford, which is renowned for its deep-rooted history, charm and culture. The historic Courthouse Square has been the cultural and economic hub of Oxford since the town's founding in 1837. It thrives with businesses such as Neilson's, the oldest continuously operating department store in the South, and nationally famous independent bookstore Square Books. Oxford is a charming college town immortalized in the writings of

Nobel Prize laureate William Faulkner. Visit Rowan Oak, Faulkner's tranquil country home, where the outline of his novel, *A Fable*, is scribbled on the study wall. Oxford's monument and historic marker on the Mississippi Freedom Trail paint a picture of the events that took place during a challenging and significant time in American history.

Oxford - Clarksdale

Day 3: Today's journey takes us to Clarksdale where muddy waters can refer to the Mississippi River that creates the state's western border, as well as the blues singer who lived and recorded at the nearby Stovall plantation. If you follow the Mississippi Blues Trail, you will see markers for influential artists such as John Lee Hooker, Son House and Ike Turner. Clarksdale's Delta Blues Museum houses exhibits that focus on the musical legacy that bluesmen have left for the world to enjoy. The Crossroads are where Highway 49 intersects with

Highway 61, the fabled spot where legendary bluesman Robert Johnson is said to have sold his soul to the devil in exchange for unexplainable guitar talent. Ground Zero Blues Club has been named one of the "top 100 bars and nightclubs in America" and is co-owned by actor Morgan Freeman. Red's Blues Club is the real deal authentic Juke Joint and a Blues must-see.

Clarksdale - Cleveland - Indianola - Jackson

Day 4: Travel south to Cleveland, the hip little town recognized as "one of the 100 best small towns in America." Cleveland is home to a charming downtown Main Street area complete with locally owned boutiques, cafés, restaurants, art galleries and museums. While there, visit Dockery Farms, often called the Birthplace of the Blues. Dockery Farms tells of a storied past where many blues greats lived and worked. A must-see is the state-of-the-art GRAMMY® Museum Mississippi, the only one of its kind outside of Los Angeles. The GRAMMY® Museum covers all genres of music and tells of story of the GRAMMY and its winning artists through interactive exhibits. Continue to Indianola and



visit the B.B. King Museum and Delta Interpretive Center where the life and music of the renowned musician is shared along with the rich cultural heritage of the Mississippi Delta. Your day ends in Jackson, Mississippi's "City with Soul" and state capital of Jackson tells a story that is uniquely southern and entirely American. Visit the home of celebrated author Eudora Welty and groove to the rhythms and beats of authentic blues at Hal and Mal's. Learn more about the Civil Rights Movement at the Medgar and Myrlie Home National Monument and the Mississippi Civil Rights Museum, part of the Two Mississippi Museums. Try a little retail therapy in the eclectic Fondren District with its assorted shops and eateries.

Jackson

Day 5: Spend an extra day in Jackson exploring other downtown Jackson attractions, including the old Capitol State Historical Museum, one of the country's premier examples of Greek revival public architecture, and the Mississippi Governor's Mansion, the second oldest continuously occupied governor's residence in the U.S. A visit to the Mississippi Museum of Art is a must, as is the new Capitol. Try a little retail therapy in the eclectic Fondren District with its assorted shops and eateries. Travel 12 miles to Ridgeland, where just off the scenic Natchez Trace Parkway you can visit the Bill Waller Craft Center, home to the Craftsmen's Guild of Mississippi.

Jackson - Vicksburg

Day 6: Head east and immerse yourself in American history, Mississippi music, and southern charm in Vicksburg, the Key to the South. President Abraham Lincoln stated that Vicksburg was the "key to winning the war" and that the Civil War would not end until the "key" was in his pocket. The Vicksburg National Military Park stands in commemoration of the campaign for Vicksburg and to those who served as well as to thousands who lost their lives. Today Vicksburg is alive with music, arts, and entertainment. Stroll the brick-paved streets of historic downtown to enjoy a meal or fun shopping.

Vicksburg - Natchez

Day 7: Small town allure and over three centuries of rich history collide on the banks of the Mississippi River in Natchez. Natchez has one of the largest collections of historic buildings in the country, many of which are open daily for tours. Visitors can explore this history along Natchez's five downtown walking trails or hop on a bus tour for a unique look at the historic homes and landmarks. Discover the stories at the Natchez Museum of African American History & Culture and sites like Forks of the Road or the Rhythm Night Club. Explore the Mississippi Sound on a charter fishing boat or hop aboard the ferry to Ship Island. Visit the new state-of-the-art Mississippi Aquarium. Indulge at one of the many quaint or fine-dining restaurants serving the freshest Gulf seafood. Each coastal community across the region has something different to offer; from scenic harbor towns and walkable downtown areas shaded with live oaks, to world-renowned shows and casino headliner entertainment.

Sample bourbon at Green River Distilling Co., the westernmost point on the Kentucky Bourbon Trail®. There's also the Owensboro Museum of Fine Art and the Western Kentucky Botanical Garden. Stroll along the riverfront or splash into some fun at Smothers Park. Take in a seasonal event at the RiverPark Center. Visit Reid's Orchard for fresh produce and baked goods.

Owensboro - Louisville

Day 7: Depart for Louisville, Kentucky's largest city. Explore by taking a tour at the Kentucky Derby Museum or enjoying seasonal racing at Churchill Downs, home of the Kentucky Derby. Have a lunch cruise aboard the Belle of Louisville

MISSOURI: ICONIC SITES & LOCAL BITES

Kansas City - Arrival

Day 1: Have a late lunch at Arthur Bryant's Barbeque, the legendary "King of Ribs." The most renowned pit master in history, Bryant created a sauce that has attracted former Presidents Harry Truman and Jimmy Carter to his restaurant. Visit the sights and sounds of a uniquely American art form at the American Jazz Museum. The museum's exhibits feature talented performers who helped the genre thrive. Located in the same complex, the Negro Leagues Baseball Museum (NLBM) can't be missed. It is the world's only museum dedicated to preserving and celebrating the rich history of African American baseball and its impact on the social advancement of America. The 10,000-square-foot multimedia exhibit chronicles the history and heroes of the leagues from their founding in 1920 to their demise in the 1960s. The NLBM was recently added to the U.S. Civil Rights Trail. Some believe the integration of baseball was a catalyst for the Civil Rights Movement, proving that an individual's worth should not be determined by the color of their skin. Have dinner at Fiorella's Jack Stack Barbecue. A Kansas City tradition since 1957, Jack Stack has one of the most extensive BBQ menus in the country. After dinner, enjoy live jazz music at The Blue Room. Named after the famous 1930s Street Hotel club in the historic 18th & Vine Jazz District, the venue provides a distinctive platform to present dynamic performances from the best local and national jazz talent in an intimate setting.

In addition to The Blue Room experience, sit in on a "jam session" at The Mutual Musicians Foundation—located in the heart of Kansas City's historic jazz district. Originally home to the Black Musicians' Protective Union Local 627 A.F. of M., the Foundation continues its grand tradition as a living tribute to the city's long and illustrious musical history. Jazz greats and popular local players alike continue to show up every weekend to play the night away just as they have since the 1930s.

Kansas City

Day 2: Enjoy breakfast at one of the local coffee shops or restaurants. A few suggestions are the Blue Bird Bistro, Succotash, Messenger. Next, make your way to Union Station Kansas City to enjoy the ever-changing exhibits, Science City, planetarium, shops, and grab a bite for lunch at either Harvey's Restaurant or Pierpont's. After lunch, learn a little bit about Kansas City's gangster history and how the city got its nickname: "Paris of the Plains." Gangster Tour highlights infamous crimes like the Union Station Massacre, shows the locations of speakeasies and gambling halls and explains how liquor flowed freely during Prohibition. The homes and workplaces of crime bosses and the sites of major turf wars are also featured on the tour. Sounds like an "offer you can't refuse." After the gangster tour, head to J. Rieger & Co. to learn about the distillery's history, sample Kansas City Whiskey and hop on the only known distillery slide in

the world! For dinner, you can choose from many award-winning restaurants in the city's eclectic food scene. Some of the favorites are Corvino Supper Club and Tasting Room, The Town Company, or The Savoy at 21c. Close out the evening with more jazz. Visit Green Lady Lounge, an exclusive jazz lounge featuring Kansas City musicians. Other attractions you might like to explore include The National Museum of Toys and Miniatures, National World War I Museum and Memorial or The Nelson-Atkins Museum of Art.

Kansas City - Branson

Day 3: Depart early from Kansas City, arriving in Branson in the afternoon to check in at the Hilton hotel. The beautiful Hilton Promenade at Branson Landing is a 4-star hotel located on the shores of Lake Taneycomo with shops, restaurants and entertainment venues nearby. Enjoy a cocktail before dinner at Andy B's Tiki Bar overlooking the lake and then select from sixteen different restaurants. After dinner, enjoy fun activities along the famous Highway 76 in Branson. Branson

Choose from many outdoor activities such as hiking, biking, wildlife tram tours, horseback riding and trout fishing among towering bluffs, waterfall creek beds, handcrafted bridges and native wildlife. Enjoy lunch at the Mill & Canyon Grill Restaurant surrounded by floor-to-ceiling glass windows that overlook Little Indian Creek and the 120-foot-tall waterfall. Try one of the many house specialties, such as a bison burger and smoked trout cake BLT. After lunch, choose from a variety of activities. Visit Smith Creek Distillery for a moonshine tasting. Soar over Lake Taneycomo on Parakeet Pete's Waterfront Zipline. Marvel at artifacts recovered from under the sea at the Shipwrecked Treasure Museum. Take an adrenaline ride—and get a little wet—aboard Branson Jet Boats. The light and water show on Branson Landing is highly recommended.

Experience a celebrity chef's award-winning American cuisine right in the heart of Branson's waterfront at Guy Fieri's Branson Kitchen + Bar. After dinner, be entertained by Anthems of Rock at the King's Castle Theatre on Highway 76. "The Biggest Rock Party in Branson" showcases the number one hits from the most famous bands of the 20th century, including Queen, the Beatles, the Rolling Stones, Bon Jovi, Led Zeppelin, Journey, Aerosmith and more. This high-energy production will have you dancing and singing along with the greatest rock hits of all time.

Branson - St. Louis

Day 5: Depart early for St. Louis. Arrive for a late lunch and choose between Sugarfire Smoke House—a Southern-

style, local BBQ chain serving ribs, salmon, brisket cheesesteaks, spiked shakes & more—or Broadway Oyster Bar—a lively restaurant featuring Cajun and Creole dishes. In the afternoon, discover magnificent views from the top of St. Louis' Gateway Arch—an iconic monument symbolizing the westward expansion of the United States and the people who made it possible. See the city from 630 feet up in the air in this architectural wonder. If time permits, enjoy a river cruise aboard Gateway Arch Riverboats. Take a One-Hour Sightseeing Cruise or one of the many specialty cruises and relax to the sound of paddle wheels churning the waters of the mighty Mississippi River while taking in the best view of the city skyline. For dinner, head over to BB's Jazz, Blues and Soups before picking up a sweet treat at Ted Drewes Frozen Custard. Since 1929, Route 66 travelers have been delighted by this popular custard stand located on Chippewa Street. Get a "concrete" and turn it upside down. This thick milkshake, made from vanilla frozen custard and blended with traditional and inventive treats, will not spill out of the cup.

St. Louis

Day 6: After breakfast, visit the Cathedral Basilica of St. Louis, which houses one of the largest mosaic collections in the Western Hemisphere. The Cathedral is in the heart of the city, just east of Forest Park, and is one of the must-see attractions in St. Louis. Self-guided tours do not require reservations. Guided tours are available Monday-Saturday by appointment only. Don't miss the Missouri History Museum located in Forest Park. Founded in 1866, the museum features both permanent and traveling exhibits about Missouri's history. At the Saint Louis Science Center, you can explore over 700 exhibits, the OMNIMAX®

Theater, James S. McDonnell Planetarium, special traveling exhibitions and more. Visit the Missouri Botanical Garden, the nation's oldest botanical garden in continuous operation. Spanning 79-acres, the National Historic Landmark grows more than 27,000 plants. Enjoy a beer at Anheuser-Busch Brewery where you can also take a brewery tour and see the famous Budweiser Clydesdales. The National Blues Museum explores the blues and celebrates the genre as the foundation of all modern American music. Learn about famous musicians, iconic moments in popular culture and create your own masterpiece through interactive exhibits. Head over to Ballpark Village—the newest dining and entertainment district in St. Louis. The complex offers great food, drinks and an ideal ambiance for watching sports. After dinner, make your way to St. Louis Union Station for the Grand Hall Light Show and a ride on the St. Louis Wheel with 42 fully enclosed, climate-controlled gondolas that seat up to eight riders each.

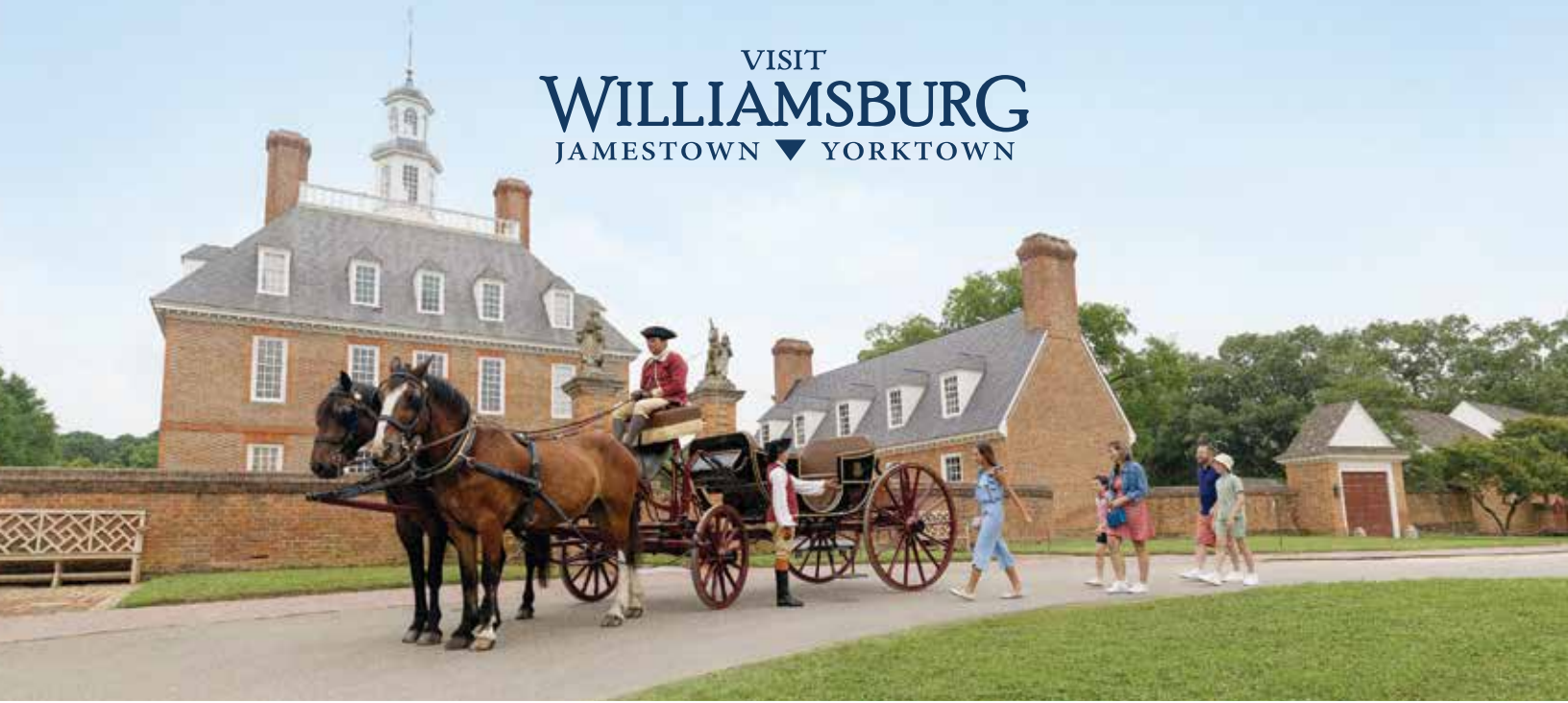

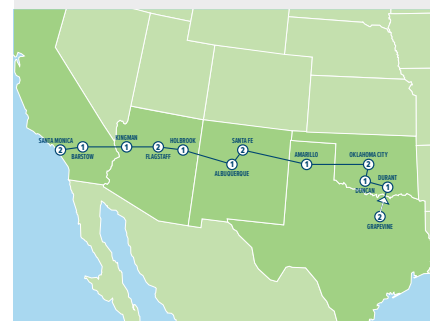

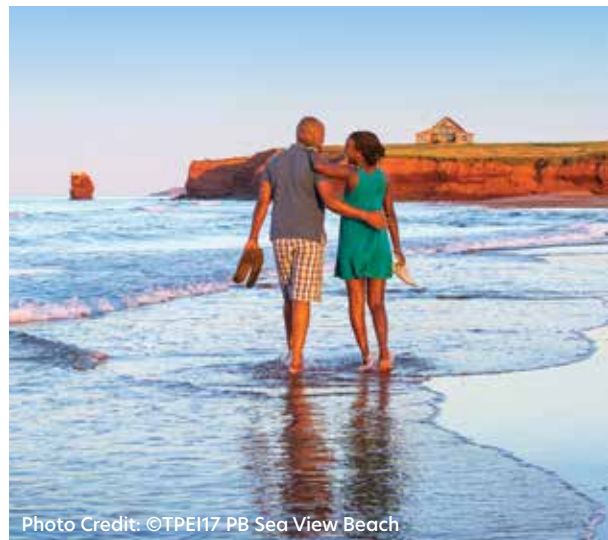

It's Like Nature Decided To Throw An Annual Reunion

With millions of seabirds, thousands of whales, and hundreds of icebergs, it might be the longest RSVP list you've ever seen.

Every spring and summer, without fail, they gather here at the most easterly point of North America. Maybe it's

the view. Or the fresh ocean air. More likely, it's because this is where two ocean currents collide.

The cool Labrador Current brings icebergs down to bathe in the warm Gulf Stream, where phytoplankton bloom and feed the fish. And the fish? Well, they bring the whales and seabirds. How's that for a guest list?

Welcome To The Seabird Capital Of North America

They flock here every year, all 35 million of them.

At the Witless Bay Ecological Reserve, you can see the largest (and cutest) Atlantic puffin colony in North America. Besides 500,000 puffins, you'll also find storm petrels, kittiwakes, common



murres, razorbills, and fulmars. For a closer look, try Cape St. Mary's Ecological Reserve, one of the most accessible seabird nesting sites on the continent and home to thousands more kittiwakes, gannets, and murres.

It's Called Iceberg Alley For A Reason

Every spring and summer, these 10,000-year-old frozen monoliths work their way down our northern and eastern coasts.

From snow-white to deep aquamarine, they come in an array of colours, patterns, and shapes. And they're not

just beautiful. If you listen closely, you can even hear them - faint popping as the ice melts, releasing prehistoric air that's been trapped for thousands of years.

They're truly something you have to see (and hear) to believe. Luckily, these days it's easier than ever to find them. With a real-time iceberg tracker and up-to-date photos, IcebergFinder.com is the best place to catch up with these ancient giants.

They're Plenty Excited To See You Too

Bursting from the blue, it's hard to tell if they're here for the clean, clear water or the fresh air. From April to October, our shores are home to the world's largest population of humpbacks. Not

to mention the orcas and blue whales that join them. With 22 species of whales and dolphins here, it's hard to take a picture of the ocean without getting photobombed by one of these majestic marine mammals.

In fact, so many humpbacks return every year, we're now on a first-name basis. DAY 1 : WELCOME TO SUN PEAKS!

DAY 2 : ALPINE HIKES, JEEP TOURS, AND SCHNITZEL!

Guided Alpine Hiking Tour. Ride the Sunburst Express chairlift to mid-mountain and embark on a four-hour guided hike into the alpine with a knowledgeable local guide.

Jeep Tour. Prepare to be immersed in the untamed beauty of the Sun Peaks backcountry as your tour navigates narrow trails, visits pristine lakes, and traverses vast expanses of breathtaking scenery.

Schnitzel anyone? Finish off your second day at Powder Hounds Restaurant. Among the plethora of dining options in the village, the authentic Hunter Schnitzel is not to be missed!

DAY 3 : WELLS GREY: CANADA'S WATERFALL PARK

Wells Gray Provincial Park is the perfect day trip to embark on from Sun Peaks! A scenic 1.5-hour drive will take you to the Park, where 41 waterfalls and impressive views await. There's no way to see all 41 in one day, so here are three must-sees:

Helmcken Falls: Tumbling into the canyon below from 141 metres high, it's the fourth highest waterfall in Canada!

Spahats Creek Falls: rushes through a keyhole in the rock face 80 meters down into the Clearwater River.

Dawson Falls: A terraced waterfall that rushes over 200, 000-year-old lava beds.

Once back in Sun Peaks, stroll through the pedestrian-only village and explore one (or all) of the 40+ boutique shops, restaurants and cafes!

DAY 4 : PEAKS TO LAKES

The Embleton Mountain trailhead 8.4km loop will take you to where you'll feel the reward of a challenging hike with scenic views of Heffley Lake.

En route, visit Honey Berry Farm Market, where you'll find farm-fresh eggs, honey, and other local seasonal produce available in the Market Stand. The friendly atmosphere makes it a charming place to stretch your legs and discover something deliciously local.

Head back to Sun Peaks and onwards to McGillivray Lake, just 6km east of the village and accessible by vehicle on a marked forest service road. Rent a canoe, kayak, or stand-up paddleboard to get out on the water.

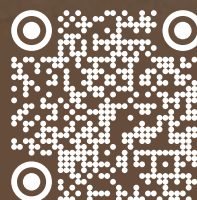
